Pastor's Letter

March 30/31

The Garden of the Resurrection

Dear Parish Family,

Here at Sacred Hearts, our religious education director, Deborah O'Shaughnessy, has brought us a unique hands-on approach to the faith education of our children and families. Each season has a project to help us celebrate our faith. Together, children and families construct Advent Wreaths to mark the season of Advent, paint emblems of the Sacred Hearts to celebrate our patron, build bird feeders to celebrate St. Francis's love of creation, and so on. But how can we mark the day of Easter? What do we have to symbolize this great feast beyond Easter eggs, lilies, and chocolate bunnies?

With much creativity, Deborah helped our children build Resurrection Gardens. It is a simple scene of a garden with a burial tomb and a large round stone. Today, as our children roll back this stone, they will see that the tomb is empty, except for the rolled-up burial cloths that marked where Jesus was buried. He is not here; he is risen.



The place of the crucifixion is often pictured as a stark desert landscape, and the tomb is said to be nearby. But the Gospels are clear that the place of resurrection was a garden. To early believers, any garden reminded them of the garden of creation, where human life began on this earth. The garden of creation was a place of peace and oneness between God and all God's children. We have strayed from this garden and our relationship with God, but God always calls us home, no matter how far we have strayed. And so, Easter is rightfully a garden, a place where no matter how harsh life has been to us, no matter how persistent our human frailty, we are always welcomed home.

I am so glad to welcome you to the celebration of Easter this year. No matter what joys or sorrows this last year has brought, I welcome you to the Garden of the Resurrection. Here at Sacred Hearts, our ministries make the resurrection come alive. It is here in this place that faith is taught, the gospel is preached, forgiveness is celebrated, the hungry are fed, the stranger is welcomed, children are baptized, and those who have died are carried gently home to God.

Thank you for being here today at the Garden of the Resurrection.

2024 is the 100th Anniversary of our Historic School Building

The school building at Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary was built in 1924 to pass on our Catholic faith to the young people of Southampton. In 1982 the parishes of Sacred Hearts, Our Lady of Poland, and Saint Rosalie came together to establish our parish regional school, Our Lady of the Hamptons, on the grounds of Our Lady of Poland. Our 1924 school building continues its role as a center of parish life. To this day, the building is the center of Religious Education for our English and Spanish-speaking communities. It is where we gather for parish events and it is the home base of the Apostolado Hispano which serves the entire east end of Long Island.

Now we Need to Create a Center For Community Transforming our auditorium into a Parish Hall

At the center of the school building is a remarkable auditorium. With a wooden ceiling over twenty-five feet high the auditorium is the largest meeting space on the parish grounds, other than our basilica. Over the last five years, the parish has become much more active in events and services for our parish and community. In the last three years our parish has grown by over 20% in every program and at Mass.



Our 2024 -2025 Project

The latest major project is to begin the renovation of the auditorium in our old school building. The auditorium is the only large meeting space in our parish, other than our church. It would be a wonderful place for large meetings, concerts, social events, dinners, and spiritual events, such as our Lenten Soup Supper. But after almost 100 years of use it is showing some serious issues.

- * A new floor to replace the present crumbling floor.
- * Modern sound proofing to make the space friendlier.
- * New lights and sound system
- * Restore the wood ceiling to its original beauty
- * Install new doors to make the entry attractive
- * Restore the stage so it can be used
- * Create modern ADA restrooms
- * Overall painting and restoration
- * Create storage and new tables and seating

We anticipate receiving some grant assistance for this project but will still need to raise \$200,000 to bring this to reality. Can you help us continue the growth of our Parish Community?

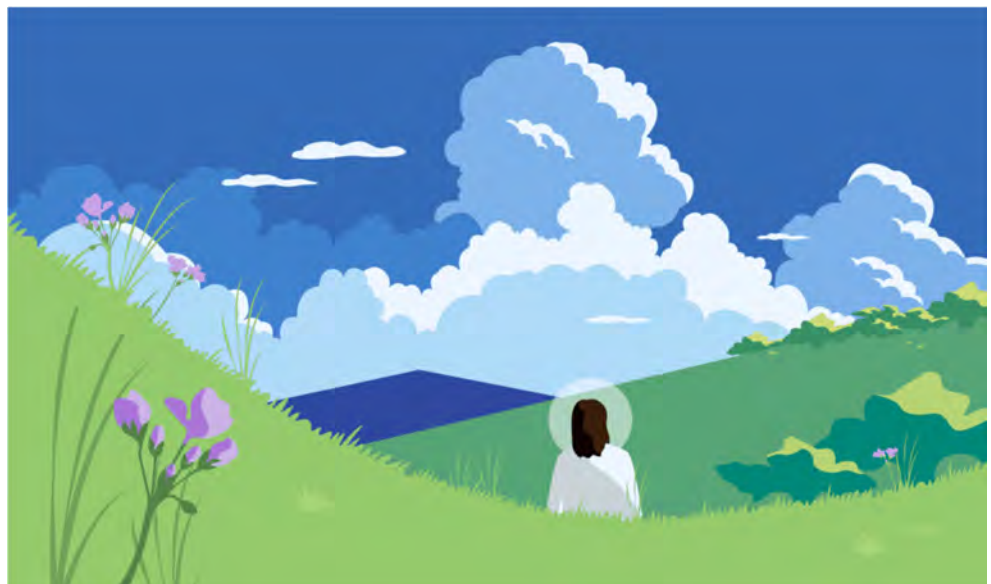


In *The Joy of the Gospel*, Pope Francis states: “Christ’s resurrection is not an event of the past; it contains a vital power which has permeated the world. Where all seems to be dead, signs of the resurrection suddenly spring up. It is an irresistible force...Each day in our world beauty is born anew, it rises transformed through the storms of history...Such is the power of the resurrection, and all who evangelize are instruments of that power.” (276)

We continue to live through “the storms of history” and we rely on the Risen Lord and his glorified wounds to touch the wounds in Ukraine, the Middle East, Nicaragua, Venezuela, Armenia and Azerbaijan, the region of the Sahel, the Horn of Africa and Sudan, as well as Cameroon, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, South Sudan and so many other troubled areas of the world.¹ We ask the Risen Lord and his glorified wounds to touch the wounds experienced in our own country.

In *The Everlasting Man*, G.K. Chesterton captured the power of our Lord’s Resurrection experienced in the cycles of history. He wrote: “Christendom has had a series of revolutions and in each one of them Christianity has died. Christianity has died many times and risen again; for it had a God who knew the way out of the grave.”

This Easter and every Easter we celebrate this Everlasting Man who knew his way out of the grave and who invites us and the Catholic Church on Long Island to a great Resurrection.

Gracias por su fidelidad a la Eucaristía y a la Misa Dominical y por su espíritu Católico de evangelización. Gracias por ser instrumentos del Renacimiento Eucarístico.

En *La alegría del Evangelio*, el Papa Francisco afirma: "Su resurrección no es algo del pasado; entraña una fuerza de vida que ha penetrado el mundo. Donde parece que todo ha muerto, por todas partes vuelven a aparecer los brotes de la resurrección. Es una fuerza imparable.... Cada día en el mundo renace la belleza, que resucita transformada a través de las tormentas de la historia... Ésa es la fuerza de la resurrección y cada evangelizador es un instrumento de ese dinamismo."(276)

Seguimos viviendo "las tormentas de la historia" y confiamos en el Señor Resucitado y en sus heridas glorificadas para que toquen las heridas de Ucrania, Oriente Medio, Nicaragua, Venezuela, Armenia y Azerbaiyán, la región del Sahel, el Cuerno de África y Sudán, así como Camerún, la República Democrática del Congo, Sudán del Sur y tantas otras zonas conflictivas del mundo¹.
