FROM THE DESK OF FATHER JEFF:

In Ash Wednesday's collection basket was a question: "Why does Jesus call himself the Son of Man when he is the Son of God?"

The term Son of Man is a designation for Jesus in Hebrew and Aramaic, the phrase "Son of Man" is an idiom for "man or someone" In Jewish apocalyptic writing (an ancient style of writing, no longer in existence). The title "son of Man" had firmly established itself as the title for the transcendental agent of redemption, i.e. The Christ. All Israelites considered themselves as sons

of God. Only one could be the Son of Man, The Messiah. (sources: The Encyclopedia of Catholicism - McBrien, The Dictionary of the Bible - McKenzie, The Foundations of N.T. Christology - Fuller)

We have to remember that the Gospel of Matthew was written for Jews, who would immediately identify the "Son of Man" as the Messiah.

FAST AND ABSTINENCE

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth year are bound to abstain entirely from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. All Catholics between the ages of eighteen and fifty-nine inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day

OUR LADY OF THE HAMPTONS

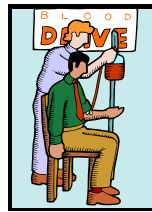

Prayers and history of the Church

February 28, 2010

Today we read the account of Jesus' transfiguration. Knowing that he will soon undergo great suffering, Jesus reveals his glory to three of his disciples.

Gospel

Luke 9:28b-31, 33-36

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray. And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to him. They appeared in glory and were speaking of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. Just as they were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, "Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah" - not knowing what he said. While he was saying this, a cloud came and overshadowed them; and they were terrified as they entered the cloud. Then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!" When the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. And they kept silent and in those days told no one any of the things they had seen.

"Therefore I tell you, the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people that produces the fruits of the kingdom."

When the chief priests and the Pharisees heard his parables, they realized that he was speaking about them. They wanted to arrest him, but they feared the crowds, because they regarded him as a prophet. The Gospel of the Lord.
