FAST AND ABSTINENCE

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth year are bound to abstain entirely from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. All Catholics between the ages of eighteen and fifty-nine inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day

TEEN MUSIC MINISTRY

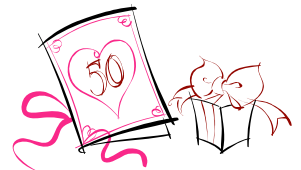


Currently joins in the Sunday 5 PM Mass every second and fourth weekend of the month. All are welcome to attend this liturgy and join in the celebration.

"Pro Multis"

At the most solemn part of the Mass, when the priest holds the cup of wine during the Eucharistic prayer and repeats the words of Jesus at the Last Supper, he tells about the significance of the blood of Christ. This blood was poured out for the forgiveness of sins. It is humbling to hear that in spite of our sins – indeed, because of our sins – Christ did not punish us but poured out his own blood so that we could experience forgiveness from him and union with him. The Bible often says this; see, for example, Galatians 1:3-4.

For many years, Catholics have heard the priest say, "it will be shed for you and for all so that sins may be forgiven." But a more literal translation of the original Latin text is this: "[It] will be poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins." The Latin words that have been rendered "for all" are "pro multis," and they literally mean "for many."

Jesus himself used the word "many" according to Matthew 26:28 and Mark 14:24. In the context of the Last Supper, he was not trying to restrict the number of people for whom he would pour out his blood but expand it. He told the disciples he was dying not only "for you" but also "for many." This was surely an eye-opener for them.

Jesus was surely alluding to a prophecy in Isaiah 53:12, which says that God's suffering servant will "take away the sins of many, and win pardon for their offenses." Jesus fulfilled that prophecy. By using the words "pro multis," the Eucharistic prayer refers to all these Scripture texts, which affirm the mission of Jesus, who came to die so that others might be forgiven.

This Sunday we will hear a familiar parable.

Gospel Luke 15:11-12,13b-14,17-18a, 19,20b-22a, 23b-24

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

Jesus said: "There was a man who had two sons. The younger of them said to his father, 'Father give me the share of the property that will belong to me.' So he divided his property between them. The younger son gathered all he had and traveled to a distant country, and there he squandered his property in dissolute living. When he had spent everything, a severe famine took place throughout that country, and he began to be in need. But when he came to himself he said, "How many of my father's hired hands have bread enough to spare, but here I am dying of hunger! I will get up and go to my father.' While he was still far off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion; he ran and put his arms around him and kissed him. Then the son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be called you son.' But the father said to his slaves, 'let us eat and celebrate; for this son of mine was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found!' And they began to celebrate."
