WE CELEBRATE BAPTISM:

Baptisms are customarily performed on Sunday at 2:30 P.M. Prior arrangements with the parish priest or deacon must be made as far in advance as possible. The Godfather and Godmother should be practicing Catholics. Our Baptismal Program meets at 7:30 P.M. on the second Monday of each month in the Parish Center.

WE CELEBRATE PENANCE:

Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4:00 - 4:45 PM. A more convenient time may be arranged with the parish priest by calling the Parish Center.

WE CELEBRATE MARRIAGE:

In order to prepare adequately for the life-long commitment to the Sacrament and to arrange to participate in a Marriage Preparation Program, we ask that you make arrangements with the priest or deacon of your choice at least six months prior to the date of the marriage. Because of the Sunday Mass schedule, Nuptial Masses are normally celebrated on Friday evening or Saturday. Weddings should take place in the proper parish of the bride or groom.

WE CELEBRATE HOLY ORDERS & RELIGIOUS LIFE:

The privilege of serving God's people as a priest, permanent deacon, religious sister or brother is personally fulfilling and spiritually exciting. Anyone who feels they might be interested in the priesthood, diaconate or religious life should speak to a parish priest.

Our Lady of Perpetual Help

Among the devotional items in Catholic Churches, it is common to find an image of Our Lady of Perpetual Help. Two angels hover over Mary and the Child Jesus, who rests comfortably in the arms of his mother, a broken sandal dangling from his right foot.

The original icon was probably painted in Greece in the 13th or 14th century and subsequently brought to Rome. It was first venerated in St. Matthew Church, a building that did not survive the invasion of Napoleon's forces. The painting was rescued and later housed in St. Alphonsus Church under the care of the Redemptorist Fathers, where it is much viewed today.

Artists have created an endless variety of poses for the Madonna and Child. The distinctive attributes of any such image can give it a particular name. The title of this painting implies that Mary, who gave a mother's care to her Son, always gives a mother's care to all believers.

The archangels in the painting are identified as Michael and Gabriel, and they hold instruments of the passion of Christ, a somber foreshadowing of the future of the little child, Jesus' broken sandal suggests that he went to his mother in times of adversity and that she offered help for every need. From a broken sandal to the cross, from birth to death, Mary is a perpetual source of help for Christians.

In the 19th century, Pope Pius IX encouraged the Redemptorist Fathers to spread the devotion of Our Lady of Perpetual Help. They preached about her, distributed pictures of the icon, and formed a society in Mary's honor. Due to their work, an image of Our Lady of Perpetual Help is often on view in a Catholic church.

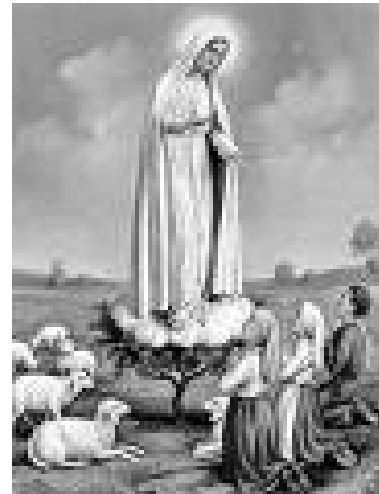

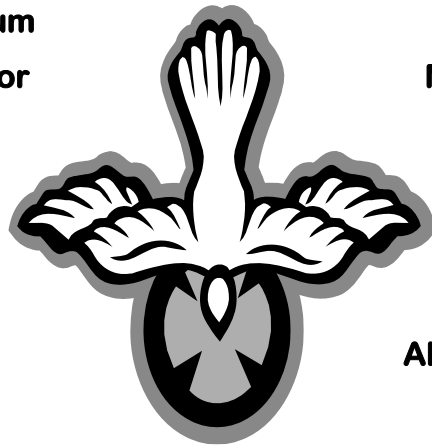
