WE CELEBRATE BAPTISM:

Baptisms are customarily performed on Sunday at 2:30 P.M. Prior arrangements with the parish priest or deacon must be made as far in advance as possible. The Godfather and Godmother should be practicing Catholics. Our Baptismal Program meets at 7:30 P.M. on the second Monday of each month in the Parish Center.

WE CELEBRATE PENANCE:

Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4:00 - 4:45 PM. A more convenient time may be arranged with the parish priest by calling the Parish Center.

WE CELEBRATE MARRIAGE:

In order to prepare adequately for the life-long commitment to the Sacrament and to arrange to participate in a Marriage Preparation Program, we ask that you make arrangements with the priest or deacon of your choice at least six months prior to the date of the marriage. Because of the Sunday Mass schedule, Nuptial Masses are normally celebrated on Friday evening or Saturday. Weddings should take place in the proper parish of the bride or groom.

WE CELEBRATE HOLY ORDERS & RELIGIOUS LIFE:

The privilege of serving God's people as a priest, permanent deacon, religious sister or brother is personally fulfilling and spiritually exciting. Anyone who feels they might be interested in the priesthood, diaconate or religious life should speak to a parish priest.

TRINITY SUNDAY

At every Sunday liturgy we begin with the sign of the cross: **In the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Often the gesture we make with those words becomes rote, even meaningless because we do it so automatically. Yet, this gesture is one of the most basic and profound signs of our faith. The gesture of crossing ourselves not only praises the Trinity but makes a powerful statement about who we are. How carefully do we make the sign? How aware are we of the implications of signing ourselves? This gesture could be so much more powerful if it were done with attention and reverence. On Trinity Sunday, we can make a special effort at signing ourselves with attention and devotion. Instead of trying to explain the Trinity, we might take more care at expressing our belief by the way we make the sign of the cross.**

Solemnity of the Holy Trinity

May 30, 2010

Prv 8:22-31; Ps 8:4-5,6-7,8-9; Rom 5:1-5; Jn 16:12-15

The trinity is the most fundamental mystery of the Christian faith: God is a triune God, distinct from one another yet completely united in will and essence. This reality is beyond human comprehension. We can only grasp a bit of mystery when we declare our belief in the Father, The Son and the Holy Spirit. Yet naming this mystery only deepens our wonderment; each new level of understanding yields more mystery.

While the Father, Son and Holy Spirit are each God, each of the three persons has a separate purpose in relation to the salvation of the world. Through the Holy Spirit, the Father's love and wisdom has been poured into our hearts and guides us to truth. There is no end to God's revelation that has been given to us through the Son, Jesus. With the psalmist we proclaim: "o Lord, how wonderful your name in all the earth!"

Reflection: In what ways do I encounter each person of the Trinity? Am I able to recognize God's love in my relationships with others?

The Mystery of the Most Holy Trinity

"The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of the Christian faith and of Christian life. God alone can make it known to us by revealing Himself as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

"The Incarnation of God's Son reveals that God is the eternal Father and that the Son is consubstantial with the Father, which means that, in the Father and with the Father, the Son is one and the same God.

"The mission of the Holy Spirit, sent by the Father in the name of the Son (John 14:26) and by the Son: from the Father (John 15:26), reveals that, with them, the Spirit is one and the same God. "With the Father and the Son He is worshipped and glorified" (Nicene Creed).

"Inseparable in what they are, the Divine Persons are also inseparable in what they do. But within the single divine operation each shows forth what is proper to Him in the Trinity, especially in the divine missions of the Son's Incarnation and the gift of the Holy Spirit."

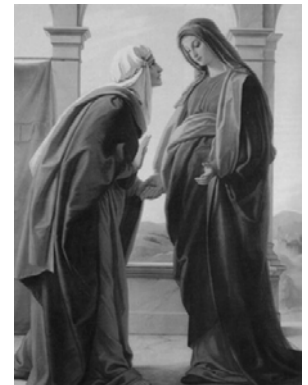
