WE CELEBRATE BAPTISM:

Baptisms are customarily performed on Sunday at 2:30 P.M. Prior arrangements with the parish priest or deacon must be made as far in advance as possible. The Godfather and Godmother should be practicing Catholics. Our Baptismal Program meets at 7:30 P.M. on the second Monday of each month in the Parish Center.

WE CELEBRATE PENANCE:

Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4:00 - 4:45 PM. A more convenient time may be arranged with the parish priest by calling the Parish Center.

WE CELEBRATE MARRIAGE:

In order to prepare adequately for the life-long commitment to the Sacrament and to arrange to participate in a Marriage Preparation Program, we ask that you make arrangements with the priest or deacon of your choice at least six months prior to the date of the marriage. Because of the Sunday Mass schedule, Nuptial Masses are normally celebrated on Friday evening or Saturday. Weddings should take place in the proper parish of the bride or groom.

CORPUS CHRISTI

This feast, now called the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, developed during the Middle Ages (in the year 1264) at the request of St. Thomas Aquinas who wrote the hymns and prayers for the feast. Its purpose was to emphasize the presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. A procession with the Blessed Sacrament in a monstrance was a public display of faith. Processions, incense, flowers, canopy, monstrance! For 800 years people looked at and adored our Lord in the Eucharist, singing about the awesome presence of Christ among us, remembering Holy Thursday, spiritually communing but rarely daring to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord in Holy Communion. Today we understand once more that the Eucharist is for eating and drinking. The feast of the Body and Blood of Christ calls us to ponder the love of our Savior who came to be with us and to serve us in a most ordinary way, and to ask how we might follow more closely in his footsteps.

Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

June 6, 2010

Gn 14:18-20, Ps 110:1,2,3,4; 1 Cor 11:23-26; Lk 9:11b-17

Our human hunger and thirst underlie our spiritual hunger and thirst to be in communion with God. When we take the bread in our hands and the cup to our lips, it is not a memory but a living contact with Jesus Christ in faith and love. "Do this in remembrance of me," he commands us. We "do this" not only when we break the bread and pour the wine but when we share our love with others. When we "do this," we have the assurance of our participation in God's reign.

When we refuse to share what we have received with the hungry and thirsty, the body is divided, and communion is not possible. "Why don't you feed them?" Jesus asks. We claim to have nothing, when in reality our hands are full. What we receive from the Lord we must hand on to others; then our offerings will be blessed and multiplied. At the table of the Lord, there is more than enough for all.

Reflection: Do I recognize the Body and Blood of Christ in the sacrament? Do I also recognize his Body and Blood in my neighbor?

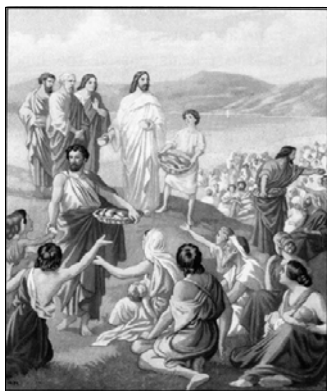
Gospel

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke

The day was drawing to a close, and the twelve came to him and said, "Send the crowd away, so that they may go into the surrounding villages and countryside to lodge and get provisions; for we are here in a deserted place." But he said to them, "You give them something to eat." They said, "We have no more than five loaves and two fish—unless we are to go and buy food for all these people." For there were about five thousand men. And he said to his disciples, "Make them sit down in groups of about fifty each." They did so and made them all sit down. And taking the five loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven, and blessed and broke them, and gave them to the crowd. And all ate and were filled. What was left over was gathered up, twelve baskets of broken pieces.

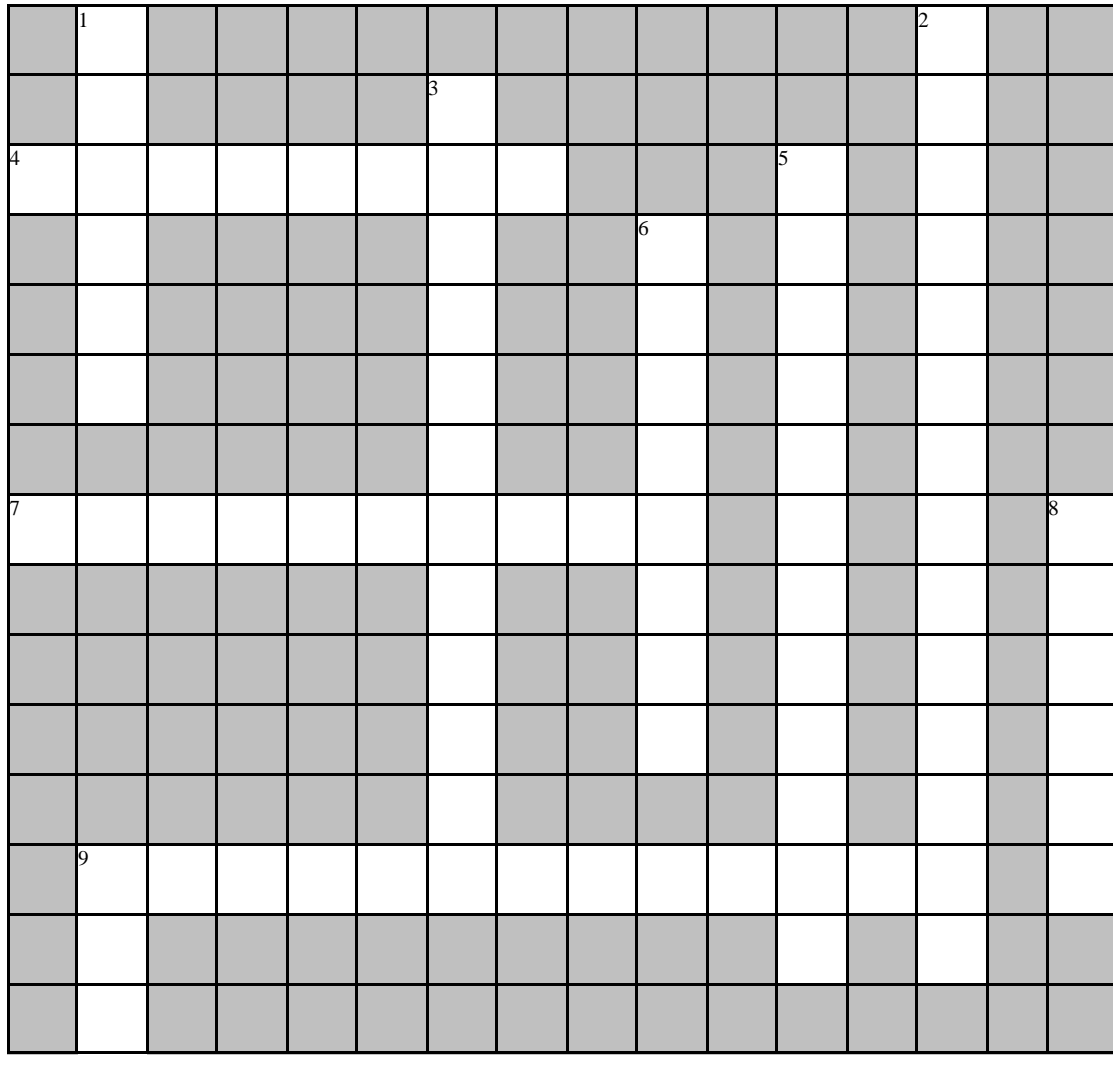
