2010-2011 Registration

Parents of children who will be entering first grade in September: If your child is entering the first grade and you want him/her to receive the sacraments in the parish, it is time to register them for the Religious Education Program if they are not attending Our Lady of the Hamptons or some other Catholic School.

Those who have not registered, may also stop in on those days or at any other time Monday to Thursday and drop off the forms. It is important that you register each year.

Please remember that children are required to attend each year from first to eighth grades, in order to be prepared for the receiving of Confirmation in the eighth grade. Also attendance each week is a must unless the child is sick or has a good reason for missing a class. Please encourage the school and coaches not to schedule games or practices on Wednesday afternoon or evening or Sunday mornings. It is up to all of us to encourage the importance of Religious Education in our community.

Zech 12:10-11; 13:1; Ps 63:2-6, 8-9; Gal 3:26-29; Lk 9:18-24

When we lament in our search for God's mercy, the spirit of compassion is poured forth. Though we have sinned, divine blessings flow from the fountain of grace to cleanse us from sin.

Drenched in new life, we are clothed with Christ's identity. At the table of the Lord, we are brothers and sisters, one people, one family. There can be no division among us: no racism, no classism, and no sexism. All are one in Christ.

Understanding who we are in Christ takes time. Just as gradually, we come to an awareness of who Christ is to us. We may discuss, argue, and ask many questions, but in the end it is the grace of God that illuminates our understanding. When we hear Christ ask, "And you, who do you say that I am?" we can't depend on someone else to answer. Each of us must declare for ourselves: "You are the Christ, God's anointed servant. You are the Lord!"

Reflection: Who is Jesus Christ to you? Who do you think you are to him?

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke

Once when Jesus was praying alone, with only the disciples near him, he asked them, "Who do the crowds say that I am?" They answered, "John the Baptist; but others, Elijah (ee-LI-juh); and still others, that one of the ancient prophets has arisen." He said to them, "But who do you say I am?" Peter answered, "The Messiah of God."

He sternly ordered and commanded them not to tell anyone, saying, "The Son of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, chief priests, and scribes, and be killed, and on the third day be raised."

Then he said to them all, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me. For those who want to save their life for my sake will save it."
