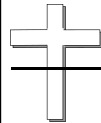

2010-2011 Registration

Parents of children who will be entering first grade in September: If your child is entering the first grade and you want him/her to receive the sacraments in the parish, it is time to register them for the Religious Education Program if they are not attending Our Lady of the Hamptons or some other Catholic School.

Those who have not registered, may also stop in on those days or at any other time Monday to Thursday and drop off the forms. It is important that you register each year.

Please remember that children are required to attend each year from first to eighth grades, in order to be prepared for the receiving of Confirmation in the eighth grade. Also attendance each week is a must unless the child is sick or has a good reason for missing a class. Please encourage the school and coaches not to schedule games or practices on Wednesday afternoon or evening or Sunday mornings. It is up to all of us to encourage the importance of Religious Education in our community.

The Spiritual Book Group meets every Tuesday from 1-2 PM in the dining room of the Parish Center. New members are always welcome!!

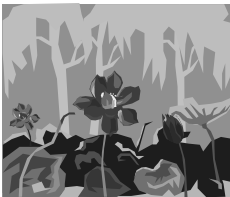
GIANNA CENTER FOR WOMEN

1 Kgs 19:16b, 19-21; Ps 16:1-2, 5, 7-11; Gal 5:1, 13-18; Lk 9:51-62

When we say to Christ, "I will follow you wherever you go," are we willing to go with him when the way is difficult or the destination unknown? Are we able to follow him to the cross? Does everything take second place to being his disciple? Jesus tells us that once we "put our hands to the plow, we must move forward and not look back.

Jesus' disciples failed to understand this. They avoided the way of love by wanting to "call down fire from heaven" on those who traveled a different path. Discipleship doesn't mean forcing everyone to be like us. It means identifying with the poor and suffering, even if they don't look like us or act like us. It means resisting the tendency to be selfish and pouring out our lives for the sake of others. When we follow Jesus' way of love, we become servants to one another. Then, when we invite others to follow a similar path, they will be willing to do so.

Reflection: Do I follow Christ only when the way is easy? What price have I paid for living my Christian life?

I am pleased to inform you and your parishioners that the Life Center of Long Island project for which we solicited prayers and financial support through our Baby Bottle campaign has come to fruition.

A Life Center Recreational Vehicle will be open in Riverhead in the parking lot of St. Isidore's church at 622 Pulaski St., Riverhead, NY on Fridays between 10 AM and 3 PM. There will be counselors on site to offer alternatives to abortions in crisis pregnancies.

Our services to pregnant women include the following:

- Sonograms by a licensed physician
- Crisis intervention counseling
- Post abortion counseling
- Pregnancy test kits
- Emergency shelter
- information and guidance on employment, housing and continuing education
- baby items such as cribs, car seats, clothing, diapers
- Rachel's Vineyard Retreats (post-abortion healing program)
- abstinence education

We anticipate this project to be successful in upholding the dignity of life. We also anticipate increasing the number of days and in the near future finding a permanent home in the Riverhead area.

Today we remember Saints Peter and Paul. They shaped the church in its early years.

Peter was given his name by Jesus. His name means "rock" or "stone". This had great meaning to the people of Judea, who could look around and see solid rock formations on one side, and on the other, shifting sand dunes blown by every wind. In Peter Jesus gave the church a solid leader.

Paul first tried to stop the spread of the gospel by putting Christians into prison. Then in a vision, he learned that Jesus is the Messiah, and those who harm his followers harm Jesus. Some of Paul's letters are in the Bible.

Reading

Listen to the words of the holy gospel according to John.

When Jesus and his disciples had finished eating, he asked, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than the others do?" Simon Peter answered, "Yes, Lord, you know I do!" "Then feed my lambs," Jesus said.

Jesus asked a second time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Peter answered, "Yes, Lord, you know I love you!" "Then take care of my sheep," Jesus told him.

Jesus asked a third time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Peter was hurt because Jesus had asked him three times if he loved him. So he told Jesus, "Lord, you know everything. You know I love you." Jesus replied, "Feed my sheep."

Then he said to Peter, "Follow me."

The gospel of the Lord.

Reflection:

Who are Jesus' sheep and lambs? Catholics believe that the pope follows in the footsteps of Peter. How does the pope feed God's people? What do you know about the pope?
