WE CELEBRATE BAPTISM:

Baptisms are customarily performed on Sunday at 2:30 P.M. Prior arrangements with the parish priest or deacon must be made as far in advance as possible. The Godfather and Godmother should be practicing Catholics. Our Baptismal Program meets at 7:30 P.M. on the second Monday of each month in the Parish Center.

WE CELEBRATE PENANCE:

Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4:00 - 4:45 PM. A more convenient time may be arranged with the parish priest by calling the Parish Center.

WE CELEBRATE MARRIAGE:

In order to prepare adequately for the life-long commitment to the Sacrament and to arrange to participate in a Marriage Preparation Program, we ask that you make arrangements with the priest or deacon of your choice at least six months prior to the date of the marriage. Because of the Sunday Mass schedule, Nuptial Masses are normally celebrated on Friday evening or Saturday. Weddings should take place in the proper parish of the bride or groom.

WE CELEBRATE HOLY ORDERS & RELIGIOUS LIFE:

The privilege of serving God's people as a priest, permanent deacon, religious sister or brother is personally fulfilling and spiritually exciting. Anyone who feels they might be interested in the priesthood, diaconate or religious life should speak to a parish priest.

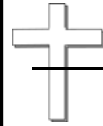

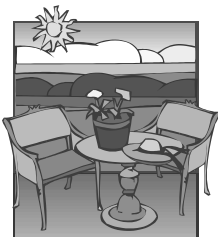

2010-2011 Registration

July 18, 2010

Today we remember Bartolome de Las Casas, a Spanish priest who came to Cuba with the conquistadores (*kon-KEES-tuh-doors*) to teach the native peoples about Christ. He soon saw that the conquistadores' hearts were set on gold rather than the gospel. They were murdering and enslaving native peoples. De Las Casas tried to end the abuses, but he was laughed at.



To get rid of him, officials sent de Las Casas to the southern tip of Mexico, as bishop of Chiapas until he died in 1566. even today the natives of Chiapas are struggling for just treatment.

Reading

Jeremiah 23:3-5

Listen to the words of the prophet Jeremiah

I, the Lord, will bring the rest of my people
back from the lands where I have
scattered them.
I will bring them home,
And they will grow into a mighty nation.
I will choose leaders who will take care of them.
Every one of my people will be there,
And they will never again be frightened
Or terrified.

July 22, 2010

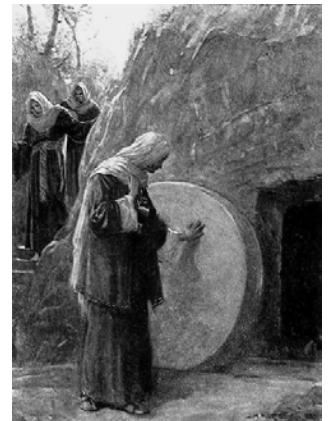
Today we remember Mary Magdalene, who was very dear to Jesus. She went along on Jesus' preaching journeys. She followed him to Calvary, and she stayed with him until he died. She was also one of the women who went to the tomb to anoint his body. As we hear in today's reading, Mary was the first to see the Lord. Because Mary Magdalene brought the Good News of Christ's resurrection to the Twelve, she is called "apostle to the apostles".

John 20:11-16

Listen to the words of the holy Gospel according to John

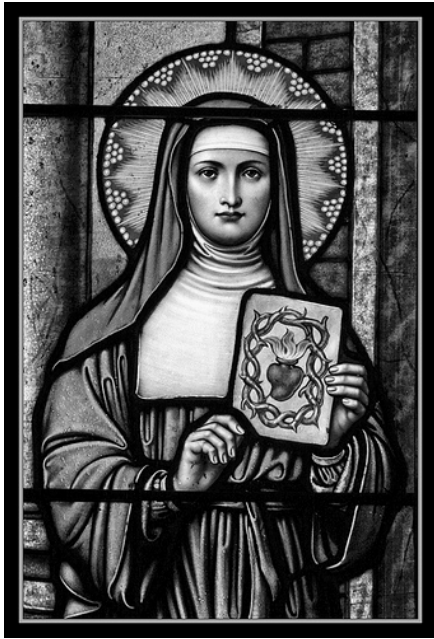
Mary Magdalene stood crying outside the tomb. She was still weeping, when she stooped down and saw two angels inside. They were dressed in white and were sitting where Jesus' body had been. One was at the head and the other was at the foot. The angels asked Mary, "Why are you crying?" She answered, "They have taken away my Lord's body! I don't know where they have put him." As soon as Mary said this she turned around and saw Jesus standing there. But she did not know who he was. Jesus asked her, "Why are you crying? Who are you looking for?"



She thought he was the gardener and said, "Sir, if you have taken his body away, please tell me, so I can go and get him." Then Jesus said to her, " Mary!" she turned and said to him, "Teacher."

Centuries ago people did not have last names, so they were often named for their home town. Mary came from the town of Magdala, so she was called Mary the Magdalene.

Diocese of Rockville Centre Devotion to the Sacred Heart



A first class relic of St. Margaret Mary of Alacoque will be venerated from August 16 to August 23 in our Diocese. The schedule at this time is:

- August 16 - St. Agnes in Rockville Centre**
- August 17 - Sacred Heart Parish in Island Park**
- August 18 - St. Aidan Parish in Williston Park**
- August 19 - St. Ignatius Retreat House in Manhasset**

- August 22 - Shrine of Our Lady of the Island in Manorville**
- August 23 - St. Rosalie in Hampton Bays**

The time frame for each parish and Retreat Center is from 1 PM to 8 PM. St. Ignatius Retreat House will close their day with a Healing Mass. The Parishes will fit the exposition into their Mass Schedule for the day. The Knights of Columbus will set up an Honor Guard at each site.

The Bishop has asked the prayer groups to spend time in prayer, penance and petition to the Sacred Heart for an outpouring of Love, Healing and Grace in the hearts of everyone in the Diocese for the weeks prior to the arrival of the relic.

He is also encouraging the prayer groups to spend eight months in prayer after the arrival of the relic, focusing on Pope John Paul II's Model for Evangelization of fallen-away Catholics.

The themes for the months of prayer are:

September—A call to Holiness

October—A Call to Prayer

November—Devotion to the Eucharist

December—Devotion to the Sacrament of Reconciliation

January—Openness to the Movement of the Holy Spirit in Their Lives

February—Meditation/Contemplation—Listening in Prayer

March—Openness to the Use of Technology in Spreading the Good News

April—The Role of the Laity in Evangelization

May—Thanksgiving for the Healing Received for Devotion to the Sacred Heart

INDULGENCES

An indulgence is the remission of punishment for a forgiven sin. If your child breaks a window at home and tells you, "I'm sorry," you may forgive the young offender, but you may still issue a punishment. In the Catholic Church the sacrament of reconciliation brings forgiveness of sins, which may still carry punishments. Indulgences relax the punishments.

Indulgences first appeared in the 11th century as a way of reducing the penance one was required to perform after confessing a sin. Several hundred years later they were understood to relax punishments after death — partially or totally. During the Reformation, the abuse of indulgences received sound criticism: People were selling them outright, claiming that you could buy your way into heaven.

In the past, some indulgences came with a certain number of days or years attached. The church explained that if you gained the indulgence it would speed your progress from purgatory to heaven by that amount of time. Today we no

longer apply this metaphor of time.

Although the sale of indulgences has ceased, the practice of performing certain actions to obtain indulgences continues. The church believes that the good accomplished by Christ and the saints may be shared by the faithful who perform actions of prayer, charity, and self-sacrifice. Believers may even ask God to extend mercy to the faithful departed by remembering these benefits. An appreciation of indulgences is based on the belief that sinful behaviors carry consequences even after death and that God will respond favorably to prayers for mercy.

An indulgence is obtained by performing a devotional action, celebrating the sacrament of reconciliation, sharing the Eucharist, and praying for the intentions of the pope. It celebrates the mercy of God.
