WE CELEBRATE BAPTISM:

Baptisms are customarily performed on Sunday at 2:30 P.M. Prior arrangements with the parish priest or deacon must be made as far in advance as possible. The Godfather and Godmother should be practicing Catholics. Our Baptismal Program meets at 7:30 P.M. on the second Monday of each month in the Parish Center.

WE CELEBRATE PENANCE:

Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4:00 - 4:45 PM. A more convenient time may be arranged with the parish priest by calling the Parish Center.

WE CELEBRATE MARRIAGE:

In order to prepare adequately for the life-long commitment to the Sacrament and to arrange to participate in a Marriage Preparation Program, we ask that you make arrangements with the priest or deacon of your choice at least six months prior to the date of the marriage. Because of the Sunday Mass schedule, Nuptial Masses are normally celebrated on Friday evening or Saturday. Weddings should take place in the proper parish of the bride or groom.

WE CELEBRATE HOLY ORDERS & RELIGIOUS LIFE:

The privilege of serving God's people as a priest, permanent deacon, religious sister or brother is personally fulfilling and spiritually exciting. Anyone who feels they might be interested in the priesthood, diaconate or religious life should speak to a parish priest.

Mothers and fathers are the first teachers of their children in the ways of the faith. We hope they will be the best of teachers by what they say and do. I would like to thank Collum Signs for the nice signs they made for the mid-summer Collection and Raffle.

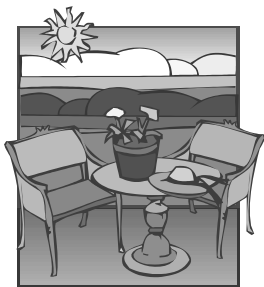
I would like to thank Gina Arresta and her helpers for the successful bake sale. We made over \$1800.00

2010-2011 Registration

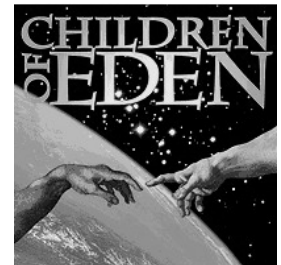

Today is the feast of St. James the Apostle, James and his brother John were working as fisherman when Jesus called them to be his disciples. They must have been energetic and excitable people, as Jesus nicknamed them the "sons of thunder." James was one of the three closest men to Jesus. He was present when Jesus raised the daughter of Jairus from the dead and in the Garden of Olives. And he may have been the first of the apostles to die for preaching about Jesus.

It is believed that James' bones were taken to Compostela in Spain. His shrine there was, after Rome and Jerusalem, the most popular place of pilgrimage during the Middle Ages.

Reading

Matthew 20:20-23

Listen to the words of the Holy Gospel according to Matthew

The mother of James and John came to Jesus with her two sons. She knelt down and started begging him to do something for her. Jesus asked her what she wanted, and she said, "When you come into your kingdom, please let one of my sons sit at your right side and the other at your left."

Jesus answered, "Not one of you knows what you are asking. Are you able to drink from the cup that I must soon drink from?" James and John said, "Yes, we are!" Jesus replied, "You certainly will drink from my cup! But it isn't for me to say who will sit at my right side and at my left. That is for my Father to say."

The Gospel of the Lord.

Reflection: Do I want the best place wherever I go? What cup did James and John drink from? What cup has Jesus offered to me?

Today we remember St. Ignatius of Loyola, who lived at the court of King Ferdinand and Queen Isabella of Spain. He enjoyed wealth and glory until he was wounded in battle. As he spent the next painful months recovering, the only books he could find were about Christ and the saints. Ignatius decided to live his life for God's glory rather than his own.

When he was well, Ignatius gave his money to the poor, hung his sword at Our Lady's shrine, and became a man of prayer. He and his friends formed a religious order called the Society of Jesus, or "Jesuits" for short. They dedicated themselves to reforming and serving the Church as teachers and missionaries. Today thousands of Jesuits around the world are inspired by the energy and wisdom of Ignatius.

Reading:

Ephesians 1:3-6

Listen to the words of the Apostle Paul:

Brothers and sisters: Praise the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ for the spiritual blessings that Christ has brought us from heaven! Before the world was created, God had Christ choose us to live with him and to be his holy and innocent and loving people. God was kind and decided that Christ would choose us to be God's own adopted children. God was very kind to us because of the Son he dearly loves, and so we should praise God.

The Word of the Lord.

Reflection: What spiritual blessings has God given me? How can I raise the level of love in my family today? Adopted children are specially chosen by their parents. How are Christians like children adopted by

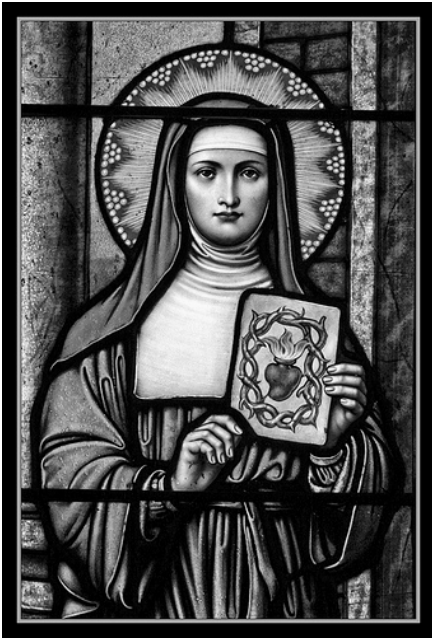

Diocese of Rockville Centre Devotion to the Sacred Heart



A first class relic of St. Margaret Mary of Alacoque will be venerated from August 16 to August 23 in our Diocese. The schedule at this time is:

- August 16 - St. Agnes in Rockville Centre**
- August 17 - Sacred Heart Parish in Island Park**
- August 18 - St. Aidan Parish in Williston Park**
- August 19 - St. Ignatius Retreat House in Manhasset**

- August 22 - Shrine of Our Lady of the Island in Manorville**
- August 23 - St. Rosalie in Hampton Bays**

The time frame for each parish and Retreat Center is from 1 PM to 8 PM. St. Ignatius Retreat House will close their day with a Healing Mass. The Parishes will fit the exposition into their Mass Schedule for the day. The Knights of Columbus will set up an Honor Guard at each site.

The Bishop has asked the prayer groups to spend time in prayer, penance and petition to the Sacred Heart for an outpouring of Love, Healing and Grace in the hearts of everyone in the Diocese for the weeks prior to the arrival of the relic.

He is also encouraging the prayer groups to spend eight months in prayer after the arrival of the relic, focusing on Pope John Paul II's Model for Evangelization of fallen-away Catholics.

The themes for the months of prayer are:

September—A call to Holiness

October—A Call to Prayer

November—Devotion to the Eucharist

December—Devotion to the Sacrament of Reconciliation

January—Openness to the Movement of the Holy Spirit in Their Lives

February—Meditation/Contemplation—Listening in Prayer

March—Openness to the Use of Technology in Spreading the Good News

April—The Role of the Laity in Evangelization

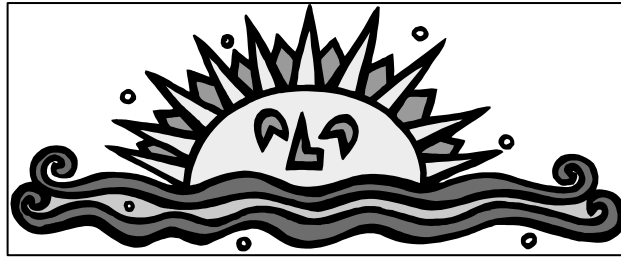
May—Thanksgiving for the Healing Received for Devotion to the Sacred Heart

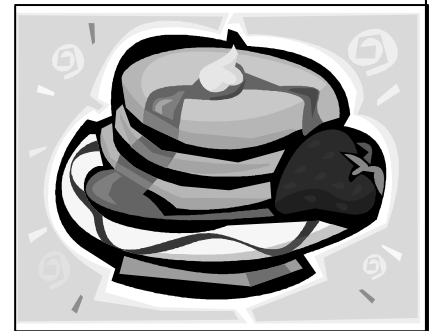
