#### WE CELEBRATE BAPTISM:

Baptisms are customarily performed on Sunday at 2:30 P.M. Prior arrangements with the parish priest or deacon must be made as far in advance as possible. The Godfather and Godmother should be practicing Catholics. Our Baptismal Program meets at 7:30 P.M. on the second Monday of each month in the Parish Center.

#### WE CELEBRATE PENANCE:

Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4:00 - 4:45 PM. A more convenient time may be arranged with the parish priest by calling the Parish Center.

#### WE CELEBRATE MARRIAGE:

In order to prepare adequately for the life-long commitment to the Sacrament and to arrange to participate in a Marriage Preparation Program, we ask that you make arrangements with the priest or deacon of your choice at least six months prior to the date of the marriage. Because of the Sunday Mass schedule, Nuptial Masses are normally celebrated on Friday evening or Saturday. Weddings should take place in the proper parish of the bride or groom.

**OUR LADY OF THE HAMPTONS**

The school community of Our Lady of the Hamptons is actively seeking parish and local assistance in helping to complete the building fund drive toward the completion of the new Wellness Center-Classroom extension to the school at 160 North Main Street, Southampton.

Bishop William Murphy joined the school at the June ceremonial groundbreaking. Once final contracts are signed, the actual construction of the \$2.6 million building will begin.

A complete prospectus of information is available at the school as well as at the doors of the Church.

In celebration of the 10th Anniversary of the Kohl's Cares philanthropic program, 20 eligible schools will have a chance to receive a total of five hundred thousand dollars each. These schools will be selected from among schools receiving community votes of support through Facebook.

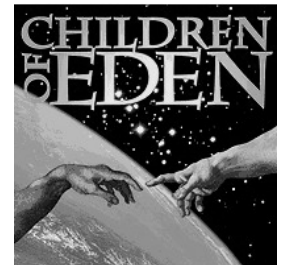

Prayers and history of the Church

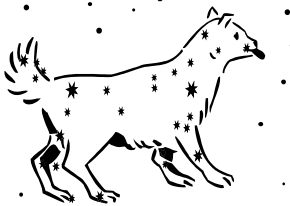

18th Sunday in Ordinary Time

## THE MONTH OF AUGUST

The eighth month is a time of harvest in the northern hemisphere. We enjoy fresh tomatoes, zucchini, peaches, and other tasty fruits and vegetables. The church turns our eyes to the heavenly harvest with the feasts of the Transfiguration of the Lord (August 6) and the Assumption of the Virgin Mary (August 15). The Assumption is a holy day of obligation in the United States, (not this year because it falls on a Saturday) and many parishes celebrate with processions, festivals, picnics, or the blessing of produce.

From the end of July until the beginning of September, the "dog star," Sirius, rises and sets with the sun. The name Sirius means "burning," and it is the brightest star in the sky. It is part of the constellation Canis Major, which means "large dog." These hot, sultry days of late July and early August are often called the "dog days" of summer.



Temperatures can rise above 100 degrees during August, so we have set aside a day to think about the sun (August 12). It is not surprising that August is the traditional month for vacations.



People enjoy taking time from work and heading to the mountains or the beach to cool off. Vacation is an excellent time to pray with the whole family.

**Saint Helen** (August 18) is credited with finding the cross of Jesus, and many saints remind us this month that the cross plays a central role in our lives as Christians: Edith Stein (August 9), Franz Jagerstatter (Also August 9) and Maximilian Kolbe (August 14) died at the hands of Nazis in World War II.



Our Apostle of the month is Bartholomew (August 24). Other new Testament saints remembered in August are Mary, the mother of Jesus (August 15,22), John the Baptist (August 29), Joseph of Arimathea (August 31), and Nicodemus (August 31).

## August 2, 2010

Today we remember Saint Basil the Blessed, a patron of Russia. Some men and women choose unusual ways to serve God. Basil the Blessed is one of these. He wandered naked through the streets of Moscow like a prophet, praying and bearing witness to the teachings of the gospel in startling ways. Sometimes he took things from shops and gave them to the poor. Once he handed Tsar Ivan the Terrible a piece of raw meat, to shame him for "drinking men's blood." While Basil's ways made many people uncomfortable, they saw that his words were true, and they named the great cathedral in the center of Moscow after him.

**Reflection:** How did Basil the Blessed's actions wake people up? Am I awake to injustice in my world? Do I speak up when I see it?

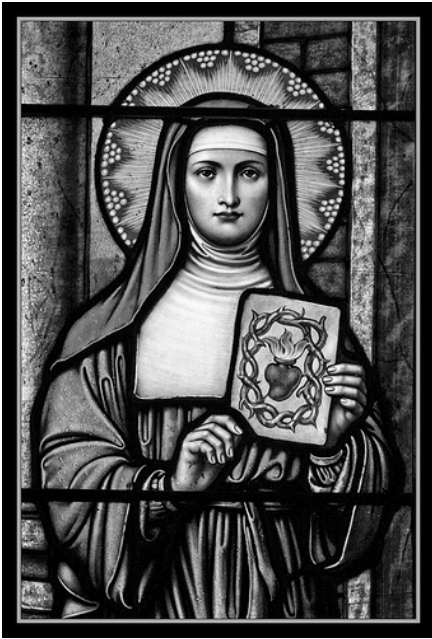
### Prayer:

## Diocese of Rockville Centre Devotion to the Sacred Heart



A first class relic of St. Margaret Mary of Alacoque will be venerated from August 16 to August 23 in our Diocese. The schedule at this time is:

- August 16 - St. Agnes in Rockville Centre**
- August 17 - Sacred Heart Parish in Island Park**
- August 18 - St. Aidan Parish in Williston Park**
- August 19 - St. Ignatius Retreat House in Manhasset**
- August 20 - Sts. Philip and James Parish in St. James**
- August 21 - Cure' of Ars Parish in Merrick**
- August 22 - Shrine of Our Lady of the Island in Manorville**
- August 23 - St. Rosalie in Hampton Bays**

The time frame for each parish and Retreat Center is from 1 PM to 8 PM. St. Ignatius Retreat House will close their day with a Healing Mass. The Parishes will fit the exposition into their Mass Schedule for the day. The Knights of Columbus will set up an Honor Guard at each site.

The Bishop has asked the prayer groups to spend time in prayer, penance and petition to the Sacred Heart for an outpouring of Love, Healing and Grace in the hearts of everyone in the Diocese for the weeks prior to the arrival of the relic.

He is also encouraging the prayer groups to spend eight months in prayer after the arrival of the relic, focusing on Pope John Paul II's Model for Evangelization of fallen-away Catholics.

The themes for the months of prayer are:

*September—A call to Holiness*

*October—A Call to Prayer*

*November—Devotion to the Eucharist*

*December—Devotion to the Sacrament of Reconciliation*

*January—Openness to the Movement of the Holy Spirit in Their Lives*

*February—Meditation/Contemplation—Listening in Prayer*

*March—Openness to the Use of Technology in Spreading the Good News*

*April—The Role of the Laity in Evangelization*

*May—Thanksgiving for the Healing Received for Devotion to the Sacred Heart*

*We hope all prayer groups will participate in this year of prayer.*
