WE CELEBRATE BAPTISM:

Baptisms are customarily performed on Sunday at 2:30 P.M. Prior arrangements with the parish priest or deacon must be made as far in advance as possible. The Godfather and Godmother should be practicing Catholics. Our Baptismal Program meets at 7:30 P.M. on the second Monday of each month in the Parish Center.

WE CELEBRATE PENANCE:

Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4:00 - 4:45 PM. A more convenient time may be arranged with the parish priest by calling the Parish Center.

WE CELEBRATE MARRIAGE:

In order to prepare adequately for the life-long commitment to the Sacrament and to arrange to participate in a Marriage Preparation Program, we ask that you make arrangements with the priest or deacon of your choice at least six months prior to the date of the marriage. Because of the Sunday Mass schedule, Nuptial Masses are normally celebrated on Friday evening or Saturday. Weddings should take place in the proper parish of the bride or groom.

WE CELEBRATE HOLY ORDERS & RELIGIOUS LIFE:

The privilege of serving God's people as a priest, permanent deacon, religious sister or brother is personally fulfilling and spiritually exciting. Anyone who feels they might be interested in the priesthood, diaconate or religious life should speak to a parish priest.

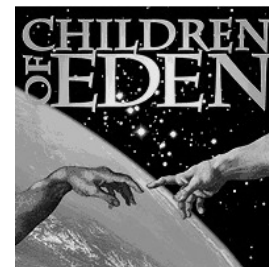

Prayers and history of the Church

19th Sunday in Ordinary Time

August 8, 2010

Today we remember Saint Dominic Guzman, a Spanish priest who was blessed with the gift of persuasion. In the early thirteenth century, many Christians had the wrong idea that all the things of this world, including the human body, were really works of the devil, not the good creation of our loving God. Dominic studied the Gospel and the teachings of the church, and began preaching the truth. When others joined his work he formed the Order of Preachers, also called Dominicans.

A friend wrote that Dominic's face "was friendly and joyful. You could easily see his inward peace." Dominicans share in their founder's spirit of joy and his love of learning.

Reading

Matthew 9:36-38, 10:5, 7-8

Listen to the words of the holy gospel according to Matthew

When Jesus saw the crowds, he felt sorry for them. They were confused and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. He said to his disciples, "A large crop is in the fields, but there are only a few workers. Ask the Lord in charge of the harvest to send out workers to bring it in."

Jesus sent out the twelve apostles with these instructions: "As you go, announce that the kingdom of heaven will soon be here. Heal the sick, raise the dead to life, heal people who have leprosy, and force out demons. You received without paying, now give without being paid."

The gospel of the Lord.

Reflection: why is it important for people to pray and study before preaching? Who are the workers in the Lord's field today? Is my faith a gift I received without paying?

August 12, 2010

Today we celebrate "Brother Sun." He warms our planet and fills it with things necessary for life and growth. But during August, the sun may be a bit too generous. Hot sunny days can be scorchers, when gardeners long for cool rain.

The sun is many things to us, but above all it is our giant lantern. Light has come to represent joy, knowledge, innocence, love and life itself. The sun is a powerful icon of God, whom we call "Light of Light" and "Light of the World." We look forward to the end of the world, when, according to the Bible, God will be all the light we need.

Reading

1 John 2:7,8-13,14

Listen to the words of the first letter to John

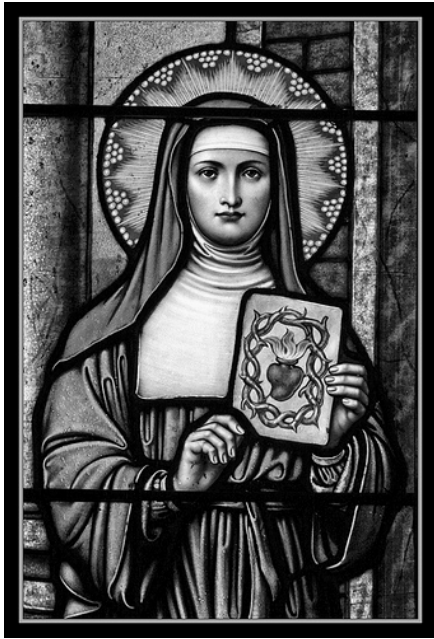
My dear friends! You can see the darkness fading away and the true light already shining. If we claim to be in the light and hate someone, we are still in the dark. But if we love others, we are in the light, and we don't cause problems for them. If we hate others, we are living and walking in the dark. We don't know where we are going, because we can't see in the dark. Children, I am writing you, because your sins have been forgiven in the name of Christ. Parents, I am writing you, because you have known the one who was there from the beginning. Young people, I am writing you, because you are strong. God's message is firm in your hearts, and you have defeated the evil one.

Reflection: What does John mean by "the true light [is] already shining"? How is having my sins forgiven like coming into the light?

On August 11 & 12, the earth's orbit takes us through a cloud of rocks left by a comet. If we look in the sky before dawn, we can see falling stars called "Saint Lawrence's tears" because they appear close to his feast day (August 10). It is also called the Perseid meteor shower.



Diocese of Rockville Centre Devotion to the Sacred Heart



A first class relic of St. Margaret Mary of Alacoque will be venerated from August 16 to August 23 in our Diocese. The schedule at this time is:

- August 16 - St. Agnes in Rockville Centre**
- August 17 - Sacred Heart Parish in Island Park**
- August 18 - St. Aidan Parish in Williston Park**
- August 19 - St. Ignatius Retreat House in Manhasset**
- August 20 - Sts. Philip and James Parish in St. James**
- August 21 - Cure' of Ars Parish in Merrick**
- August 22 - Shrine of Our Lady of the Island in Manorville**
- August 23 - St. Rosalie in Hampton Bays**

The time frame for each parish and Retreat Center is from 1 PM to 8 PM. St. Ignatius Retreat House will close their day with a Healing Mass. The Parishes will fit the exposition into their Mass Schedule for the day. The Knights of Columbus will set up an Honor Guard at each site.

The Bishop has asked the prayer groups to spend time in prayer, penance and petition to the Sacred Heart for an outpouring of Love, Healing and Grace in the hearts of everyone in the Diocese for the weeks prior to the arrival of the relic.

He is also encouraging the prayer groups to spend eight months in prayer after the arrival of the relic, focusing on Pope John Paul II's Model for Evangelization of fallen-away Catholics.

The themes for the months of prayer are:

September—A call to Holiness

October—A Call to Prayer

November—Devotion to the Eucharist

December—Devotion to the Sacrament of Reconciliation

January—Openness to the Movement of the Holy Spirit in Their Lives

February—Meditation/Contemplation—Listening in Prayer

March—Openness to the Use of Technology in Spreading the Good News

April—The Role of the Laity in Evangelization

May—Thanksgiving for the Healing Received for Devotion to the Sacred Heart

We hope all prayer groups will participate in this year of prayer.

Anointing of the Sick: The Mystery of Illness

We get hurt. We wear out. The lungs, the eyes, the memory, and any of the many limbs and organs that compose us break or ache. Gloom comes over us then: pity for ourselves, sorrow, depression, anger. But hope can come, too, and courage, and sometimes peace. All of this is marked and celebrated in the rites of our tradition. With a word and a deed, with touch and breath and spit and mud, Jesus heals those who ail. In every place and time, we who are the church remember and tell stories of healing, anoint the sick with oil and share the one bread even with those who cannot assemble for Mass. Thus the sick and the healthy, the homebound and the spry, saints and sinners are made one and remain one, a single body of many parts.

Anyone who is seriously ill can be anointed, including the elderly who become weaker, even if no illness is present; those waiting for surgery when a serious condition is the reason for the operation; sick children who have sufficient use of reason to be helped by the celebration; and those who are unconscious or who have lost the use of reason, provided that they probably would have asked for the sacrament had they the use of their faculties. Furthermore, many forms of mental illness are now known to be serious. So the mentally ill may be anointed, provided that they will be helped and not harmed by the rite. If you have questions, consult a priest or other parish leader.

The most complete celebration of the sacrament is a communal one, a celebration in which those to be anointed are surrounded and supported by other members of the Christian community, whether at home, or in the house of the church (for those who can leave their beds and come here). In song and in silence, with scriptures and prayers, we strengthen the bonds of love and faith that are stronger than the most lethal disease and more powerful even than death.
