#### WE CELEBRATE BAPTISM:

Baptisms are customarily performed on Sunday at 2:30 P.M. Prior arrangements with the parish priest or deacon must be made as far in advance as possible. The Godfather and Godmother should be practicing Catholics. Our Baptismal Program meets at 7:30 P.M. on the second Monday of each month in the Parish Center.

#### WE CELEBRATE PENANCE:

Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4:00 - 4:45 PM. A more convenient time may be arranged with the parish priest by calling the Parish Center.

#### WE CELEBRATE MARRIAGE:

In order to prepare adequately for the life-long commitment to the Sacrament and to arrange to participate in a Marriage Preparation Program, we ask that you make arrangements with the priest or deacon of your choice at least six months prior to the date of the marriage. Because of the Sunday Mass schedule, Nuptial Masses are normally celebrated on Friday evening or Saturday. Weddings should take place in the proper parish of the bride or groom.

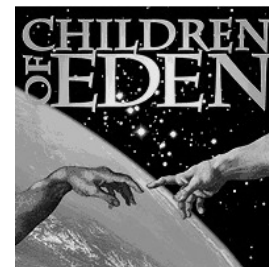

## The Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin

August 15, 2010

Today we celebrate the Assumption of Mary, body and soul, into heaven. According to ancient tradition, Mary lived in the town of Ephesus (*EF-uh-sus*) after the ascension of Jesus. When she was dying, John who was by then Bishop of Ephesus, sent word to the other apostles, who hurried to her bedside. But Thomas did not arrive until after her funeral. On opening the tomb so he could pay his respects, they were amazed to find lilies in place of the body of their "mother" and friend. Christians keep this day as a harvest festival. Mary has been harvested into God's kingdom, and the earth's season of plenty has begun. Arrange fruits, vegetables and flowers on your table or around an image of Mary. Bless the garden or visit a pick-your-own farm.



**The Litany of Loreto** lists beautiful titles that come from the Bible or traditions about Mary. Rewrite it, keeping titles that seem beautiful to you, and adding others. Draw pictures for your poem. Hang them around the kitchen or wherever you pray this week.

August 22, 2010

On this octave, or eighth day after the feast of the Assumption, we celebrate the Queenship of the Virgin Mary. We use the image of royalty and a heavenly kingdom to think about the important part Mary has in God's plan of salvation, and the glorious reward that she has received. We, too, are called to share in Christ's mission, resurrection and glory. Like a good queen, Mary watches over the church, praying for all who seek God's kingdom. This is a good day to sing Mary's prayer, the Magnificat. Many people know it by heart.

### Reading

Revelation: 12:1,5-6, 10

Listen to the words of the Book of Revelation

Something important appeared in the sky. It was a woman whose clothes were the sun. The moon was under her feet, and a crown made of twelve stars was on her head. The woman gave birth to a son, who would rule all the nations with an iron rod. The boy was snatched away. He was taken to God and placed on his throne. The woman ran into the desert to a place that God had prepared for her.

Then I heard a voice from heaven shout, "Our God has shown his saving power, and God's kingdom has come!"

### Reading

Luke 1:39-47

Listen to the words of the holy gospel according to Luke.

May hurried to a town in the hill country of Judea. She went into Zechariah's home, where she greeted Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, her baby moved within her. The Holy Spirit came upon Elizabeth. Then in a loud voice she said to Mary: "God has blessed you more than any other woman! He has also blessed the child you will have. 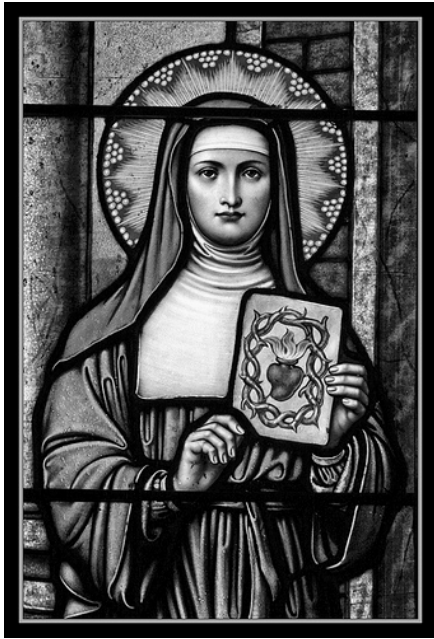

## Diocese of Rockville Centre Devotion to the Sacred Heart



A first class relic of St. Margaret Mary of Alacoque will be venerated from August 16 to August 23 in our Diocese. The schedule at this time is:

- August 16 - St. Agnes in Rockville Centre**
- August 17 - Sacred Heart Parish in Island Park**
- August 18 - St. Aidan Parish in Williston Park**
- August 19 - St. Ignatius Retreat House in Manhasset**
- August 20 - Sts. Philip and James Parish in St. James**
- August 21 - Cure' of Ars Parish in Merrick**
- August 22 - Shrine of Our Lady of the Island in Manorville**
- August 23 - St. Rosalie in Hampton Bays**

The time frame for each parish and Retreat Center is from 1 PM to 8 PM. St. Ignatius Retreat House will close their day with a Healing Mass. The Parishes will fit the exposition into their Mass Schedule for the day. The Knights of Columbus will set up an Honor Guard at each site.

The Bishop has asked the prayer groups to spend time in prayer, penance and petition to the Sacred Heart for an outpouring of Love, Healing and Grace in the hearts of everyone in the Diocese for the weeks prior to the arrival of the relic.

He is also encouraging the prayer groups to spend eight months in prayer after the arrival of the relic, focusing on Pope John Paul II's Model for Evangelization of fallen-away Catholics.

The themes for the months of prayer are:

*September—A call to Holiness*

*October—A Call to Prayer*

*November—Devotion to the Eucharist*

*December—Devotion to the Sacrament of Reconciliation*

*January—Openness to the Movement of the Holy Spirit in Their Lives*

*February—Meditation/Contemplation—Listening in Prayer*

*March—Openness to the Use of Technology in Spreading the Good News*

*April—The Role of the Laity in Evangelization*

*May—Thanksgiving for the Healing Received for Devotion to the Sacred Heart*

*We hope all prayer groups will participate in this year of prayer.*

*We pray that all prayer groups will evangelize their parishes to develop prayerful activities as well!*

## Anointing of the Sick II: Celebrating the Sacrament

The sacrament of the anointing of the sick is a celebration in which those who are seriously ill or infirm are surrounded and supported by other members of the Christian community, whether at home or in the house of the church (for those who can leave their beds and come here). In song and in silence, with scriptures and prayers, we strengthen the bonds of love and faith that are stronger than the most lethal disease and more



powerful even than death. The sacrament may be celebrated in the context of a Mass, or on its own, depending on the needs of the person who is sick.

The celebration opens with brief introductory rites that help us remember that God is with us and that we are the body of Christ. Then follows a liturgy of the word, in which we hear scriptures that shed light on the meaning of sickness and suffering and the compassion of our God, who suffers with us. Depending on the needs of the person who is sick, one brief passage or two or three readings and a psalm may be used. A homily may be preached, too.

Then the rite continues. The gathered church surrounds the person who is sick with the prayer of faith. In response to God's word, a litany is prayed. Then, the priest does the laying on of hands, an ancient sign of the moving of the Holy Spirit to heal and save. This is done in silence. Then a prayer is said over the oil of the sick. Finally, the priest anoints the head and the hands, and sometimes other parts of the body (the feet, for example, or the part of the body that is in pain) of the one who is sick. While anointing the sick person's head, the priest says "Through this holy anointing, may the Lord in his love and mercy help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit." And all answer "Amen!" While anointing the hands, the priest says, "May the Lord who frees you from sin save you and raise you up." And again, all answer "Amen!" If other parts of the body are anointed, no words are said. A final prayer is then said.

The liturgy of the eucharist, or simply the giving of communion, may follow. Or the rite ends with a blessing. If you or someone you know is in need of the anointing, please call the parish office.
