#### WE CELEBRATE BAPTISM:

Baptisms are customarily performed on Sunday at 2:30 P.M. Prior arrangements with the parish priest or deacon must be made as far in advance as possible. The Godfather and Godmother should be practicing Catholics. Our Baptismal Program meets at 7:30 P.M. on the second Monday of each month in the Parish Center.

#### WE CELEBRATE PENANCE:

Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4:00 - 4:45 PM. A more convenient time may be arranged with the parish priest by calling the Parish Center.

#### WE CELEBRATE MARRIAGE:

In order to prepare adequately for the life-long commitment to the Sacrament and to arrange to participate in a Marriage Preparation Program, we ask that you make arrangements with the priest or deacon of your choice at least six months prior to the date of the marriage. Because of the Sunday Mass schedule, Nuptial Masses are normally celebrated on Friday evening or Saturday. Weddings should take place in the proper parish of the bride or groom.

#### WE CELEBRATE HOLY ORDERS & RELIGIOUS LIFE:

The privilege of serving God's people as a priest, permanent deacon, religious sister or brother is personally fulfilling and spiritually exciting. Anyone who feels they might be interested in the priesthood, diaconate or religious life should speak to a parish priest.

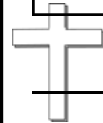

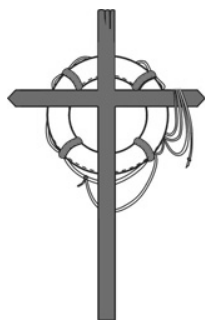

Opera singer and part-time Southampton resident Ashley Bell teams with noted Chinese organist Chao Liao in a solo recital featuring sacred music for voice and organ. The one hour concert will be held at Sacred Hearts of Jesus & Mary Church at 7 p.m. on August 28.

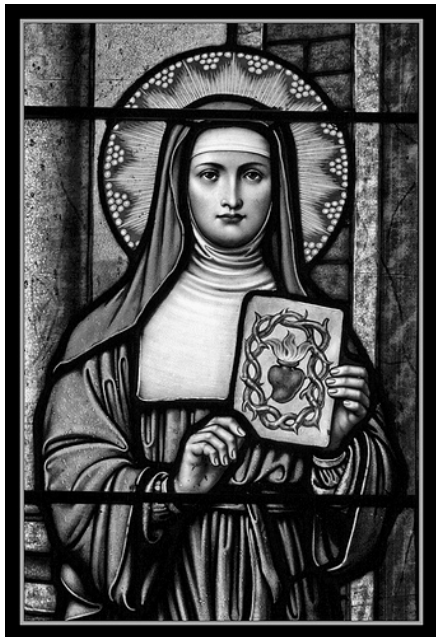


Tickets are \$10 and proceeds will benefit the Church.

Ashley Bell was the first member of the Children's Choir at the church. She became a cantor at age nine on the weekends while she performed during the week with the Metropolitan Opera Children's Chorus. She graduated from Yale Phi Beta Kappa with distinction in Italian and International Studies in 2006. Ms. Bell speaks five languages fluently and has performed in the United States, France and Italy. Roles performed were Feu, Rossignol, and Chauve-Souris in *L'enfant et les Sortilèges* as a young artist at the Crested Butte Music Festival, Guadelana in Offenbach's *La Perichole* with Opera du Périgord in Thiviers, France, Lucy (*The Telephone*), Despina (*Così fan tutte*), Lauretta (*Gianni Schicchi*) and Clarina in *La Cambiale di Matrimonio*. Ashley is a 2006 recipient of the Yale Browne Irish Performing Arts Award.

Chao Liao is currently the Church Organist at St John's Episcopal Church in East Hartford and is the Senior Assistant Organist and John Rose Organ Scholar at Trinity College. Born in Beijing China, Chao Liao started his musical career at the age of 4, when he began intensive piano instruction under the tutelage of well renowned instructor Han, Jianming, professor of piano department in Central Conservatory in China. His piano pursuit culminated in a second place finish in all of China in the Rising Stars of Tomorrow competition in 2001 and again a second place finish in 2003. Chao's arrival in America in 2007 provided him with more than just a glimpse into a foreign culture, but more importantly exposed him to the organ. Since his freshman year Chao has performed in venues ranging from Yale University to Oxford University to Beijing. Chao will return to Trinity College in the fall for his senior year to complete his math major after spending his junior year at Oxford University studying pure mathematics.

## Prayers and history of the Church



August 22, 2010  
21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

August 23, 2010

Today we remember Saint Rose, who lived in Lima, Peru. She was nicknamed "Rose" because of her beauty, which her parents hoped would help find her a rich husband. But she did not want to marry. She wanted to spend her life in prayer. So she moved into a small hut and tended the family garden. She earned money by selling her flowers and embroidery. She turned a room of her parents' home into a free clinic for anyone who needed her care.

When Rose died in the year 1617, such great crowds gathered that the streets were clogged. Rose of Lima was the first person born in the Americas to be named a saint of the Church.

### Reading

Galatians 5:1, 13-14

Listen to the words of the apostle Paul.

Brothers and sisters: Christ has set us free! This means we are really free. Now hold on to your freedom and don't ever become slaves of the Law again.

My friends, you were chosen to be free. So don't use your freedom as an excuse to do anything you want. Use it as an opportunity to serve each other with love. All that the Law says can be summed up in the command to love others as much as you love yourself.

The word of the Lord.

**Reflection:** in what ways am I free? Do I serve my family with love, perhaps by cooperating with the family chores? What do I do for other people that I don't have to do? Do I pay attention to what others freely do for me, and thank them?

Loving God,

Free us from sadness and worry.

Free us from jealousy and greed.

Free us from distractions in prayer.

Free us to follow you with all our hearts.

We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.



Rose was born just 50 years after the conquistadores (kon-KEES-tud-doors) had conquered Peru. She was raised in the Spanish culture but she was part Inca. She saw the suffering of Indians who were forced to work in the gold and silver mines. She vigorously protested against the enslavement, the poverty and the suffering of the native

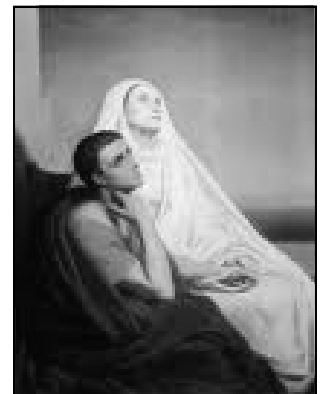
peoples.

### August 27, 2010

Today we remember Saint Monica, a strong Christian woman of North Africa. When her son, Augustine, joined another religion, Monica never stopped praying that God would help him see things more clearly. And she never stopped teaching him the truth of the Christian faith.

After many years, Monica's prayers were answered. Augustine became a Christian.

After her death, Augustine wrote that those who knew her greatly praised and honored God, "because they recognized [God's] presence in her heart, for the fruit of her holy life bore witness to this." Saint Monica died in 387.



### August 28, 2010

Today we remember Saint Augustine, Saint Monica's son. As a young man Augustine studied many philosophies and religions, but he was never happy with what he found. Finally, after many years, God's word came to him and he realized the truth of the gospel. It changed his life. Augustine was baptized, and he returned to his home in Africa. There he became a great bishop, preacher, and writer. Perhaps no other writings except the Bible have had so great an influence on Christianity. His most famous book tells the story of his life. It is called, *Confessions*, and is the story of God's love pursuing him. You will probably read it someday.
