#### WE CELEBRATE BAPTISM:

Baptisms are customarily performed on Sunday at 2:30 P.M. Prior arrangements with the parish priest or deacon must be made as far in advance as possible. The Godfather and Godmother should be practicing Catholics. Our Baptismal Program meets at 7:30 P.M. on the second Monday of each month in the Parish Center.

#### WE CELEBRATE PENANCE:

Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4:00 - 4:45 PM. A more convenient time may be arranged with the parish priest by calling the Parish Center.

#### WE CELEBRATE MARRIAGE:

In order to prepare adequately for the life-long commitment to the Sacrament and to arrange to participate in a Marriage Preparation Program, we ask that you make arrangements with the priest or deacon of your choice at least six months prior to the date of the marriage. Because of the Sunday Mass schedule, Nuptial Masses are normally celebrated on Friday evening or Saturday. Weddings should take place in the proper parish of the bride or groom.

#### WE CELEBRATE HOLY ORDERS & RELIGIOUS LIFE:

The privilege of serving God's people as a priest, permanent deacon, religious sister or brother is personally fulfilling and spiritually exciting. Anyone who feels they might be interested in the priesthood, diaconate or religious life should speak to a parish priest.

#### WE CELEBRATE GROWTH IN CHRIST:

Mothers and fathers are the first teachers of their children in the ways of the faith. We hope they will be the best of teachers by what they say and do. Our Parish Religious Education Program and Our Lady of the Hamptons Regional School strive to support and complement the responsibility of parents to be the primary teachers of the children they have co-created with God. Our Religious Education Program, which includes preparation for First Penance, First Eucharist and Confirmation, is a family centered, continual formation extending from Grade 1 through Grade 8. Our Ministry to high school students continues this formation for grades 9 through 12.

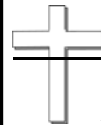

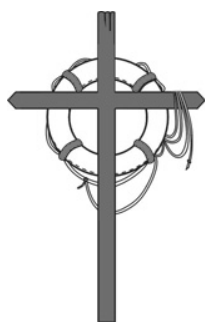

## Prayers and history of the Church



August 29, 2010  
22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

August 29, 2010

Today we remember the death of St. John the Baptist. John told people to be sorry for their sins and to turn to God with all their hearts. He baptized them as a sign of God's forgiveness. John bravely told King Herod and his family that they, too, were sinful. King Herod had John put in prison. Today's reading continues the story of John. This is a day to consider how governments sometimes ignore the rights of citizens and act with great injustice.



### Reading

Mark 6:21-25, 26-28

Listen to the words of the holy gospel according to Mark.

Herod gave a great birthday celebration for himself and invited his officials, his army officers, and the leaders of Galilee. The daughter of Herodias (*her-ROW-dee-us*) came in and danced for Herod and his guests. She pleased them so much that Herod said, "Ask for anything, and it's yours! I swear that I will give you as much as half of my kingdom, if you want it."

The girl left and asked her mother, "What do you think I should ask for?" Her mother answered, "The head of John the Baptist!"

The girl hurried back and told Herod. The king was very sorry for what he had said. But he did not want to break the promise he had made in front of his guests. At once he ordered a guard to cut off John's head there in prison. The guard put the head on a platter and took it to the girl.

**Reflection:** Do I become angry at people who tell me I am wrong? Do I try to get back at people? Do I sometimes say or do things just to show off?

August 31, 2010

On this day of August we remember Saints Joseph of Arimathea (*a-ruh-muh-THEE-uh*) and Nicodemus. They were wealthy, important men in Jerusalem. After the death of Jesus, Joseph obtained his body from Pilate and bought fine linen to wrap it in. Nicodemus bought a quantity of expensive spices, and together they buried the body in a tomb that belonged to Joseph.

Today's reading is a conversation between Jesus and Nicodemus about baptism.

### Reading

John 3:3-8

Listen to the words of the holy gospel according to John

Jesus said, "I tell you for certain that you must be born from above before you can see God's kingdom!" Nicodemus asked, "How can a grown man ever be born a second time?"

Jesus answered, "I tell you for certain that before you can get into God's kingdom, you must be born not only by water, but by the Spirit. Humans give life to their children. Yet only God's Spirit can change you into a child of God. Don't be surprised when I say that you must be born from above. Only God's Spirit gives new life. The Spirit is like the wind that blows wherever it wants to. You can hear the wind, but you don't know where it comes from or where it is going."

Blessed are you, Lord God.

On the day of our baptism, you brought us new life

## Godparent

Now is a good time to recall our own godparents and all those whose godparents we are, and to let them know that we are thinking of them. A call or a note is always welcome, and who wouldn't like knowing that the role they played on that happy day is still remembered fondly? If our godparents or godchildren are no longer living, we can remember to pray for them each day, on the anniversaries of their deaths or baptisms, or on the anniversary of our baptisms.

Promise yourself that you'll recall your godchild's baptismal anniversary with a card, or a "patron saint" present, or a water toy (even if he or she isn't a kid anymore). Celebrate your own baptismal date with a candle and a call to your godparents; maybe you could even wear something white or particularly festive. Put a pretty bowl of water in the center of the dinner table, and float a flower in it. Tell your spouse and your children about your godparents. On your children's baptismal date, tell them about their baptism, and about what their names mean. Do the same for your godchildren.

A special bond is formed between godparent and godchild at baptism. It is a good thing to celebrate.
