### WE CELEBRATE BAPTISM:

Baptisms are customarily performed on Sunday at 2:30 P.M. Prior arrangements with the parish priest or deacon must be made as far in advance as possible. The Godfather and Godmother should be practicing Catholics. Our Baptismal Program meets at 7:30 P.M. on the second Monday of each month in the Parish Center.

### WE CELEBRATE PENANCE:

Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4:00 - 4:45 PM. A more convenient time may be arranged with the parish priest by calling the Parish Center.

### WE CELEBRATE MARRIAGE:

In order to prepare adequately for the life-long commitment to the Sacrament and to arrange to participate in a Marriage Preparation Program, we ask that you make arrangements with the priest or deacon of your choice at least six months prior to the date of the marriage. Because of the Sunday Mass schedule, Nuptial Masses are normally celebrated on Friday evening or Saturday. Weddings should take place in the proper parish of the bride or groom.

## **FROM THE DESK OF FATHER JEFF:**

Last week on Friday, we had the priest's convocation. All the priests in the Diocese of Rockville Center gathered with Bishop Murphy and his auxiliary bishops to talk about the new Roman Missal translation and the psychological health of priests. During the convocation we spoke about the new translation that will be introduced later this year. Monsignor James Moroney, our speaker, advises the National Conference of Catholic Bishops on liturgy. The new translation is designed to give us deeper spiritual and theological insights into the liturgy.

The next speaker was Msgr. Stephen Rossetti, a licensed psychologist and former director of St. Luke's Institute for Clergy in Maryland. He spoke about the psychological health of priests.

Bishop Murphy then spoke of how much he appreciated the service of the priests in the diocese in the ten years he has been here. It was a nice day.

## FEAST OF FAITH

### Seasonal Changes for the Liturgies of Lent

This coming Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent. During this season of preparation for Easter, our churches look stark and simple—no flowers at the altar, no festive banners or decorations. And our liturgies feel different, too. The organ is quiet except to accompany the singing of the assembly. The Gloria, our Sunday song of rejoicing, is not heard except on solemnities, and we will not sing the Alleluia, our joyful acclamation of praise, until the Easter Vigil. “Alleluia cannot always / Be our song while here below,” says an eleventh-century hymn. “Alleluia our transgressions / Make us for a while forego; / For the solemn time is coming / When our tears for sins must flow” (*Alleluia dulce carmen*, J. M. Neale, trans.).

These changes in the liturgy will catch our attention, and make us eager for the festive outpouring of joy that will return with Easter. This year, may the stripped-away liturgies of Lent remind us to strip away what is not essential in our lives to make space for the crucified and risen One, and thus to be ready to sing “Alleluia” once again when Easter returns.

What wakes us up to the reality of **Wednesday** sin in our lives? What opens us up to God's mercy? Paul and the prophet Joel ask all God's people to be reconciled to God. Hearts, not garments, must be rent in contrition for our sins.

Jesus asks us to examine our motives when performing pious acts. When we give alms, is it because we have compassion for the poor or because we like to parade our generosity before others? Do prayer and fasting draw us closer to God, or are they ritual acts we perform because "we're supposed to?" God knows the intentions of our hearts and will reward us accordingly.

The signing with ashes on our foreheads is a solemn call to repent and believe the good news. We are called to remember our brief life on earth: we are only dust, and to dust we shall return. Ashes also remind us of the joy of eternal life. When we are united with God and one another, we become "ambassadors for Christ." No one will have to ask, "Where is your God?" God will be evident in all we say and do.

**For reflection:** In what practical ways can I observe the penitential disciplines of Lent: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving? Is there something I must do so I can do more for others?

**For Reflection:** How do we know that we are doing God's will?

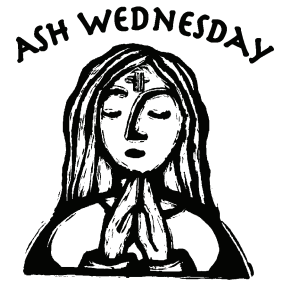
### Prayer:
