WE CELEBRATE BAPTISM:

Baptisms are customarily performed on Sunday at 2:30 P.M. Prior arrangements with the parish priest or deacon must be made as far in advance as possible. The Godfather and Godmother should be practicing Catholics. Our Baptismal Program meets at 7:30 P.M. on the second Monday of each month in the Parish Center.

WE CELEBRATE PENANCE:

Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4:00 - 4:45 PM. A more convenient time may be arranged with the parish priest by calling the Parish Center.

WE CELEBRATE MARRIAGE:

In order to prepare adequately for the life-long commitment to the Sacrament and to arrange to participate in a Marriage Preparation Program, we ask that you make arrangements with the priest or deacon of your choice at least six months prior to the date of the marriage. Because of the Sunday Mass schedule, Nuptial Masses are normally celebrated on Friday evening or Saturday. Weddings should take place in the proper parish of the bride or groom.

FROM THE DESK OF FATHER JEFF:

As you all may know by now, we have been named a minor basilica by His Holiness, Pope Benedict XVI.

The definition of a basilica:

A term used to designate certain official buildings in the time of the Roman Empire, later adapted, as was the architectural style of such buildings, for Christian use. The word itself has Greek origins and means "king's hall"; Christian use refers to Christ as the king of kings. Currently the term is used to designate a certain church of historical significance that continues to play an important part in the religious life of at least a particular region. In addition to the major basilicas, all of which are located in Rome, the Holy See honors other significant churches with this title. The insignia of these minor basilicas include a red and yellow striped umbrella reminiscent of those carried over imperial and papal authorities, the papal coat-of-arms over the door, and a bell recalling those once used to warn people of the approach of a papal procession.

Basilicas are expected to celebrate with greater solemnity than other churches certain feast days related to the Petrine Ministry and to commemorate certain historical days in the life of the current pope. In addition they are to be models for liturgical celebration and places of Pilgrimage for the faithful. Particular indulgences, unavailable in other churches, may be gained at basilicas.

Minor basilicas in North America include Mission Dolores in San Francisco, California; the Cathedral of St. Augustine in St. Augustine, Florida; Sacred Heart Basilica on the campus of Notre Dame in Notre Dame, Indiana; the Basilica of Notre Dame in Ottawa, Canada; and the Basilica of Notre Dame in Quebec, Canada* and now the Basilica Church of Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary in Southampton, New York!

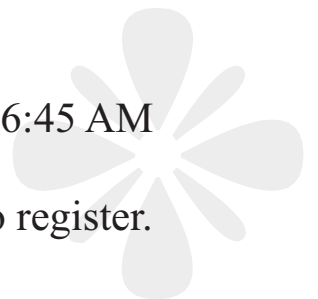

DIOCESAN PILGRIMAGE TO THE 50TH EUCHARISTIC CONGRESS IN DUBLIN, IRELAND JUNE 4-13, 2012

The Diocese of Rockville Centre is sponsoring a pilgrimage to the 50th Eucharistic Congress which will be held in Dublin, Ireland under the leadership of Bishop John D. Dunne, auxiliary Bishop of our Diocese. The dates are June 4—13, 2012. Msgr. Jim McNamara, pastor at Holy Cross Church in Nesconset, is coordinating the pilgrimage events. This pilgrimage is open to everyone.

Our pilgrimage will begin with some touring in the western part of Ireland and will end with the first three days of the Eucharistic Congress. Since Bishop Dunne's parents come from Castlebar, we are designing this pilgrimage around his family roots in the west of Ireland. This will enable us to visit some well-known sites (like the Cliffs of Moher and Kylemore Abbey) but also to take advantage of local places of interest that will introduce us to the richness of Irish culture and heritage.

We will celebrate Mass each day including Mass at the Cathedral in Tuam as well as at Knock. This pilgrimage begins on Monday, June 4, 2012 with a flight from JFK airport to Shannon airport. After some relaxing days in the west of Ireland and a memorable visit to the Shrine of Our Lady of Knock, the highlight of the pilgrimage will be the beginning of the Eucharistic Congress on Sunday, June 10th with the opening Mass.

Unless you wish to stay longer, our group will return to JFK airport in NY from Dublin on Wednesday, June 13th. There will also be an option to come for only the Eucharistic Congress portion in Dublin (departure from JFK June 9th) and then go off on your own to visit relatives or explore Ireland.

The Epiphany of the Lord The Little Drummer Boy

Did you know that the only reason we say that there were three Wise Men is that they brought three gifts? The Bible never mentions their number or their names. The gifts tell us about the givers. And these special gifts—gold, frankincense, and myrrh—tell us much.

When one king visited or sent an ambassador to another, he would give a gift of gold to show that he acknowledged the kingship of the other. So the first gift of the Wise Men tells us they recognized Jesus as king. The second gift is a type of incense, which was used in Jesus' time to worship God. This gift shows the Wise Men paying homage to Jesus' divinity. Oil, the gift of myrrh, is used to anoint the dying. It reminds us of Jesus' suffering and death on the cross.

What gifts do we have for Jesus? Maybe we can take a hint from the Wise Men. If we acknowledge Jesus as king, maybe a better gift than gold would be pledging our obedience to him. Each day we can promise to live our vocation as best we can, to love those around us, and forgive those who hurt us.

A better way than burning incense to pay homage to Jesus' divinity is taking time to pray throughout the day. Some people are able to attend daily Mass, others spend time in adoration before the Eucharist, or take even a few minutes of their lunch break to say the rosary.

As for the gift of myrrh, we can offer Jesus the crosses we bear each day. When we accept suffering in our lives, especially that caused by our sins, we give ourselves to Jesus as he gave himself for us on the cross.

The song "The Little Drummer Boy" reminds us that the best gift is not necessarily the most expensive one. Instead, it is the simple gift that only we can give. Let Epiphany remind us to offer our lives to Jesus each day.

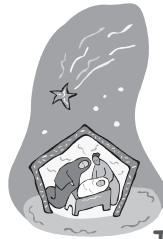

The Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord

January 8, 2012

Today is the solemnity of the Epiphany (or "showing") of Christ. God showed the wise men the way to Jesus, the light of the world, by the light of a star.

Gospel

Matthew 2:1-2, 5b, 9b-11

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew.

In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, "Where is the child who has been born King of the Jews?" For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage." The chief priests and scribes said, "In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet."



The Wise Men set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary, his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

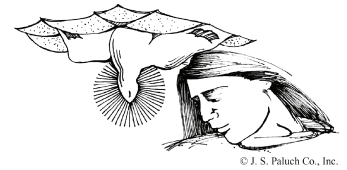

Mathew 3-13-17

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew.

Then Jesus came from Galilee to John at the Jordan, to be baptized by him. John would have prevented him, saying, "I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?" But Jesus answered him, "Let it be so now; for it is proper for us in this way to fulfill all righteousness." Then he consented. And when Jesus had been baptized, just as he came up from the water, suddenly the heavens were opened to him and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on him. And a voice from heaven said, "This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased."
