Baptisms are customarily performed on Sunday at 2:30 P.M. Prior arrangements with the parish priest or deacon must be made as far in advance as possible. The Godfather and Godmother should be practicing Catholics. Our Baptismal Program meets at 7:30 P.M. on the second Monday of each month in the Parish Center.

Because of the Sunday Mass schedule, Nuptial Masses are normally celebrated on Friday evening or Saturday. Weddings should take place in the proper parish of the bride or groom.

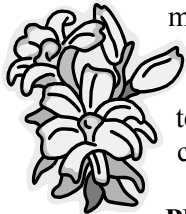

Q. Which familiar food had its origin as something to be eaten during Lent?

- A) fish
- B) Lentils
- C) Pretzels
- D) Pancakes

A: the answer is ©. Believe it or not, pretzels had their origin as a food eaten during Lent. Because Christians would not eat fat, eggs, milk, etc. during the Lenten season, they created a special "bread" from dough made only with flour, water & salt. These little breads were shaped in the form of arms crossed in prayer, and were called *bracellae* (Latin for "little arms"). In German, the Latin word became *bretzel*. Our familiar snack was actually a very popular Lenten food during the Middle Ages. Still is today!

### **TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION**

Ask senior parishioners about this fifth Sunday, and they will share memories of this Sunday years ago, when it was known as "Passion Sunday." In those days, the statues and crucifixes were draped in purple cloth, and a deeply somber atmosphere infused worship. The structure is different today for good reason. The stunning changes in the appearance of the church building drew attention away from the twofold work of Lent: reconciliation and preparing for initiation. Today, this Sunday is given to reflection on the necessity to commit, like Jesus, to the Father's will. Wherever elect are present today, the "A" reading reveals Jesus' compassion in the face of human suffering, and his desire to call us from the tombs of sin, isolation, and even death itself.

As Lent draws to a close over the next ten days, and before the beginning of the Easter Triduum on Holy Thursday, we enter an ideal time for celebrating the sacrament of reconciliation. Today's old title of "Passion Sunday" has migrated to next Sunday, also called "Palm Sunday." In many places, people prepare their own bundles of branches for next week's liturgy: pussy willow, forsythia, dogwood. If your parish schedules a procession, you may want to prepare these branches at home and bring them along.

# Fifth Sunday of Lent

## Father, Forgive Them

The promise made by the LORD in the first reading is very bold: All people shall know the LORD without having to be taught by others. God doesn't restrict the promise to only the holiest people. The way people will know God is through forgiveness of their sins. Remember, God is speaking to a people who had so many laws and commandments they needed a professional class of scribes and Pharisees to keep track of them. When they broke a commandment or law, they were isolated from the community. So the promise that God would place the law in their hearts meant they would be free to do God's will because they wanted to, not because they feared punishment or rejection.

Jesus says something similar in today's Gospel. He tells the disciples that his crucifixion will draw everyone to him. Jesus' death showed that he took on the punishment for sins in place of us who deserve it. In Luke's Gospel he even prays for those who crucified him, asking God's forgiveness for them (Luke 23:34). By dying on the cross, Jesus shows us how much God loves us. By rising from the dead, he shows us that we can rise from sin to a new life of faith and love.

We experience that promise made in the first reading when we bring our sins to God. When we forgive people who have hurt us, we also help them to experience that love. After all, if I can forgive you, surely God will forgive you. We also help others to know God when we share our experience of being forgiven. Still not sure if God has forgiven you? The sacrament of reconciliation gives us the assurance of God's forgiveness as well as the experience. With the other sacraments, it helps us keep God's love in our hearts.

### March 25, 2012

Today is the Fifth Sunday of Lent. In today's Gospel, a remarkable conversation takes place. To glorify means to exalt or praise.

#### Gospel

John 12:27-33

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John.

Jesus said: "Now my soul is troubled. And what should I say -'Father, save me from this hour'? No, it is for this reason that I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name." Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again." The crowd standing there heard it and said that it was thunder. Others said, "An angel has spoken to him."
