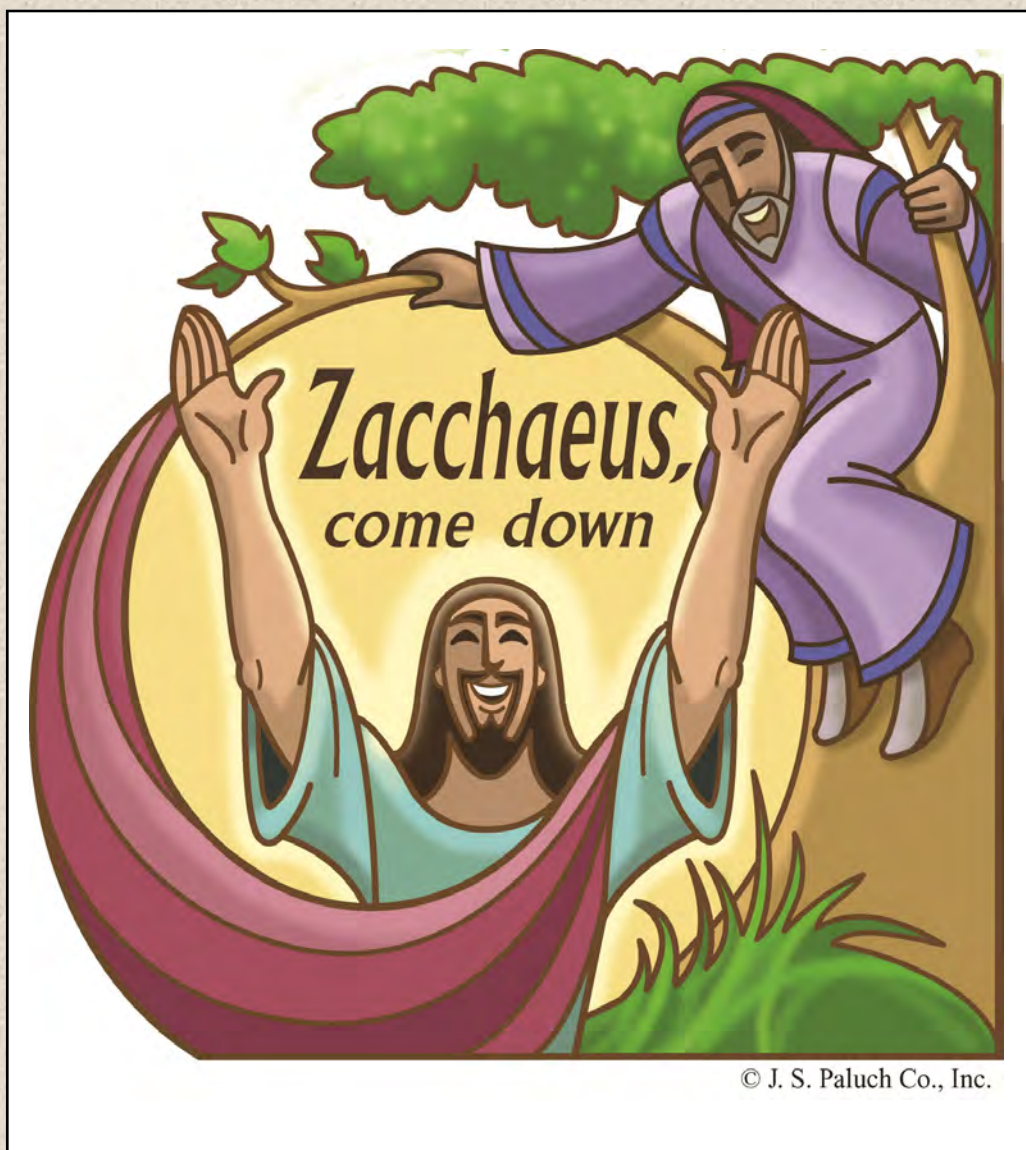

Pastor's Letter

All Saints Day

November 2/3

Dear Parish Family,

Many of you are familiar with the name Thomas Merton. He was a well known Trappist monk and priest who wrote about the monastic life in a way that led many people to embrace practices of contemplation and prayer. His autobiography, *The Seven Storey Mountain*, describes his early spiritual life and his conversion to Catholicism in the late 1930's. Shortly after his conversion Merton was walking down a street in New York City with his friend Bob Lax. Lax was Jewish, and he asked Merton what he wanted to be, now that he was Catholic.

"I don't know," Merton replied, "I guess a good Catholic."

Lax stopped and turned toward Merton.

"What you should say," he told him, "is that you want to be a saint!"

Merton was dumbfounded.

"How do you expect me to become a saint?" Merton asked him.

Lax said: "All that is necessary to be a saint is to want to be one. Don't you believe that God will make you what He created you to be, if you will consent to let him do it? All you have to do is desire it."

Thomas Merton knew his friend was right. Merton, of course, would soon discover something he had never even considered: a call to priesthood and the monastic life. Lax would later convert to Catholicism himself -- and begin his own journey to try and be a saint.

Whenever I celebrate the feast of All Saints, I think of this famous conversation between Merton and Lax. It calls to mind simply and profoundly what it means to be a Christian. You should want to be a saint! Not an average Christian, not a passable Christian. Each of us should want to be the best that God calls us to be.

Being called to be a saint is not about claiming an honor for ourselves like a medal pinned to our chest. It is more like the Army recruitment poster that entices young men and women to "Be all that you can be!" When we do that, when we strive to be our best, we bring to life the words of St. Irenaeus: The Glory of God is the human person fully alive!

ITINERARY

Day 1 (Mon) 21 April – Depart JFK
Depart JFK Intl Airport on your overnight flight to France.

Day 2 (Tue) 22 April – Toulouse/Lourdes
Upon arrival in Toulouse transfer to Lourdes and check into the hotel. Mass this evening and Dinner. (D)

Day 3 (Wed) 23 April – Lourdes
Start the day attending the international Mass at the Basilica of St. Pius X. Then, join a Local Guide for a walking tour including visits to Our Lady of Lourdes Shrine and St. Bernadette's birthplace and family home. You may wish to experience the powerful healing baths or attend the "Blessing of the Sick" or mass at the Crux Gloriosa Chapel. Visit the Grotto where the Virgin Mary appeared to St. Bernadette in 1858. Join this evening's memorable Rosary and Candlelight Procession, held every night. Dinner and overnight in Lourdes. (B,D)

Day 4 (Thu) 24 April – Lourdes
Today is set aside for personal exploration, devotions and reflections in this most peaceful and scenic hamlet, made sacred by Our Lady's appearance and revered by the faithful. Re-visit the Grotto, immerse yourself in the Healing Baths or pickup keepsakes. Tonight is the last opportunity to take part in the Candlelight Procession. Dinner and overnight. (B,D)

Day 5 (Fri) 25 April – Lourdes/Paris
Enjoy time at leisure this morning. In the afternoon the group travels to Paris aboard the high-speed TGV TRAIN to Paris. Food and snacks are available on the train. Once in Paris the evening is yours to settle in. (B)

Day 6 (Sat) 26 April – Paris
Sightseeing with a Local Guide features the Arc de Triomphe, Louvre, Champs-Elysées, and the Eiffel Tower. Visit the BASILICA OF SACRE COEUR on Montmartre Hill. A special visit has been included to OUR LADY OF THE MIRACULOUS MEDAL SHRINE, where the Virgin Mary appeared to St. Catherine Laboure in 1830. Later, the architectural wonders of NOTRE DAME CATHEDRAL. Dinner and overnight in Paris. (B,D)

Day 7 (Sun) 27 April – Paris/Lisieux/Paris
Travel to Lisieux and visit LES BUISSONNETS, family home of St. Therese. Afterwards, visit the BASILICA. St. Therese was known as "The Little Flower" and for her charming autobiography *The Story of a Soul*. Next, visit ST. PETER'S CATHEDRAL, where her family attended Mass, and the CARMELITE CONVENT, where she lived as a nun. Return to Paris for dinner on our own and overnight. (B)

Day 8 (Mon) 28 April – Paris/Paray-Le-Monial/Nevers
Depart today for Paray-Le-Monial. Visit the CHAPEL OF THE APPARITIONS, and where Jesus revealed his Sacred Heart to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque. Also visit the BASILICA OF THE SACRED HEART and celebrate Mass. Continue to Nevers for a visit to ST. GILDARD, where St. Bernadette spent her life as a nun. See the beautiful and miraculously incorrupt body of St. Bernadette. Overnight and dinner in Nevers. (B,D)

Day 9 (Tue) 29 April – Nevers/Chartres/Paris
Stop today in Chartres and visit the CATHEDRAL, one of Europe's most celebrated shrines and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Then, visit the ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SHRINE, where you can see the reliquary of the saint who has inspired thousands of charities and volunteers. In the evening enjoy a farewell dinner at a local restaurant followed by an ILLUMINATION DRIVE where you will discover why Paris is called the "City of Light", a vision to last a lifetime. (B,D)

Day 10 (Wed) 30 April – Paris/JFK Intl Airport
After attending Mass, and some leisure time—flight permitting, the group will be transferred to the airport for our flight home. Arrival the same day. (B)
