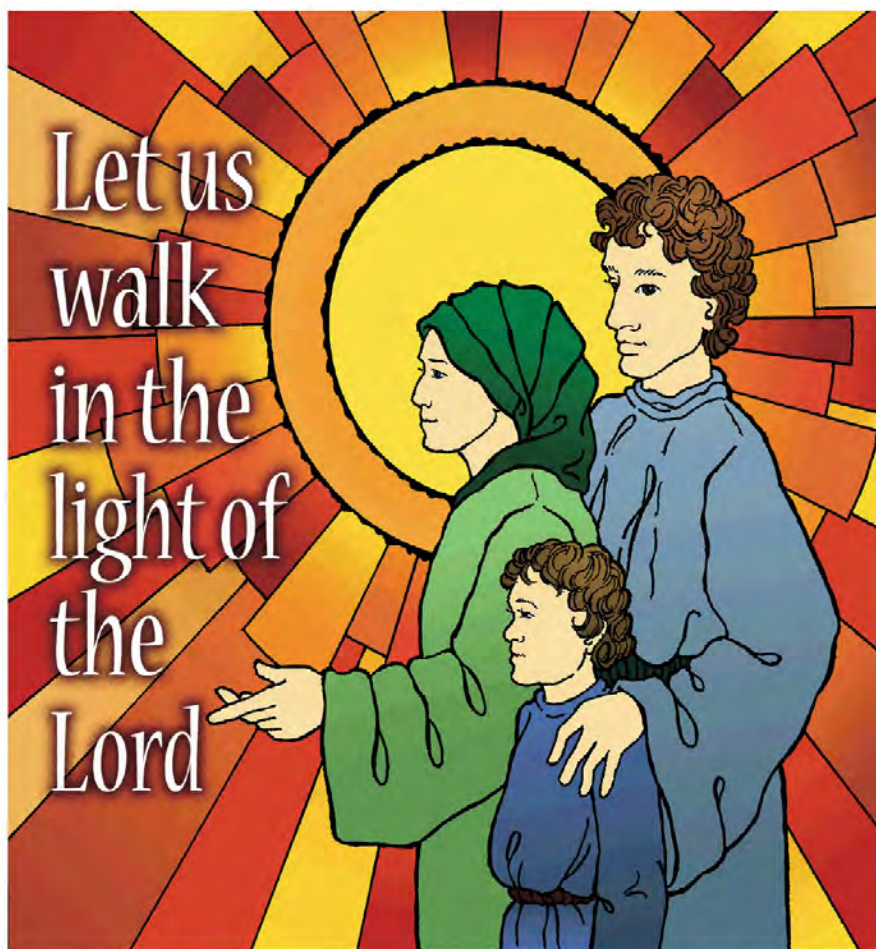

Grades 7-12: we need lots of help—musicians, singers, organizers and assistant directors.

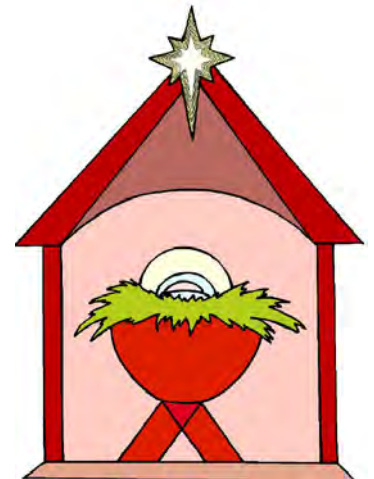
Pageant Practices for All:

Pilgrimage to Lourdes and Shrines of the Sacred Heart

Join our Pastor, Father Michael Vetrano, as he leads the *Basilica Parish of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus & Mary*, on a pilgrimage of faith to France. Come, be spiritually strengthened & renewed.

ITINERARY

Day 1 (Mon) 21 April – Depart JFK
Depart JFK Intl Airport on your overnight flight to France.

Day 2 (Tue) 22 April – Toulouse/Lourdes
Upon arrival in Toulouse transfer to Lourdes and check into the hotel. Mass this evening and Dinner. (D)

Day 3 (Wed) 23 April – Lourdes
Start the day attending the international Mass at the Basilica of St. Pius X. Then, join a Local Guide for a walking tour including visits to Our Lady of Lourdes Shrine and St. Bernadette's birthplace and family home. You may wish to experience the powerful healing baths or attend the "Blessing of the Sick" or mass at the Crux Gloriosa Chapel. Visit the Grotto where the Virgin Mary appeared to St. Bernadette in 1858. Join this evening's memorable Rosary and Candlelight Procession, held every night. Dinner and overnight in Lourdes. (B,D)

Day 4 (Thu) 24 April – Lourdes
Today is set aside for personal exploration, devotions and reflections in this most peaceful and scenic hamlet, made sacred by Our Lady's appearance and revered by the faithful. Re-visit the Grotto, immerse yourself in the Healing Baths or pickup keepsakes. Tonight is the last opportunity to take part in the Candlelight Procession. Dinner and overnight. (B,D)

Day 5 (Fri) 25 April – Lourdes/Paris
Enjoy time at leisure this morning. In the afternoon the group travels to Paris aboard the high-speed TGV TRAIN to Paris. Food and snacks are available on the train. Once in Paris the evening is yours to settle in. (B)

Day 6 (Sat) 26 April – Paris
Sightseeing with a Local Guide features the Arc de Triomphe, Louvre, Champs-Elysées, and the Eiffel Tower. Visit the BASILICA OF SACRE COEUR on Montmartre Hill. A special visit has been included to OUR LADY OF THE MIRACULOUS MEDAL SHRINE, where the Virgin Mary appeared to St. Catherine Laboure in 1830. Later, the architectural wonders of NOTRE DAME CATHEDRAL. Dinner and overnight in Paris. (B,D)

Day 7 (Sun) 27 April – Paris/Lisieux/Paris
Travel to Lisieux and visit LES BUISSONNETS, family home of St. Therese. Afterwards, visit the BASILICA. St. Therese was known as "The Little Flower" and for her charming autobiography *The Story of a Soul*. Next, visit ST. PETER'S CATHEDRAL, where her family attended Mass, and the CARMELITE CONVENT, where she lived as a nun. Return to Paris for dinner on our own and overnight. (B)

Day 8 (Mon) 28 April – Paris/Paray-Le-Monial/Nevers
Depart today for Paray-Le-Monial. Visit the CHAPEL OF THE APPARITIONS, and where Jesus revealed his Sacred Heart to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque. Also visit the BASILICA OF THE SACRED HEART and celebrate Mass. Continue to Nevers for a visit to ST. GILDARD, where St. Bernadette spent her life as a nun. See the beautiful and miraculously incorrupt body of St. Bernadette. Overnight and dinner in Nevers. (B,D)

Day 9 (Tue) 29 April – Nevers/Chartres/Paris
Stop today in Chartres and visit the CATHEDRAL, one of Europe's most celebrated shrines and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Then, visit the ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SHRINE, where you can see the reliquary of the saint who has inspired thousands of charities and volunteers. In the evening enjoy a farewell dinner at a local restaurant followed by an ILLUMINATION DRIVE where you will discover why Paris is called the "City of Light", a vision to last a lifetime. (B,D)

Day 10 (Wed) 30 April – Paris/JFK Intl Airport
After attending Mass, and some leisure time—flight permitting, the group will be transferred

La Corona de Adviento - La “Corona de Adviento” o “Corona de las luces de Adviento” es un signo que expresa la alegría del tiempo de preparación a la Navidad. Por medio de la bendición de la corona se subraya su significado religioso. La luz indica el camino, aleja el miedo y favorece la comunión. La luz es un símbolo de Jesucristo, luz del mundo. El encender, semana tras semana, los cuatro cirios de la corona muestra la ascensión gradual hacia la plenitud de la luz de Navidad. El color verde de la corona significa la vida y la esperanza. La corona de Adviento es, pues, un símbolo de la esperanza de que la luz y la vida triunfarán sobre las tinieblas y la muerte. Porque el Hijo de Dios se ha hecho hombre por nosotros, y con su muerte nos ha dado la verdadera vida. (*Bendicional*, 1235-1237).

Draw yourself walking down God's path with the light of baptism on your shoes.

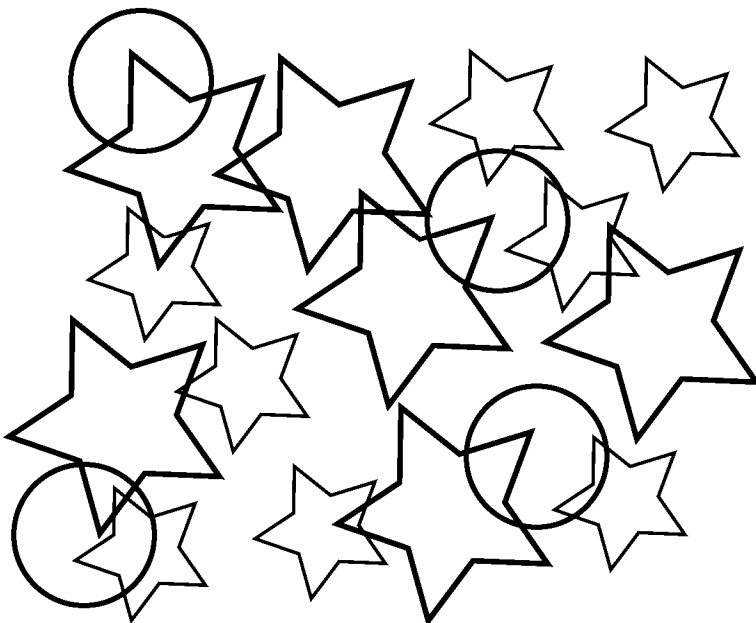
Mission for the Week:
