Pastor's Letter

January 11/12

Two Baptisms

Dear Parish Family,

Many people find today's feast, the Baptism of the Lord, a difficult one to understand. After all, if baptism is about forgiveness and purification, then it is hard to imagine anyone less in need of baptism than Jesus. Why would he go out to the Jordan for John's baptism of repentance? The answer to this explains why the Baptism of the Lord marks the end of the Christmas season, an end that is really a beginning.

First of all, it is important to remember that God's participation in human life, the incarnation of Jesus, is a voluntary expression of love. The Scriptures tell us that in Christ God emptied himself of divinity to embrace our humanity. The sense of paradox here is deliberate, for as St. Paul tells us in the second letter to the Corinthians: "For our sake God made him who did not know sin to be sin, so that we might become the righteousness of God in him." Here St. Paul is talking about how fully Jesus shared in our humanity in order to restore our closeness to God.

More importantly, the scene of Jesus' baptism is not an end but the beginning of his public ministry. He will be a teacher and the voice of God coming from the cloud tells everyone that they should listen to him! In short, John's baptism is being taken immediately to a higher level. It might be helpful to remember that our associations of baptism are different from that of the people living at the time of Jesus. When we think of baptism we think mainly of water. The ancient Jews shared this association and that is why John's baptism with water is a sign of cleansing and refreshment. But unlike ourselves, Jesus' disciples might also think of a baptism with fire. A baptism that was purifying, clarifying, and most importantly energizing. This is why the symbol of Pentecost is the descent of tongues of fire on the disciples. They are now baptized into the resurrection of Jesus and receive the energy of discipleship. At the Jordan River the baptism with water by John immediately opens into a new baptism. Jesus is baptized into the fire, the energy, of God. You are my beloved!

These two baptisms have much to say about our life as Christians. It is true enough to say that Christianity is a rejection of sin and wrong, but that is not enough. Christianity is also the embrace of what is good — with the energy and the power of the Spirit. When adults renew their baptismal promises, there are three questions about the rejection of sin and three questions about belief in God and in the church. Baptism with water and baptism with fire. Not only what we renounce but more importantly, what we embrace.

Pope Francis has recently challenged his priests and all Catholics to be defined, not only or primarily by what we are against, but more powerfully by the good that we want to do. Remember, the first Christians were identified as followers because of their actions. See how they love one another.

A New Sound System :: Coming Soon to SHJM

I have some wonderful news for you this week. Our parish has received a grant from the Dreams R. Us foundation to completely renew the sound system in our church! This foundation provides resources for programs that offer opportunities to families and young people. I explained that our parish music program is a key ministry keeping our young people involved in church. The grant, for \$45,000, will cover new speakers, microphones, amplifiers, and all associated accessories. It will also include outdoor speakers for the front of our church and for rear entrance to the church. We hope to have work completed in time for Lent!

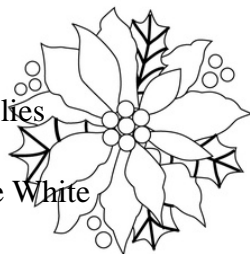

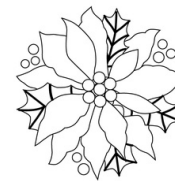

Pilgrimage to Lourdes and Shrines of the Sacred Heart

APRIL 21 – APRIL 30, 2014



Join our Pastor, Father Michael Vetrano, as he leads the *Basilica Parish of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus & Mary*, on a pilgrimage of faith to France. Come, be spiritually strengthened & renewed.

ITINERARY

Day 1 (Mon) 21 April – Depart JFK
Depart JFK Intl Airport on your overnight flight to France.

Day 2 (Tue) 22 April – Toulouse/Lourdes
Upon arrival in Toulouse transfer to Lourdes and check into the hotel. Mass this evening and Dinner. (D)

Day 3 (Wed) 23 April – Lourdes
Start the day attending the international Mass at the Basilica of St. Pius X. Then, join a Local Guide for a walking tour including visits to Our Lady of Lourdes Shrine and St. Bernadette's birthplace and family home. You may wish to experience the powerful healing baths or attend the "Blessing of the Sick" or mass at the Crux Gloriosa Chapel. Visit the Grotto where the Virgin Mary appeared to St. Bernadette in 1858. Join this evening's memorable Rosary and Candlelight Procession, held every night. Dinner and overnight in Lourdes. (B,D)

Day 4 (Thu) 24 April – Lourdes
Today is set aside for personal exploration, devotions and reflections in this most peaceful and scenic hamlet, made sacred by Our Lady's appearance and revered by the faithful. Re-visit the Grotto, immerse yourself in the Healing Baths or pickup keepsakes. Tonight is the last opportunity to take part in the Candlelight Procession. Dinner and overnight. (B,D)

Day 5 (Fri) 25 April – Lourdes/Paris
Enjoy time at leisure this morning. In the afternoon the group travels to Paris aboard the high-speed TGV TRAIN to Paris. Food and snacks are available on the train. Once in Paris the evening is yours to settle in. (B)

Day 6 (Sat) 26 April – Paris
Sightseeing with a Local Guide features the Arc de Triomphe, Louvre, Champs-Elysées, and the Eiffel Tower. Visit the BASILICA OF SACRE COEUR on Montmartre Hill. A special visit has been included to OUR LADY OF THE MIRACULOUS MEDAL SHRINE, where the Virgin Mary appeared to St. Catherine Laboure in 1830. Later, the architectural wonders of NOTRE DAME CATHEDRAL. Dinner and overnight in Paris. (B,D)

Day 7 (Sun) 27 April – Paris/Lisieux/Paris
Travel to Lisieux and visit LES BUISSONNETS, family home of St. Therese. Afterwards, visit the BASILICA. St. Therese was known as "The Little Flower" and for her charming autobiography *The Story of a Soul*. Next, visit ST. PETER'S CATHEDRAL, where her family attended Mass, and the CARMELITE CONVENT, where she lived as a nun. Return to Paris for dinner on our own and overnight. (B)

Day 8 (Mon) 28 April – Paris/Paray-Le-Monial/Nevers
Depart today for Paray-Le-Monial. Visit the CHAPEL OF THE APPARITIONS, and where Jesus revealed his Sacred Heart to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque. Also visit the BASILICA OF THE SACRED HEART and celebrate Mass. Continue to Nevers for a visit to ST. GILDARD, where St. Bernadette spent her life as a nun. See the beautiful and miraculously incorrupt body of St. Bernadette. Overnight and dinner in Nevers. (B,D)

Day 9 (Tue) 29 April – Nevers/Chartres/Paris
Stop today in Chartres and visit the CATHEDRAL, one of Europe's most celebrated shrines and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Then, visit the ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SHRINE, where you can see the reliquary of the saint who has inspired thousands of charities and volunteers. In the evening enjoy a farewell dinner at a local restaurant followed by an ILLUMINATION DRIVE where you will discover why Paris is called the "City of Light", a vision to last a lifetime. (B,D)

Day 10 (Wed) 30 April – Paris/JFK Intl Airport
After attending Mass, and some leisure time—flight permitting, the group will be transferred to the airport for our flight home. Arrival the same day. (B)

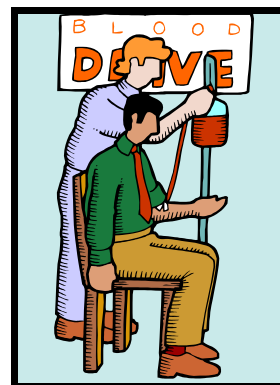

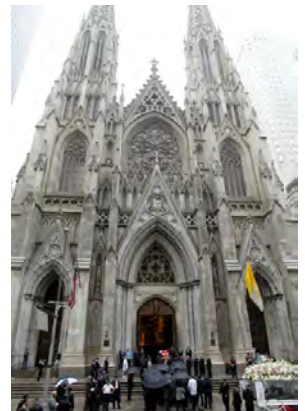

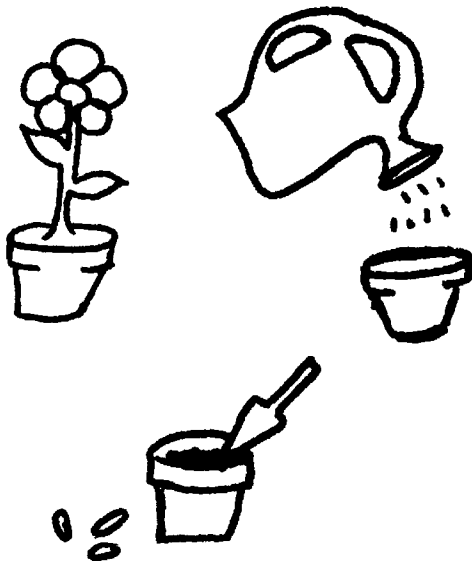
