Pastor's Letter

January 18/19

Seeing God

Dear Parish Family,

A number of years ago when I was completing my graduate studies in moral theology, I would often attend scholarly conferences. I particularly enjoyed the annual meeting of the Society of Christian Ethics. Truthfully, the best part of the meeting was the chance to connect with all those people with whom I went to school. My former classmates were now teaching and working in universities far from our Fordham home. But I also enjoyed the talks and especially the chance to meet some of the pivotal scholars who wrote the books we read and studied.

One year I particularly remember a session given on the work of the Jesuit priest Richard McCormick. The panelist and audience argued about what he thought, what he said, what he meant in the pages of his well-known articles and books. At one point Fr. McCormick snuck in to the back of the room. He was not expected to attend the session and most people did not notice his arrival.

During a particularly heated exchange about what his thought was on a particular issue, Fr. McCormick broke his anonymity. "Why don't you just ask me?" he said. And then he told the audience how amusing it was to listen to them debate what he thought about the issues at hand.

I often think about that conversation when I find myself talking about God! Is God, like Fr. McCormick, in the back of the room, listening with amusement as we argue about him? Does he want to jump out of the shadows and tell us what he, our God, really thinks?

In the Gospel today, John the Baptist confesses that Christ was in the world but he did not know him. The very author of life was present in our world but was not recognized and not heard. The same inspiration which reveals Jesus as God's son tells John to look for the signs of the Spirit, the places where God is giving life.

The disciples once complained to Jesus that they wanted to stop people from healing because they, unlike the 12, were not chosen by Christ. Jesus will have none of it. Anyone who is helping, serving, giving life belongs to the kingdom of God. Without regard to their nationality, their religion, their background – where there is life and love, there is God.

We all seem to enjoy our conversations and debates about God. Religion and politics are the two most dangerous and interesting dinner topics of conversation! But God has made things simple for us. Where is God? What does God think? God is everywhere that love is. God thinks about compassion, forgiveness, and healing. These things make God visible.

When that happens, we can see our God laughing at our passionate debates. He cares about only one thing: that we see our God in every act of love and in every gesture of compassion.


Father Michael Vetrano was the celebrant of the liturgy prepared by the sixth grade class and their teacher, Mrs. Danielle Almansa.

ITINERARY

Day 1 (Mon) 21 April – Depart JFK
Depart JFK Intl Airport on your overnight flight to France.

Day 2 (Tue) 22 April – Toulouse/Lourdes
Upon arrival in Toulouse transfer to Lourdes and check into the hotel. Mass this evening and Dinner. (D)

Day 3 (Wed) 23 April – Lourdes
Start the day attending the international Mass at the Basilica of St. Pius X. Then, join a Local Guide for a walking tour including visits to Our Lady of Lourdes Shrine and St. Bernadette's birthplace and family home. You may wish to experience the powerful healing baths or attend the "Blessing of the Sick" or mass at the Crux Gloriosa Chapel. Visit the Grotto where the Virgin Mary appeared to St. Bernadette in 1858. Join this evening's memorable Rosary and Candlelight Procession, held every night. Dinner and overnight in Lourdes. (B,D)

Day 4 (Thu) 24 April – Lourdes
Today is set aside for personal exploration, devotions and reflections in this most peaceful and scenic hamlet, made sacred by Our Lady's appearance and revered by the faithful. Re-visit the Grotto, immerse yourself in the Healing Baths or pickup keepsakes. Tonight is the last opportunity to take part in the Candlelight Procession. Dinner and overnight. (B,D)

Day 5 (Fri) 25 April – Lourdes/Paris
Enjoy time at leisure this morning. In the afternoon the group travels to Paris aboard the high-speed TGV TRAIN to Paris. Food and snacks are available on the train. Once in Paris the evening is yours to settle in. (B)

Day 6 (Sat) 26 April – Paris
Sightseeing with a Local Guide features the Arc de Triomphe, Louvre, Champs-Elysées, and the Eiffel Tower. Visit the BASILICA OF SACRE COEUR on Montmartre Hill. A special visit has been included to OUR LADY OF THE MIRACULOUS MEDAL SHRINE, where the Virgin Mary appeared to St. Catherine Laboure in 1830. Later, the architectural wonders of NOTRE DAME CATHEDRAL. Dinner and overnight in Paris. (B,D)

Day 7 (Sun) 27 April – Paris/Lisieux/Paris
Travel to Lisieux and visit LES BUISSONNETS, family home of St. Therese. Afterwards, visit the BASILICA. St. Therese was known as "The Little Flower" and for her charming autobiography *The Story of a Soul*. Next, visit ST. PETER'S CATHEDRAL, where her family attended Mass, and the CARMELITE CONVENT, where she lived as a nun. Return to Paris for dinner on our own and overnight. (B)

Day 8 (Mon) 28 April – Paris/Paray-Le-Monial/Nevers
Depart today for Paray-Le-Monial. Visit the CHAPEL OF THE APPARITIONS, and where Jesus revealed his Sacred Heart to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque. Also visit the BASILICA OF THE SACRED HEART and celebrate Mass. Continue to Nevers for a visit to ST. GILDARD, where St. Bernadette spent her life as a nun. See the beautiful and miraculously incorrupt body of St. Bernadette. Overnight and dinner in Nevers. (B,D)

Day 9 (Tue) 29 April – Nevers/Chartres/Paris
Stop today in Chartres and visit the CATHEDRAL, one of Europe's most celebrated shrines and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Then, visit the ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SHRINE, where you can see the reliquary of the saint who has inspired thousands of charities and volunteers. In the evening enjoy a farewell dinner at a local restaurant followed by an ILLUMINATION DRIVE where you will discover why Paris is called the "City of Light", a vision to last a lifetime. (B,D)

Day 10 (Wed) 30 April – Paris/JFK Intl Airport
After attending Mass, and some leisure time—flight permitting, the group will be transferred to the airport for our flight home. Arrival the same day. (B)




