Pastor's Letter

February 8/9

A Life Lived in God's Friendship

Dear Parish Family,

One of the best retreats I have ever made was a retreat called a Cursillo and I made it in my senior year of college. It is a weekend retreat, actually a short course in Christianity, and hence the name "cursillo" which means "little course." Most talks are given by ordinary people who have made the course themselves. One of the most moving is a talk on grace, which is called Living Life in God's Friendship. Much of the talk is about our humanity and how being close to God and being vulnerable enough to be close to people are really two sides of the same coin.

I was thinking of that phrase on Tuesday as we celebrated Mass for Mary "Queenie" Gilmartin. She was 105 years old at the time of her death. Now being 105 is pretty impressive in itself, but more impressive and inspirational is how she lived those years. She truly lived a life in God's friendship. Whether she was attending the 8:00 AM. Mass every weekend, saying the rosary every night with her family, or receiving the sacraments at home, she was filled with joy. I visited her last week just a few days before her death. As she received the sacraments of anointing and communion, she told me of her great love for her Catholic faith and for the sacraments that brought her close to God. It was wonderful to hear someone so clearly and simply express her love for God and for the church.

Queenie paid a lot of attention to details. Every day she dressed up in her skirt, sweater, and pearls! It was as if she expected a very important visit or special occasion to happen at any moment. And of course that was her entire sense of people. Everyone was important. Every moment was special. At her wake, her family and friends spoke of how she loved them and how she received them with joy, patience, and respect. As a true matriarch, she presided over her family with great love. I think this is how God must watch over us. Everything and everyone is seen. But more importantly, everything and everyone is equally loved. Don't get me wrong — she was smart and she had her opinions — but love was the center. Some of us were loved in celebration, some in consolation, some for healing, some for strength. But always loved.

Our beautiful Basilica church has some strong and wonderful pillars that hold it up. But every pastor knows that it is really people who are the pillars. Queenie was one of the strongest and most beautiful of all. People like her help us to understand the great commandment: that our love for God and love for people is one and the same.

I am most thankful for this wonderful life lived in God's friendship.



The celebration of Catholic Schools Week at OLH featured many events that highlighted the interaction for the student community with the Diocese, community and parent communities. After a very well-attended Pancake Breakfast the upper grade students competed in the annual oratorical contest, with eighth grader Isabella Sorgi and fifth grader John Allen emerging as the first place winners.

One hundred-eighty grandparents braved the snowy weather and celebrated Grandparents' Day with their families and were entertained by the Hamptones and Tap Dance team. The special liturgy was celebrated by Bishop Robert Brennan of the Diocese of Rockville Centre, who then joined the faculty for lunch and toured the building.

The week ended with Class Color Day and Kerboomka, a special cardio-dance class for the entire school, led by Kershel Anthony.

The pre-registration period for admission to Our Lady of the Hamptons Regional Catholic School is now open for inquiry, interviews and application leading toward admission for September 2014. Early applications are advised for the pre-school, kindergarten and grades 1-5. Actual acceptance letters will be sent on February 7. Consideration is being given to opening the OLH Pre-school at the Southampton campus (if there is sufficient registration) in September 2014. The decision will be made prior to March 1. Prospective families are asked to call now for information.

Looking ahead to the 2014-2015 school year, OLH will see the completion of the new classroom extension to the Wellness Center that will house the expanded high school prep program for grades six through eight, as well as the upgrading of the technology program and continued showcasing of its Fine Arts program. High school prep study skills and expanded foreign language will be offered along with Regents programs in Integrated Math and Biology . ITINERARY

Day 1 (Mon) 21 April – Depart JFK
Depart JFK Intl Airport on your overnight flight to France.

Day 2 (Tue) 22 April – Toulouse/Lourdes
Upon arrival in Toulouse transfer to Lourdes and check into the hotel. Mass this evening and Dinner. (D)

Day 3 (Wed) 23 April – Lourdes
Start the day attending the international Mass at the Basilica of St. Pius X. Then, join a Local Guide for a walking tour including visits to Our Lady of Lourdes Shrine and St. Bernadette's birthplace and family home. You may wish to experience the powerful healing baths or attend the "Blessing of the Sick" or mass at the Crux Gloriosa Chapel. Visit the Grotto where the Virgin Mary appeared to St. Bernadette in 1858. Join this evening's memorable Rosary and Candlelight Procession, held every night. Dinner and overnight in Lourdes. (B,D)

Day 4 (Thu) 24 April – Lourdes
Today is set aside for personal exploration, devotions and reflections in this most peaceful and scenic hamlet, made sacred by Our Lady's appearance and revered by the faithful. Re-visit the Grotto, immerse yourself in the Healing Baths or pickup keepsakes. Tonight is the last opportunity to take part in the Candlelight Procession. Dinner and overnight. (B,D)

Day 5 (Fri) 25 April – Lourdes/Paris
Enjoy time at leisure this morning. In the afternoon the group travels to Paris aboard the high-speed TGV TRAIN to Paris. Food and snacks are available on the train. Once in Paris the evening is yours to settle in. (B)

Day 6 (Sat) 26 April – Paris
Sightseeing with a Local Guide features the Arc de Triomphe, Louvre, Champs-Elysées, and the Eiffel Tower. Visit the BASILICA OF SACRE COEUR on Montmartre Hill. A special visit has been included to OUR LADY OF THE MIRACULOUS MEDAL SHRINE, where the Virgin Mary appeared to St. Catherine Laboure in 1830. Later, the architectural wonders of NOTRE DAME CATHEDRAL. Dinner and overnight in Paris. (B,D)

Day 7 (Sun) 27 April – Paris/Lisieux/Paris
Travel to Lisieux and visit LES BUISSONNETS, family home of St. Therese. Afterwards, visit the BASILICA. St. Therese was known as "The Little Flower" and for her charming autobiography *The Story of a Soul*. Next, visit ST. PETER'S CATHEDRAL, where her family attended Mass, and the CARMELITE CONVENT, where she lived as a nun. Return to Paris for dinner on our own and overnight. (B)

Day 8 (Mon) 28 April – Paris/Paray-Le-Monial/Nevers
Depart today for Paray-Le-Monial. Visit the CHAPEL OF THE APPARITIONS, and where Jesus revealed his Sacred Heart to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque. Also visit the BASILICA OF THE SACRED HEART and celebrate Mass. Continue to Nevers for a visit to ST. GILDARD, where St. Bernadette spent her life as a nun. See the beautiful and miraculously incorrupt body of St. Bernadette. Overnight and dinner in Nevers. (B,D)

Day 9 (Tue) 29 April – Nevers/Chartres/Paris
Stop today in Chartres and visit the CATHEDRAL, one of Europe's most celebrated shrines and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Then, visit the ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SHRINE, where you can see the reliquary of the saint who has inspired thousands of charities and volunteers. In the evening enjoy a farewell dinner at a local restaurant followed by an ILLUMINATION DRIVE where you will discover why Paris is called the "City of Light", a vision to last a lifetime. (B,D)

Day 10 (Wed) 30 April – Paris/JFK Intl Airport
After attending Mass, and some leisure time—flight permitting, the group will be transferred to the airport for our flight home. Arrival the same day. (B)

Reflections on the Gospel from Pax Christi February 9th, 2014

“You are the light of the world,” Jesus tells us in today’s Gospel. What an affirming message! But wait. There’s more: “Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and give glory to God.” If my light were to shine, what good works would it reveal? And what does it take to make my light shine? Isaiah gives us an answer: “If you take away from the midst of you the yoke, the pointing of the finger, and speaking wickedness, if you pour yourself out for the hungry and satisfy the desire of the afflicted, *then shall your light rise in the darkness and your gloom be as the noon day.*” Oh, my! Another challenge to our faith. But then, if Jesus says we are the light of the world, we must have the ability to be just that. Let us strive to be all that Isaiah describes, and let the light emanate from us so that God may indeed be glorified.

Los Discípulos Son Sal'y Luz' - Sin el discípulo cristiano, comprometido a dar de comer al hambriento y llevarle esperanza a los que se desesperan, el mensaje cristiano desaparece. La pasividad no es propia de los discípulos de Jesús. Por el contrario, los discípulos cristianos se involucran en la acción como una respuesta personal al don de la fe y de la misericordia que reciben de Dios. 


