Pastor's Letter

Supporting the CMA

April 5/6

Dear Parish Family:

2013 was a landmark year of our parish and its participation in the Catholic Ministries Appeal. We reached our goal for the first time in many years and actually exceeded our goal by more than \$10,000.00! This was not only good news to the ministries served by the appeal but also good news for our parish. Our participation brought more than \$16,000 back to us for use in our own ministries.

I mention the success of the 2013 appeal, not as a matter of boasting, though I am proud of and grateful for your generosity, but to say that I think our parish has grown in its understanding of how important the appeal is to the neediest people on Long Island. Last year our committee did much to educate us about those who are served by the appeal, and our parish, as always, responded. I have noticed that whether it be tragedies in our own country or storms on the other side of the world, we are always the first to step forward.

But human need does not always happen suddenly or tragically. They do not always garner the attention of every news network. More often it is about day to day kinds of problems, suffering, and ordinary needs. These needs, the needs of our fellow parishioners and Long Islanders, are the needs served by the Catholic Ministries Appeal.

When I think of the appeal I think of a disabled or elderly man or woman living in a Catholic Charities residence – like the Bishop Ryan Village next door. I think of the young person attending a state university who is glad to have a Catholic chaplain to talk to and to celebrate the sacraments. Or a man in the seminary responding to the call to priesthood or diaconate. These will not be on tonight's news – but their needs, both spiritual and temporal, are met by your response to the appeal.

You can make a tremendous difference in someone's life! Please take a moment to prayerfully consider renewing or even increasing your support. Over 150 families have already contributed and we are already nearly 1/3 of the way to our goal. Your gift, of course, is a personal decision and I only ask that you be guided by your own circumstances and by the needs of your Catholic community here on Long Island.

Remember that your pledge to the appeal is payable over the next ten months. A gift of just \$2.50 a week will add up to a \$100 pledge! Thank you for taking the time to prayerfully consider your support for the Catholic Ministries Appeal. I am grateful for your thoughtful generosity.

Fasting and Abstinence in Lent

Lenten Fast and Abstinence

•All Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 inclusive, are also bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday—to limit themselves to one full meal and two smaller meals (which do not together equal a full meal) on each of those days. Water may be taken at any time.

Penance

•The obligation to do penance and to observe the penitential seasons is a serious one. Those whose health or work would be impaired are excused from fast and abstinence, and individuals' consciences should guide them in this matter. However, no one should hold himself lightly excused, and another penitential practice should be substituted by those who cannot fast or abstain. A more serious reason is considered necessary to opt out of the observances on Good Friday and Ash Wednesday than for the other Fridays of Lent.

Easter Duty

•All of the faithful who have received First Holy Communion are obliged to receive the Eucharist at least once a year, normally during the Easter Season—a period which in the United States extends from the first Sunday of Lent to Trinity Sunday.


Permisos: Si viven afuera de la zona servida por el Apostolado Hispano, necesitan una carta de su párroco dándonos permiso para bautizar su hijo.


