Pastor's Letter

May 24/25

Known But to God

Dear Parish Family,

If you want to understand what our country is all about there is perhaps no better place to learn than to visit Washington DC. The beautiful public buildings contain not only the day to day business of government but also many pictures and inscriptions of the ideas and philosophy which gave birth to our nation.

It is a place that I love to visit and I have my own favorite route. I love to walk from the steps of the Capitol down past the Air and Space Museum, across to a particularly wonderful statue of Albert Einstein at the National Academy of Sciences, on to the Vietnam Memorial where I visit the name of my cousin Jerry, past the Washington Monument and then to the Lincoln, Jefferson, Martin Luther King and FDR Memorials around the Tidal Basin. It is a good walk for sure and if I have the energy I like to walk across the bridge to Arlington to a place that always seems most moving – the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier.

It is a place of great solemnity and dignity, guarded by a single sentinel who walks a post day and night in every season. This special place was dedicated in 1921 with the remains of a soldier from World War I. It now contains remains of unknown soldiers from World War II, Vietnam, and Korea. The simple inscription over these graves reads:

HERE RESTS IN
HONORED GLORY
AN AMERICAN
SOLDIER
KNOWN BUT TO GOD

This last line seems most important. What lends the ultimate dignity to these soldiers' sacrifice is that God knows. Memorial Day is a day to honor those who have made the ultimate sacrifice for their nation, its people, and its values. It is also a day to think about what is most important in our lives. It is easy for all of us to let life get out of perspective and to allow trivial things, even trivial things about ourselves, seem very important. These things will all be forgotten. But some parts of our lives will be remembered. Certainly by the people we love and who love us – but most importantly by God.

If you have a moment on Memorial Day come join us for 9 AM Mass to give thanks for all those who have served this beautiful nation.



This Thursday is Ascension Thursday, A holy day of obligation. Mass will be celebrated on Wednesday evening at 7:00 PM and on Thursday at 8:00 AM and 12 Noon.

A History of the Catholic Church : June 9 and June 16 With George Sim Johnston

Over the course of two evenings, we shall look at the history of the Catholic Church, from the Age of the Apostles and Martyrs until Vatican II. To know the history of the Church during these two millennia is virtually to know the history of western Europe (and beyond).

The first evening, we shall look at the Church's founding by Jesus Christ, the early spread of Christianity, the Roman persecutions, Constantine and the Edict of Milan, the theological debates that were resolved at the great ecumenical councils, the collapse of the Roman Empire, the great transitional figure of Saint Augustine, the rise of Islam, the Dark Ages, and the great awakening which began in western Europe at the cusp of the second millennium.

The second evening, we shall begin with the "springtime" of western civilization, the age of the great cathedrals and reforming popes like Gregory VII, the Crusades, the clash between the papacy and the German emperors, the golden age of Scholasticism, Saints Dominic and Francis, the Black Death, the Great Schism, the popes of the Renaissance, the Protestant revolt, the remarkable flowering of sanctity and missionary activity known as the Counter-Reformation, the ages of Louis XIV, the French Revolution and Napoleon, and the Church's remarkable recovery in the 19th century under popes like Pius VII and Leo XIII. We shall end with the Church's engagement with the modern world, which continues to unfold under Pope Francis.

June 21 to July 4 Fortnight For Freedom



May 25 2014




In today's second reading, St. Peter writes, "Always be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope...." But before anyone can ask that question, there is another: "Are you hopeful?" If not, the real question might be, "Why not?" Another one could be, "Shouldn't you be hopeful? After all, you're a Christian!"

In today's world, it can be very hard to hold onto hope. It can seem like the political, economic, and social systems are all designed to serve the few and deny the vast majority. But we *are* Christians, and in our faith lies our hope. If we truly believe in God's unconditional love and limitless mercy, in Jesus's conquest over death, then we have reason for hope. Can we show it?

5. Draw or paint 2 eyes on top of the clothes pin for the eyes if you wish.


For extra fun, put a strip of magnetic tape on the back and display your butterfly on the refrigerator.
Or simply tie it to the string of your blinds so it can be flying around your window.


