Pastor's Letter

The Great Realization

Pentecost 2014

Dear Parish Family,

The cover of this week's bulletin offers an insightful image of what it means to celebrate Pentecost. On one hand the image is familiar; the Spirit descends like fire from the risen Christ who still bears the wounds of his crucifixion. On the other hand the artist depicts the twelve disciples as representing all the people of the earth in their diversity of cultures. This is a legitimate interpretation because the twelve disciples symbolize all of God's people (the twelve tribes of Israel), and the description of this first Pentecost in the Acts of the Apostles describes how the many witnesses to the descent of the Spirit are also the diverse nations who surround Israel. These neighbors, who are usually divided by language and culture, now suddenly understand the Spirit-filled disciples as if they were their own kin.

We often speak of Pentecost as the beginning of the church. This is not the same as speaking of the beginning of a particular church, as in the beginning of Sacred Hearts as a parish on August 30, 1908. It is also not the same as thinking of the beginning of a particular religion. It is rather the beginning of the great realization that if God is truly one, then every nation and every people belong to that God. The roots of this realization were already within Judaism in the great commandment: Hear O Israel, the Lord your God is God alone, and you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and all your soul, and all your strength. Jesus says that another commandment is equal to it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself.

Although the Jewish people, including the disciples, recited these prayers each day, it was difficult for them to think that the prayer bound them to people beyond their own religion and culture. On Pentecost, the Spirit of God was liberated so they could see that the God they love belongs not just to them, or to their family, or to their nation, but to all. This good news itself is the first message to share in this new global church.

In our own life as Christians, anything we do that helps us reach beyond our ordinary boundaries celebrates this Pentecost Spirit. We see it when we are able to embrace, rather than fear, diversity of cultures and language. We see it in our own community when we worship together, rich and poor, weak and strong, men and women, saints and sinners. On Pentecost may we celebrate the great realization that we are one, just like our God!

A History of the Catholic Church : June 9 and June 16 With George Sim Johnston at 7 PM in our Church



Over the course of two evenings, we shall look at the history of the Catholic Church, from the Age of the Apostles and Martyrs until Vatican II. To know the history of the Church during these two millennia is virtually to know the history of western Europe (and beyond).

The first evening, we shall look at the Church's founding by Jesus Christ, the early spread of Christianity, the Roman persecutions, Constantine and the Edict of Milan, the theological debates that were resolved at the great ecumenical councils, the collapse of the Roman Empire, the great transitional figure of Saint Augustine, the rise of Islam, the Dark Ages, and the great awakening which began in western Europe at the cusp of

the second millennium.

The second evening, we shall begin with the "springtime" of western civilization, the age of the great cathedrals and reforming popes like Gregory VII, the Crusades, the clash between the papacy and the German emperors, the golden age of Scholasticism, Saints Dominic and Francis, the Black Death, the Great Schism, the popes of the Renaissance, the Protestant revolt, the remarkable flowering of sanctity and missionary activity known as the Counter-Reformation, the ages of Louis XIV, the French Revolution and Napoleon, and the Church's remarkable recovery in the 19th century under popes like Pius VII and Leo XIII. We shall end with the Church's engagement with the modern world, which continues to unfold under Pope Francis.



Reflections On the Gospel from Pax Christi

June 8, 2014



It is the Feast of Pentecost, a day to celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit given to all of us. It is a reminder that Jesus did not abandon us. It is a lesson that we are all one. Yet, we often fail to celebrate, remember, or learn.

It is also Torture Awareness Month. Sadly, torture still exists, denying the Spirit in each of us and rejecting our unity in the Spirit. As the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops wrote: “Torture violates the basic dignity of the human person that all religions, in their highest ideals, hold dear. It degrades everyone involved—policymakers, perpetrators and victims.... Nothing less is at stake in the torture abuse crisis than the soul.” While Jesus may not have abandoned us, we abandon others when we allow torture to happen.

We also support religious education for children, spiritual and education development for lay leaders and prayer groups and continuing adult faith formation.






