# Pastor's Letter

## The Triune God and Us

June 14/15, 2014

Dear Parish Family,

The doctrine of the Trinity, the mystery we celebrate this weekend, is one of the most intellectually complicated in all of Christianity. It has been the subject of almost as much explanation and interpretation as the mystery of suffering. At the heart is the question of how a people who are monotheist and who insist that their God is one, can at the same time believe that this God involves three distinct persons. The history of this belief and its evolution is a fascinating part of the development of our church and maybe one day I will teach a class on it – but not today, and certainly not in this short column.

Those of us who have studied theology can easily get lost in this kind of topic. What always brings me back to earth is a simple truth that I learned long ago in my studies: every truth of our faith is important to our life and living. There is no such thing as intellectual curiosity in Christianity. Every truth of our faith says something important about our living. What then does the mystery of the Trinity have to do with our life and living as Christians and human beings? Or to put it more simply, what difference does it make that our one God is three?

One answer to this question has to do with whether it is better to live alone or in community with others. Most of us have days where the world of others around us, the world of family, friends, neighbors, and co-workers becomes so complicated that we start to think serious thoughts of that desert island or cabin in the woods. We wonder if it would be better, if we would be happier, if we dealt with only our own world instead of the complexities of all these relationships. More seriously, we might be tempted to think that we really do not need others to challenge our thoughts, our ideas, our perceptions, and our values. In reality, no human being gets to live this way. We are never singular. We live within the plurality of other persons. And we are clearly made this way. Even if we do get to spend this time apart from others, we find ourselves longing for that human interaction.

Sometimes we imagine that God is singular, that the thoughts, feelings, will, and power of God are not affected by anything or anyone. In other words God gets to be singular and powerful while we are stuck with plural and dependent! The doctrine of the Trinity says that this is not true. The very inner being of God involves a relationship of Father, Son, and Spirit. When we read the history of God's people in the Bible we read about a God who is completely affected by all that concerns humanity. We read about a God who like us is delighted and inspired, disappointed and saddened by us. A God who listens to and answers prayers.

The Trinity is our faith that the complex mystery of relationships that is part and parcel of human life does not belong only to us humans – it belongs also to God.

## A History of the Catholic Church : June 9 and June 16 With George Sim Johnston at 7 PM in our Church



Over the course of two evenings, we shall look at the history of the Catholic Church, from the Age of the Apostles and Martyrs until Vatican II. To know the history of the Church during these two millennia is virtually to know the history of western Europe (and beyond).

The first evening, we shall look at the Church's founding by Jesus Christ, the early spread of Christianity, the Roman persecutions, Constantine and the Edict of Milan, the theological debates that were resolved at the great ecumenical councils, the collapse of the Roman Empire, the great transitional figure of Saint Augustine, the rise of Islam, the Dark Ages, and the great awakening which began in western Europe at the cusp of

the second millennium.

The second evening, we shall begin with the "springtime" of western civilization, the age of the great cathedrals and reforming popes like Gregory VII, the Crusades, the clash between the papacy and the German emperors, the golden age of Scholasticism, Saints Dominic and Francis, the Black Death, the Great Schism, the popes of the Renaissance, the Protestant revolt, the remarkable flowering of sanctity and missionary activity known as the Counter-Reformation, the ages of Louis XIV, the French Revolution and Napoleon, and the Church's remarkable recovery in the 19<sup>th</sup> century under popes like Pius VII and Leo XIII. We shall end with the Church's engagement with the modern world, which continues to unfold under Pope Francis.

## Reflections On the Gospel from Pax Christi June 15, 2014



In today's first reading, Moses invites God to accompany the people whom he describes as “stiff-necked” and in need of God's pardon. In the second reading, St. Paul tells the Corinthians to mend their ways. In the Gospel, St. John assures us that God loves us despite our faults and, to prove it, sent Jesus to save us. God only asks one thing: that we believe. Thus, let us ask ourselves: Do I believe? How might I mend my ways? Using St. Paul's advice, do I need to encourage others more, be more agreeable, live more peacefully? Let's give it a try.

# A Statement from Timothy Cardinal Dolan and the Bishops of NYs

*Calling on Governor Cuomo and Leaders in Albany: Don't Let Us Down*

More than 200 Catholic schools have closed in the last 15 years throughout New York State, as families and parishes, who strongly believe in the value of Catholic education, struggle to keep up with increasing costs. Many of our public schools also desperately need help.

To address these needs, the NYS Catholic Bishops joined a broad coalition of faith groups, community organizations and labor unions backing legislation called the **Education Investment Tax Credit**. The measure would encourage increased charitable donations to generate more private scholarships as well as additional resources to public schools. It also helps all teachers provide needed materials and supplies for every classroom in New York.

The vast majority of legislators support the bill. Why? It's because the legislation will help all children, regardless of where they go to school. It's a win-win for all families!

Although Governor Cuomo assured us he would fight to include the proposal in the state budget, in the end, we were left out.

As the legislative session ends in Albany this coming week, we pray that Governor Cuomo won't let us down. We ask that you join us in that prayer. Pray that Governor Cuomo will put children ahead of politics and fight for the Education Investment Tax Credit.


