Pastor's Letter

Jesus' Cross and Ours

September 13/14

Dear Parish Family,

This past Thursday we celebrated the anniversary of the terrorist attacks of 2001. One of the most touching sights of the day the towers fell in New York City were the ground zero crosses. As over 100 stories of structural steel collapsed, many of the broken pieces took the shape of crosses and often ended up standing upright in the piles of debris. Many of the rescue workers began to refer to the site as God's house. For believers, it was impossible not to notice the connection between the symbol of our faith and the broken pieces of steel.

9/11 was, and continues to be, difficult to cope with. The terrible loss of life and suffering was hard to even imagine. These ground zero crosses gave many people hope. In them we saw a statement that God is with us, and that God is present even in the most difficult places we can imagine. There is a human tendency to feel alone and abandoned in times of great sorrow, and so it is particularly important to hold onto the belief that God is with us in our suffering. Even more than that, we believe that God is not just with us but that God will lift us up from these sufferings. The crosses at 9/11 not only reminded us of God's presence but also of the great assurance that God would lift up the victims, those who loved them, and even the world within which such violence lives.

It is not often that the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross falls on a Sunday. When it does, the celebration takes priority over our regular sequence of Sunday prayers and readings. I am particularly grateful this year for the celebration because the past weeks have brought so much suffering to our attention. From the plight of refugee children abandoned at our borders to violence against Christians in Iraq, racial violence in our own country and threats of ISIS terror, the news each night brings us seemingly endless accounts of inhumanity and suffering. The cross seems so common, too common, in our world.

This weekend we are invited to believe that the power of God and the love of God are especially present in places where God seems to be most absent. More than that, we are invited to stand in solidarity with those who suffer, to help them in both spiritual and practical ways. As we celebrate the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, may we know God's presence in the crosses in our lives and in our world.

Unfortunately, we continue to crucify God's gifts of ceaseless love in a multitude of ways. One is our abuse of creation that is altering the global climate and threatening life, especially that of the poor. The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops stated: "Urgent action that both addresses the growing impact of climate change and acts to protect the poor and vulnerable is needed ("Global Climate Change," February 2010).

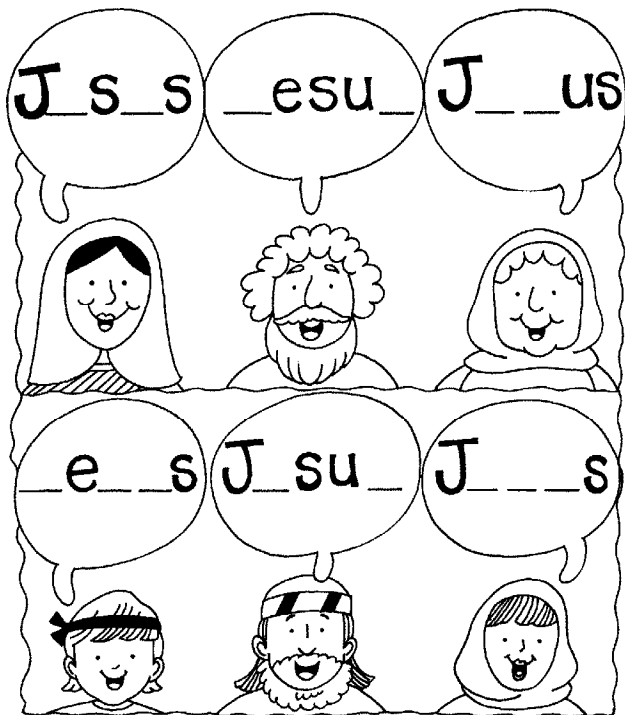

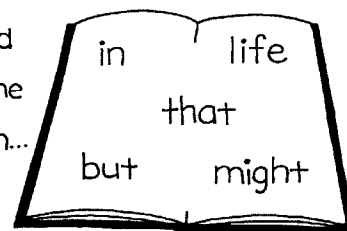

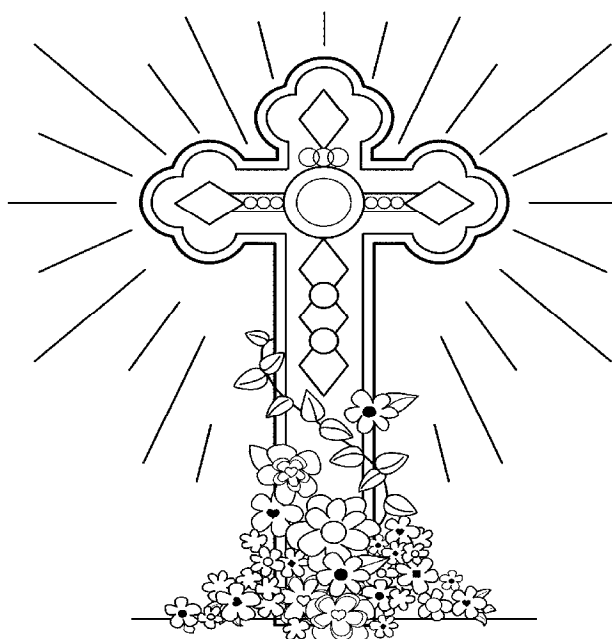

THE HOLY CROSS

A symbol is something we see or hear or do that means something important to people. The cross is a symbol that is hard to understand. In the time of Jesus it was used to punish criminals. Jesus died this shameful death on the cross. But today we celebrate the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. An older name for this feast is the Triumph of the Cross. "To triumph" means to be victorious or to succeed or to overcome. Jesus triumphed over death and sin so we could live with him forever. Try to count the number of crosses in your church. How many of them have an image of the body of Jesus on them? Those crosses are called crucifixes.

Many different kinds of crosses can be found in churches and holy places around the world. Some of them are described here. Trace or draw the crosses on your own sheet of paper. Write a prayer under each one thanking God for the great love Jesus gives us.



This is the Calvary cross.
