## Reaching Our Goal

Dear Parish Family,

It was a cool summer but one thermometer moved steadily up – the one at our doors marking the progress of our In Nomine Domini renewal. We had a great start and by mid July our total stood at more than \$200,000. Since then the pledges have continued to arrive and I am happy to announce to that, as of this week, we have \$620,000 pledged to the renewal. That means we are just \$380,000 from our goal. My hope is that we can reach our goal by Thanksgiving! That would be such a benefit to the parish because the work that needs to be done could then be planned and begun over the winter and spring. Wouldn't it be wonderful to know that next summer will be cool and quiet in our church regardless of the temperature!

Please take a look at the list of families who have participated in our renewal. They are thanked in the center of this bulletin. You will see that there are about 180 participating from our parish of almost 1500 families. The key for us is clear. We need broad and generous participation.

We need to make our goal and we can do it if we have parishioners participating at every level. Those who are able to contribute at the founder's level provide giant steps toward the goal and encourage others to see that it is possible. Twenty parishioners contributing at the In Nomine Domini level, gifts of \$10,000 or more, will cut the remainder in half. If even half of our parish can participate at the stewardship or supporters level, with average gifts between \$1000 and \$5000, we will surely reach our goal. And of course, remember that every gift, large or small, is a step toward our goal.

Over the next weeks I will be reaching out and inviting as many people as I can to participate. If you would like to join our In Nomine Domini committee and help us reach out to the community, please drop me a note or email or give the rectory a call. I can really use your help.

I know that these are not easy gifts to make but I am so impressed by the spirit of care for our church. I am truly humbled to see folks of ordinary means who are clearly making a sacrifice to be part of this effort.

Reaching our goal will be great. It will be even better if every person has had a share in our efforts to preserve the heritage and build the future of our beautiful church.

## Reflections On the Gospel from Pax Christi September 21, 2014



This Sunday, September 21<sup>st</sup>, is the UN International Day of Peace. It is a day for all nations and peoples to cease hostilities and dedicate their time to education and public awareness on issues related to peace. This Friday, September 26<sup>th</sup>, is the UN International Day for the Total Elimination of Nuclear Weapons. It is a day for the world community to reaffirm its commitment to global nuclear disarmament as a high priority, to educate the public—and their leaders—about the real benefits of eliminating such weapons, and the social and economic costs of perpetuating them. Pope Francis brings these two important days together when he says: “Nuclear weapons in particular ... should not exist. Let us place the human person, men and women, boys and girls, at the center of our efforts for disarmament. What meaning do peace, security and stability have, if our societies, our communities and our families live in constant fear and destructive hatred? Let us make room for reconciliation, hope, love which are expressed in commitment for the common good, in international cooperation to aid the weakest among our brothers and sisters, in order to implement policies based on our common dignity, in service to a necessarily common future” (Pope Francis, 6/23/14).

Sunday's Gospel tells the familiar story of the landowner who pays his workers equally regardless of how many hours they have worked. While most of us may agree that seems unfair in the context of most work, just think how wonderful it would be if we all accepted the invitation to be peacemakers whether we come into it early or late!

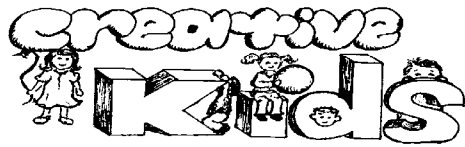

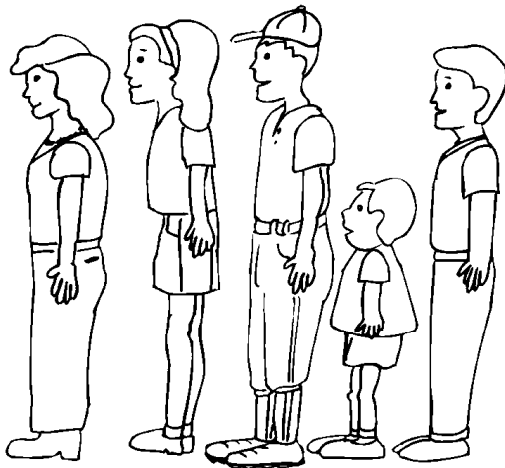
