Pastor's Letter

September 27/28

Believing in Peace

Dear Parish Family,

Next week we celebrate the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi. Francis is revered for his kindness and for his ability to see all of God's creation as one. Everyone will tell you that he blessed the beauty of the created world and spoke of the sun and moon as brother and sister. We enjoy his respect for animals and our favorite images of Francis depict him holding and feeding these shy and fearful creatures. Even they recognize the man of peace. One of the most delightful celebrations in our parish is our annual blessing of animals — a chance to bring that special pet to church, or at least the great lawn, for a blessing. It is such great fun.

But Francis was more than just great fun. He knew the tensions and tragedies of human life and labored to bring peace to those difficult places. He called death his sister and prayed that those who die would find peace in doing God's will. And, of course, he prayed that he and we might sow love in fields of hate and forgiveness in the wounded places of injury. I think our world needs Saint Francis' inspiration today.

We are living in a time where peace is threatened. The news seems to get worse and worse in the Middle East, and the long standing plight of immigrants, refugees, and racism is still poignantly with us. Fear results from injustice and oppression. It is not surprising, then, that under the stress and strain of these fears, people begin to turn their thoughts away from peace and toward the despair of violence.

What would Francis tell us to do? What is the work of a church in this complicated world? We have no more concrete answers and solutions than anyone else but there is something we have that should not be hidden or unspoken. We believe. We believe in peace. We believe in the power of peace. We believe that peace is real, and possible, and most of all — it is what God wants.

This week we are invited to pray for peace in our world and especially in the Middle East. Prayers might seem powerless compared to weapons and conflict, but I don't think any of us would say I believe in weapons and conflict.


What would Francis say? Where there is hatred, let me sow love. Where there is injury, let me sow pardon. Now that takes faith.




Resurrection Prayer Group





Reflections On the Gospel from Pax Christi September 28, 2014



“God’s gifts of reconciliation, unity and peace are inseparably linked to the grace of conversion, a change of heart, which can alter the course of our lives and our history, as individuals and as a people.” (*Pope Francis celebrating Mass in South Korea, August, 2014*)

In his words and his presence, Pope Francis showed us the importance of peace in and with Korea. Pax Christi Metro New York, in collaboration with the Fellowship of Reconciliation and Veterans for Peace, continues to shine a light on Korea with a special UN International Peace Day event, *Ending U.S. War in Korea: from Armistice to Peace.* Often forgotten is the fact that the Korean War has never officially ended. This presentation will examine the Forgotten War’s continuing impact on Koreans and Americans, including the troubled history of US-Korean relations, the rising costs of the Korean War, and the increasing nuclear threats. John Kim, International Fellowship of Reconciliation’s Representative to UN and Coordinator of Veterans for Peace-Korea Peace Campaign, will combine PowerPoint and video to help us gain greater knowledge and understanding of the situation.

Curso: Para bautizar a su hijo, es necesario que los padres y padrinos asistan al curso pre-bautismal.






