Pastor's Letter

The Rejected Stone

October 4/5

Dear Parish Family,

Just about every longtime parishioner has told me proudly how our church is built from the stones which were rejected in the building of the New York City Public Library. So not long after beginning my assignment here, during a trip to the city, I made it a special point to walk past the library where those other stones, the chosen stones, found their place after coming here from Vermont. I guess I wanted to see what they looked like, these brother and sister stones of our parish church.

In the clear evening light, especially on these early fall days, it is hard to believe that anything could be as shining bright as the marble of our church. But when I looked closely at the library I understood why some stones were rejected. In midtown every block is perfect. No streaks of grey, no lines or marks or weathered cracks. Each piece is perfect, pure and white, a perfect match to those on either side. Maybe in a way, I thought, too perfect.

Coming home, I looked more closely at our church. Our blocks each have their issues. They are all so different in color and texture. Some are smooth and others weathered and scored by the glaciers that formed them. But somehow, when these rejected stones are put together, they look beautiful, strong, and perfect. I love them for that. They remind me of us.

It seems right to me that a church should be built from rejected stones. In this week's Gospel Jesus tells his disciples about his coming rejection and reminds them: *The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone; by the Lord has this been done, and it is wonderful in our eyes.*

In other words, God will do something wonderful with our brokenness and with the brokenness of our world. The church is a refuge. It is a place where the homeless, the poor, and the stranger are always welcome. The church is not the dwelling place of worthy saints, but an equal home to saint and sinner alike. Most of all, the church reminds us that broken imperfect pieces can be built into a strong and secure dwelling.

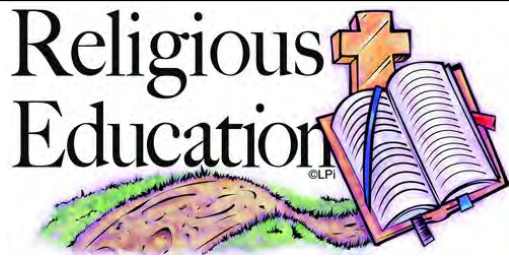

Grief doesn't magically end at a certain point after a loved one's death. Reminders often bring back the pain of loss. Here's help coping – and healing.

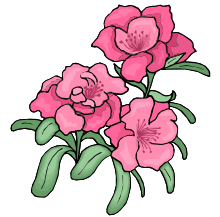

Reflections On the Gospel from Pax Christi October 5, 2014



Those of us who have heard this Sunday's Gospel over the years probably have understood it to be about a group of ruthless tenant farmers denying a landowner his rightful produce. But what if we look at it another way. We all know how it feels to do the work and see our employer reap the profit. By no means does that justify violence, but let's be humble enough to admit we're not necessarily so different in our indignation from those tenant farmers. So could it be that Jesus was not defending the landowner or condemning the laborers, but telling all of us that we have been entrusted with God's fertile ground to cultivate it according to Jesus's example: to share the harvest equitably, to insure that all have enough to eat, a safe place to sleep, a job with just pay, quality health care, and a clean environment? Let us accept our place in the vineyard and bear much fruit, so that, as St. Paul wrote to the Philippians, the God of peace will be with us.

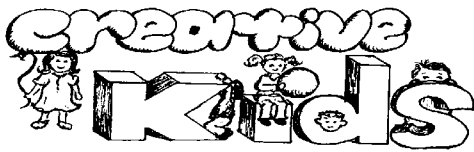

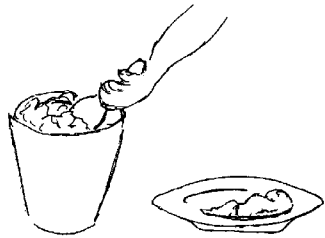

 3. Enjoy!



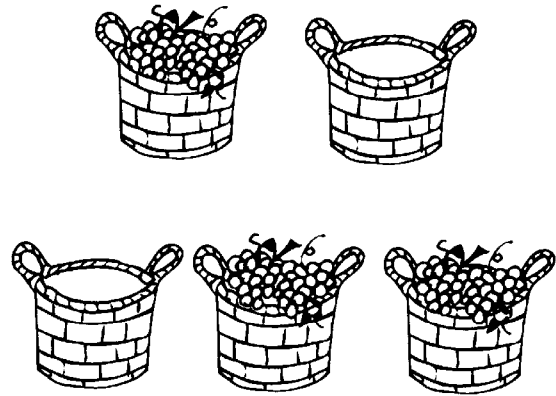

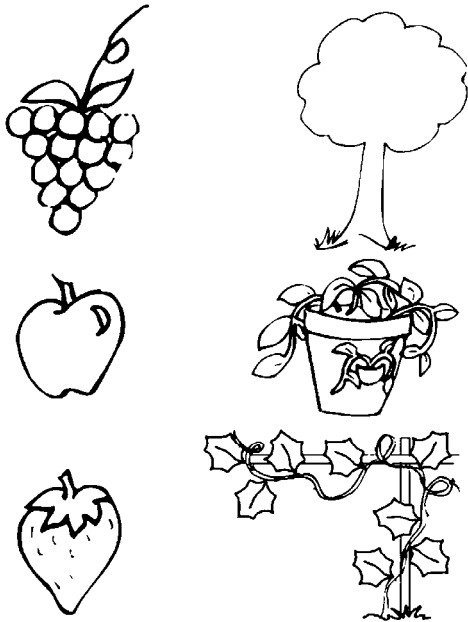
