## Pastor's Letter

## Voting: Do Your Homework

November 1/2

Dear Parish Family,

In just a couple of days you and I will have the opportunity to vote. It is a privilege which is often taken for granted but is a hallmark of American government and life. We each have a moment in the privacy of the voting booth to speak our mind about who will govern and how we will be governed. Are we ready for that day?

I have a good friend who I consider to be an exemplary citizen and Christian when it comes to voting. He does all his own research and is little swayed by the media ads that swamp us at election time. He researches voting records, attends live debates, and takes every opportunity to educate himself about the issues behind the candidates and referendums. He is never one of those people who looks at the election day ballot as if they are seeing it for the first time. I sometimes ask his opinion on candidates and issues and he always has the same reply: "Well, you have to do your homework."

This is a part of citizenship that Americans often forget. We have the right and responsibility to do our homework. Only when we do that can we intelligently vote for the people who will lead us and will support the issues that reflect our values. It is easy to let ourselves be influenced by campaign ads, polls, and various efforts to persuade us. Such lobbying is part of American life, but it can work against our deepest values and commitments. As Christians we are encouraged to value voting as an exercise of conscience and an opportunity as individual believers to stand up for the values of our faith.

Churches and other charitable organizations are not allowed to endorse candidates, but we are allowed to educate people on issues and encourage everyone to do their own homework. There are a number of excellent resources to help you with your homework this fall. Here are a couple I would recommend.

Voting is a right, a privilege, and an important part of being a faithful citizen. I hope you have a visit to the polls planned for this Tuesday and don't forget to do your homework.

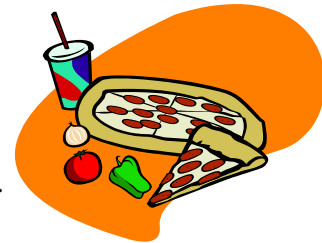

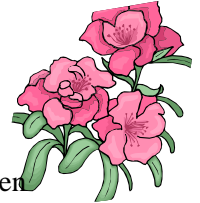
## In Sympathy

## Grief: Coping with reminders after a loss :: A 6-week Bereavement Group

Grief doesn't magically end at a certain point after a loved one's death. Reminders often bring back the pain of loss. Here's help coping – and healing.

When a loved one dies, you might be faced with grief over your loss again and again – sometimes even years later. Feelings of grief might return on the anniversary of your loved one's death, birthday or other special days throughout the year. These feelings, sometimes called an anniversary reaction, aren't necessarily a setback in the grieving process. They're a reflection that your loved one's life was important to you.

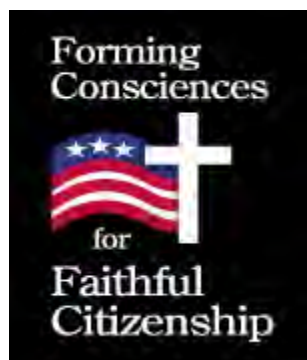

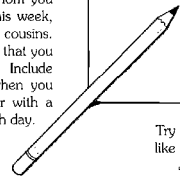
