Pastor's Letter

In Heaven it is Always Autumn

November 8/9

Dear Parish Family,

It seems to me that every month captures something important about our lives. January is about beginnings and September about new beginnings. May is about receiving communion and July and August are for warm days and rest. November, of course, is about gratitude.

Thanksgiving is the obvious connection. We look forward to that day of celebrating our blessings and our being together. It is good to see so many people talking about keeping this as a family day and resisting the temptation to shop. Friday can wait! But there is more to November than Thanksgiving.

November is the month of All Saints and All Souls. It is a month to be grateful for those who have lived their lives well and now celebrate the great banquet in God's kingdom. Take a moment this month to visit our Book of Remembrance and write down the name of someone you love.

It is also the month that brings us to the end of the church year. The Feast of Christ the King on November 23 is the last Sunday of the year. It is a weekend in which we celebrate our Full Gospel Thanksgiving Concert to praise God for all his blessings.

Christmas Pageant preparation is underway please let me know if you would like to help. We can use as many helpers as we can get! Thank you!

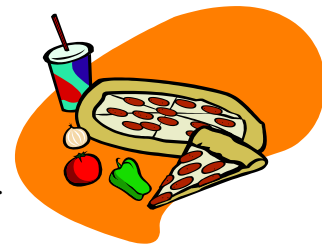

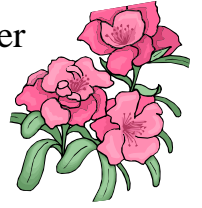
2014 Catechetical Awards

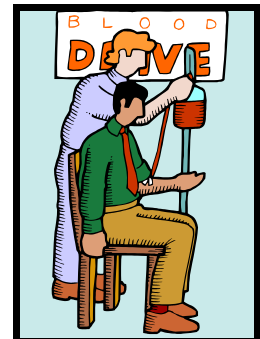

Grief: Coping with reminders after a loss ::

**A 6-week Bereavement Group beginning this
Wednesday November 12 at noon.**



Grief doesn't magically end at a certain point after a loved one's death. Reminders often bring back the pain of loss. Here's help coping – and healing.

When a loved one dies, you might be faced with grief over your loss again and again – sometimes even years later. Feelings of grief might return on the anniversary of your loved one's death, birthday or other special days throughout the year. These feelings, sometimes called an anniversary reaction, aren't necessarily a setback in the grieving process. They're a reflection that your loved one's life was important to you.

To continue on the path toward healing, know what to expect – and how to cope with reminders of loss, a 6 week Bereavement Group will be starting at the Basilica of Sacred Hearts with Deacon Carl Sanfilippo. Anyone interested please call the parish office at 283-0097 Ext 0.

Reflections On the Gospel from Pax Christi October 19, 2014



Why did Jesus get so angry in Sunday's Gospel? Why did he drive out vendors and money-changers who were doing a necessary job? Why did he release animals, overturn tables, and simply make quite a mess of the temple area? There are many answers, ranging from righteous anger over dishonest merchants to religious reverence for God's house, with several others in between. But one that relates well to St. Paul's letter to the Corinthians may get at the heart of the matter: The temple is holy, and we are the temple. The temple (we) are one, without distinction or exclusion because of where we come from, the currency we carry, or our economic status. We are to be nurtured with care, not to be desecrated or destroyed. Jesus indeed overturned the tables, the tables of arrogance, greed, and discrimination. Now it is our turn as God's temple to do the same.

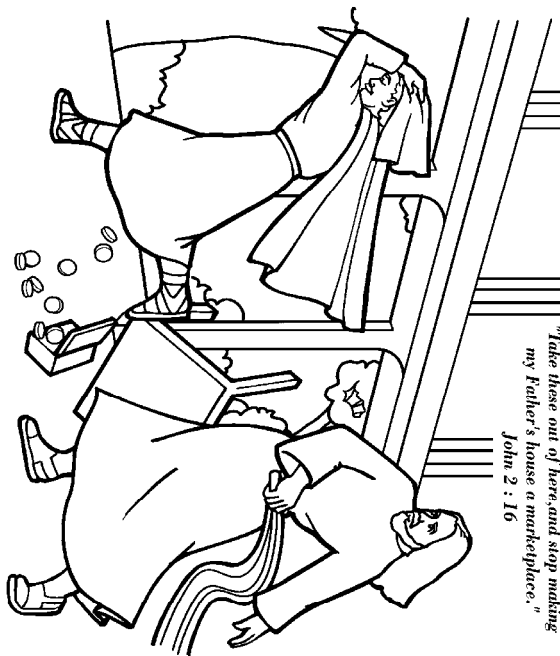
