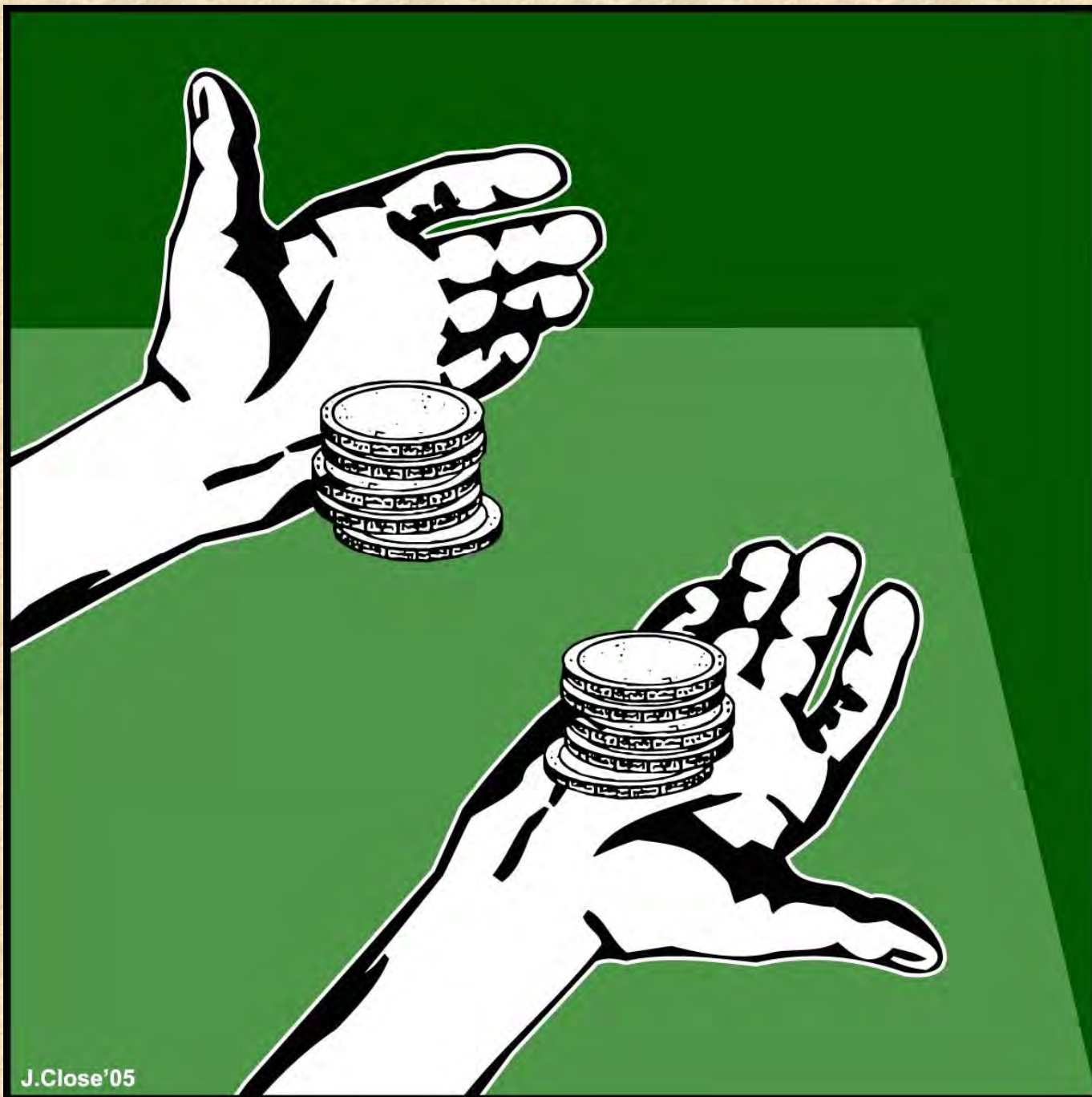

Pastor's Letter

Two Weeks to Go

November 15/16

Dear Parish Family,

At the beginning of November I promised that our In Nomine Domini renewal would end on Thanksgiving. It now looks like we may well reach our goal by that date and may even go a bit over! What wonderful news and I am so grateful to all of our parishioners for making this possible.

Not only have we raised more than \$100,000 this past month, we have also added more than 100 new pledges to our total. We now have more than 400 families participating. This is a remarkable level of participation for our small parish. As of this weekend we have achieved \$940,000 in pledges and \$806,000 had already been paid. We are in excellent shape to begin the process of renovation and renewal.

So please remember that all this is only possible because so many families have decided to help. Gifts large and small are making this happen. With just two weeks to go, it is a great time to take your place among the friends and families who have supported this renewal. Perhaps we can have over 500 gifts by Thanksgiving Day — that would surely put our goal in reach.

Please remember some important points:

- The goal of our stewardship is equal sacrifice, not equal giving. The value of a gift is its meaning to you in terms of the spirit of sacrifice you show toward your church.
- All gifts are fully tax deductible. Some donors have planned a two part payment, now and in the beginning of 2015. This will give a benefit in two tax years.
- Gifts of stocks and appreciated securities can be donated. When such a gift is made the donor will have no capital gains to pay on the securities and will be able to count the value of the shares on day of donation as a charitable gift. Please contact me for more information on these gifts.
- You may give using your credit card either on our pledge card or online. This can be a mutually beneficial way to give.

Thanks so much for the care and support you have given to our beautiful Basilica church. With your help the history of our church will be preserved and we will ensure the future of our church here in Southampton for many years to come.

Grief: Coping with reminders after a loss ::

A 6-week Bereavement Group beginning this Wednesday November 12 at noon.



Grief doesn't magically end at a certain point after a loved one's death. Reminders often bring back the pain of loss. Here's help coping – and healing.

When a loved one dies, you might be faced with grief over your loss again and again – sometimes even years later. Feelings of grief might return on the anniversary of your loved one's death, birthday or other special days throughout the year. These feelings, sometimes called an anniversary reaction, aren't necessarily a setback in the grieving process. They're a reflection that your loved one's life was important to you.

To continue on the path toward healing, know what to expect – and how to cope with reminders of loss, a 6 week Bereavement Group will be starting at the Basilica of Sacred Hearts with Deacon Carl Sanfilippo. Anyone interested please call the parish office at 283-0097 Ext 0.

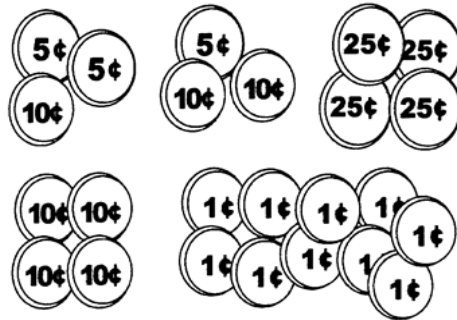
