Pastor's Letter

Spirit of SHJM

November 22/23

Dear Parish Family,

Well, we did it! This week our parish received pledges that have brought us to our goal of \$1,000,000 in our In Nomine Domini renewal! I am so grateful to each and every one of you who have expressed such care for our beautiful church. Yes, I am grateful that we reached our goal, but I am even more grateful for the spirit I have seen in our parish. Let me explain.

I think people have some awareness that asking for generosity is one of the most difficult parts of pastoring. It is difficult because generosity can be a very sensitive topic for people. Some of us are already doing the best we can. There are people who are barely able to meet the basic needs of life and we pastors worry that they will feel pressured by another stress they do not need.

On the other hand, some of us need a little bit of a push, or better yet encouragement, to go a little further in our generosity. That does not make it any easier or more comfortable for either side. In some ways, this is the most basic and important part of being a pastor: to challenge people to grow in every part of their lives.

And all of us need to learn about the S word — sacrifice. Sacrifice is not a popular word but I like to think of it as the thought process that goes on inside when we are trying to help someone or something that is important to us. That kind of thinking is nothing less than inspiring and I have to tell you that I have had some amazing, inspiring moments in the past few weeks.

In this renewal, my favorite moment came when two altar servers, and they would die if I told you their names so I won't, came up to me with money they had scrimped and saved. No, it wasn't the biggest gift we received but their hearts were huge. They proudly told me how their mom explained to them that they were not too young to do something for their church.

There were so many people along the way who wrote a note along with their gift expressing how important their church and their community is to them. I am so grateful to all of you for understanding, for being able to welcome a challenge, and most of all for caring so much for this community.

This Thanksgiving, I am especially grateful for all of you and for the spirit of Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary.

Reflections On the Gospel from Pax Christi November 23rd

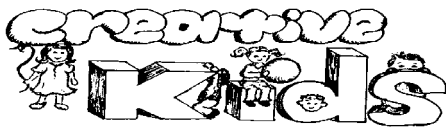

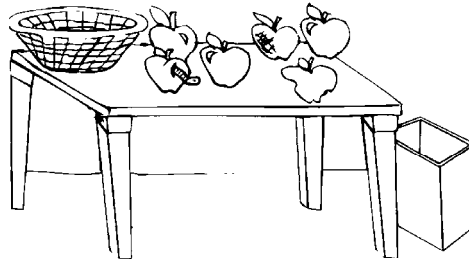
