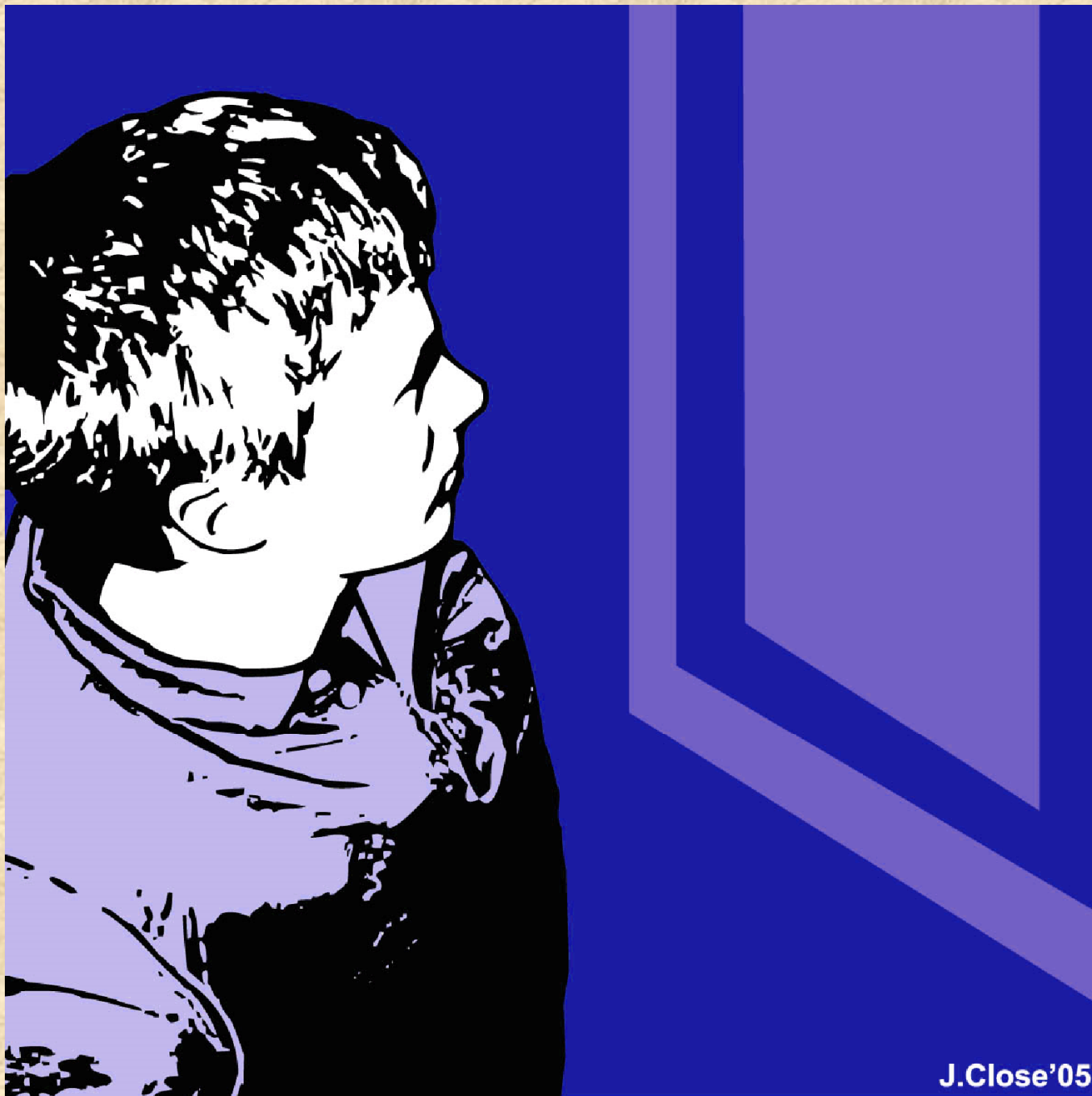

Pastor's Letter

Waiting

November 29/30

Dear Parish Family,

Advent is often called the season of waiting. It is about waiting for Christmas and the birth of Christ. It is about remembering how God's people waited for God to bring them the peace and justice they longed for.

I must admit that in general, waiting is not one of my favorite things. Long stretches in waiting rooms, time between connecting flights, long lines for anything, and slow traffic are all things I can pretty much do without.

But I have also been told that waiting is sometimes essential and that some of the best things in life come only to those who wait. I think they call this delayed gratification. In that department, the winner this year must surely be the European space program whose scientists waited 10 years for their little spacecraft Philae to touch down on the surface of a comet. Everything in that long journey depended on a good landing and the ability to transmit pictures and data back to earth. When the lander ended up in a shadow and lost power, most of the press seemed upset. But not those patient scientists. They said that 80% of the data they hoped for had been gathered and they thought that was pretty good.

The world is full of examples of patient people who did not give up their dreams. Susan B. Anthony began her efforts to protect women's rights to vote in 1850, a journey that was fulfilled in the passing of the 19th amendment in 1920. That is 70 years if you are counting. Martin Luther King took up the dream of racial equality almost 100 years after the civil war ended and our country's journey to lay aside racial prejudice still continues. It makes the comet trip look like a short hop.

We are probably most conscious of the importance of waiting in more personal ways. Some are waiting for a time of trial or suffering to end, for health to return, or a job to be found. Some wait for a life partner to be met or the gift of a child. All these know what it means to be patient and watchful.

In Advent we connect this human patience to the patient, and sometimes impatient, hope for God. Advent is a good time for us to do some thinking about how it is that we are watchful for the revelation of God. In the words of the Gospel: "What I say to you I say to all: Watch!"

Grief: Coping with reminders after a loss ::

A 6-week Bereavement Group meets on Wednesdays at noon.



Grief doesn't magically end at a certain point after a loved one's death. Reminders often bring back the pain of loss. Here's help coping – and healing.

When a loved one dies, you might be faced with grief over your loss again and again – sometimes even years later. Feelings of grief might return on the anniversary of your loved one's death, birthday or other special days throughout the year. These feelings, sometimes called an anniversary reaction, aren't necessarily a setback in the grieving process. They're a reflection that your loved one's life was important to you.

To continue on the path toward healing, know what to expect – and how to cope with reminders of loss, a 6 week Bereavement Group will be starting at the Basilica of Sacred Hearts with Deacon Carl Sanfilippo. Anyone interested please call the parish office at 283-0097 Ext 0.
