Pastor's Letter

January 10/11

All I want for Christmas...

Dear Parish Family,

During the Christmas season our parish received many wonderful donations to our In Nomine Domini renewal. I am so grateful for all of these gifts. I know and believe that behind every gift is a story of love and affection for this church that we are proud to call our spiritual home. So many of you shared stories and memories about Sacred Hearts. Some of you enclosed pictures of weddings, baptisms, and First Communions celebrated here in our church.

I thought you might appreciate hearing about one such gift, a most generous one, from the parishioners of an equally historic and beautiful church, St. Andrew's Dune Church. I discovered the church not long after coming to Southampton. I had walked down to the ocean and headed east along the sand and so my first view of St. Andrew's was literally of it rising above the ocean and the dunes. This past fall I was invited to preach there at a Sunday morning service. What an amazing setting between the land and the sea, a wonderful place to pray.

Just before Christmas, the trustees of St. Andrews sent a gift of \$5,000 to help with our restoration. They wrote that they were proud to claim an association with us and asked God's blessing on our mission and our projects. I have served in many communities across Long Island and such support of one church for another is not such a common thing, but here in Southampton it is typical of our community.

If you think of our own roots, Sacred Hearts was built by a community that valued the hard work and dedication of the mostly Irish immigrants who worked here at the turn of the last century. And again the whole community came together to help in the rebuilding of St. Andrew's after it was damaged in the hurricane of 1938. Working together is more than just about buildings. It is about our care for people and about finding the common ground that brings us together beyond all differences.

What a wonderful, practical, and symbolic gift our friends at St. Andrew's have given to us. What a wonderful and amazing spirit we are blessed with here in Southampton. As we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord today, we are reminded of the Gospel call that the good news be preached to all the nations and communities — Together!

In case of inclement weather please check WLNG radio. If Southampton Schools are closed due to weather Religious Ed will be closed also. Thank you!







Reflections On the Gospel from Pax Christi

January 11, 2015



On Sunday we celebrate the Baptism of Jesus, but why was Jesus baptized? We believe he was sinless and we understand the baptism of John, the Baptist, to be one of repentance. Certainly Jesus didn't need this baptism, so why did he choose it? There are several scholarly answers, as well as Jesus's own: to fulfill all righteousness. Perhaps another answer can be added: Jesus was not only fully divine, but also fully human. Maybe the human Jesus simply desired John's baptism, like his fellow humans. The strength of this answer is in how it links Jesus to us and how it links the mission of Jesus to our own. Could it be that we, too, are called to "bring forth justice to the nations?" Are we, too, meant to do good and heal all those oppressed? Baptism is a gift that carries with it a lot of responsibility. Through baptism God is with us to enable us to meet those responsibilities. May our efforts please God and may we, too, hear God say, "you are my beloved."

church and will explain the various options open to those who were married in the church and now wish to begin a new relationship with the full blessing of the church.





El Bautismo - El sentido y la gracia del sacramento del Bautismo aparecen claramente en los ritos de su celebración. *La señal de la cruz*, al comienzo de la celebración, señala la impronta de Cristo sobre el que le va a pertenecer y significa la gracia de la redención que Cristo nos ha adquirido por su cruz. *El anuncio de la Palabra de Dios* ilumina con la verdad revelada a los candidatos y a la asamblea y suscita la respuesta de la fe, inseparable del Bautismo. En efecto, el Bautismo es de un modo particular "el sacramento de la fe" por ser la entrada sacramental en la vida de fe. Puesto que el Bautismo significa la liberación del pecado y de su instigador, el diablo, se pronuncian uno o varios *exorcismos* sobre el candidato. Éste es ungido con el óleo de los catecúmenos y el candidato renuncia explícitamente a Satanás. Así preparado, puede *confesar la fe de la Iglesia*, a la cual será "confiado" por el Bautismo. El *agua bautismal* es entonces consagrada mediante una oración de epiclesis. La Iglesia pide a Dios que, por medio de su Hijo, el poder del Espíritu Santo descienda sobre esta agua, a fin de que los que sean bautizados con ella "nazcan del agua y del Espíritu". Sigue entonces *el rito esencial* del sacramento: *el Bautismo* propiamente dicho, que significa y realiza la muerte al pecado y la entrada en la vida de la Santísima Trinidad a través de la configuración con el misterio pascual de Cristo. El Bautismo es realizado de la manera más significativa mediante la triple inmersión en el agua bautismal. Pero desde la antigüedad puede ser también conferido derramando tres veces agua sobre la cabeza del candidato. En la Iglesia latina, esta triple infusión va acompañada de las palabras del ministro: "N., yo te bautizo en el nombre del Padre, y del Hijo y del Espíritu Santo." (*Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica §1234-1240*)


Permisos: Si viven afuera de la zona servida por el Apostolado Hispano, necesitan una carta de su párroco dándonos permiso para bautizar su hijo.




