# Pastor's Letter

March 7/8

## Prayers for Deacon Carl

Dear Parish Family,

It has been a little more than two years since Deacon Carl Sanfilippo joined our staff here at Sacred Hearts. He has brought so much life and blessing to our community. Carl is the kind of person who lives out a deep life of faith in a very down to earth way that is full of humanity. He has helped so many of our families prepare for baptism, brought to life the ministry of consolation, and promoted the ministry of hospitality at our weddings.

Right now Carl and his wife Pat are facing a difficult time and really need our prayers.

It was just a year ago that Carl and Pat suffered the sudden loss of their daughter Jennifer who died suddenly in February 2013. I know that Carl and Pat faced this loss with great courage and faith. Carl began a bereavement group to help others facing loss not long after Jennifer's passing. Last year at our Living Stations of the Cross, he spoke beautifully and gave a powerful witness to how our community helped him walk that journey of loss and bereavement.

This past fall, Carl became concerned about feelings of fatigue and weakness. He has been undergoing a series of medical tests since then but has been feeling worse and worse. As a result, Carl has not been able to be with us since just before Christmas. In the last couple of weeks, the doctors have told him that he very likely has amyotrophic lateral sclerosis, a serious and progressive neurological disease which many know as Lou Gehrig's disease. ALS is a difficult disease to diagnose accurately and though serious, it can have a different rate of severity in different people. Needless to say, this has been a very hard diagnosis for his family to receive.

At this time, Carl is taking a break from all the medical visits to spend a week in Florida getting some warmth and a little rest. I know he misses the life of our parish and I have assured him that we will do whatever we can to help him return to a level of ministry that will be good and helpful for him. Until now there has been little we could say because of so much uncertainty. Now Carl has asked me to let everyone know what is happening. On his behalf I also ask you to pray for him and Pat. If you would like to send him a card or message you can do that through the rectory and I will be sure to get those messages to him.

In this season of Lent, let us lift our Deacon Carl and his family up to the compassionate and healing love of our God.

## Reflections On the Gospel from Pax Christi

March 8, 2015



A common image of Jesus is of a gentle, loving, merciful, healer who never gets angry, excited, or unpleasant. Then we read Sunday's Gospel where Jesus explodes, turning over tables and expelling money-changers and vendors from the Temple. Actually, this isn't the only time we see this side of Jesus in the Gospels, but it is probably the most extreme. The explanation is pretty clear, but what is the lesson in it for us? For one, we learn that righteous anger (not *self*-righteous anger) exists. Then we learn that turning over the tables of injustice is something we *should* do. In Jesus's case, we are taught that the injustices he was overturning included desecration of a sacred place and cheating. These could apply to us today, as well, but maybe there is another you'd prefer to choose. Think of all the "isms" like racism, sexism, classism, and ageism. Think of the Ten Commandments in the first reading. The difficulty might be choosing just one. Whichever you choose, let's all put our righteous anger to good use overturning what we know is wrong in God's eyes.

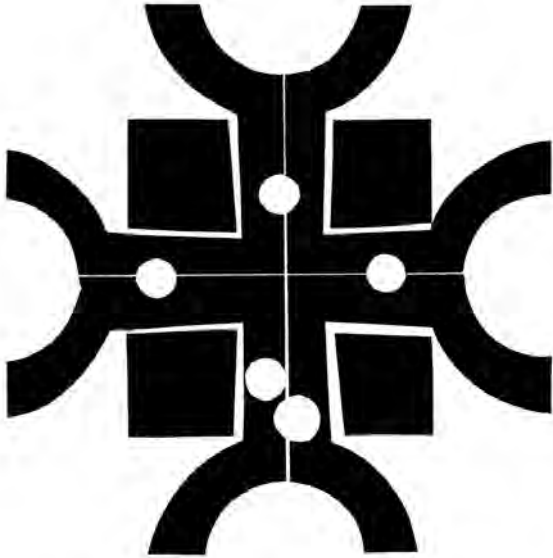

**El Misterio Pascual! Plenitud de los Tiempos, Clave de Redención** - Estamos en el Tercer domingo de Cuaresma y no olvidemos la meta hacia la cual camina esta Cuaresma: es una peregrinación que con Cristo, cargando con su cruz o ayunando en el desierto, va en busca de aquel "consumatum est" -todo se ha cumplido - y, más allá, la gloria de la Resurrección. Todas nuestras angustias como cruces a costas, como ayunos de Cuaresma, van a florecer, queridos hermanos. Por eso no perdamos la perspectiva de la Cuaresma. La gloria del resucitado es también nuestra gloria, nuestra herencia, en la medida en que nos unamos a su esfuerzo liberador en el dolor y en el sufrimiento. El Misterio Pascual es la meta, la muerte y la resurrección de Cristo. La Cuaresma es nada menos que peregrinar al encuentro de ese hecho que le dio el verdadero sentido de la historia de todos los hombres y de cada hombre. Por eso no podemos vivir la Cuaresma y la Semana Santa sin pensar en una implicación de mi vida personal. Como hombre y como pueblo, en su encrucijada actual, no [estamos perdidos]. ...Sabemos que Dios nos ama, como dice el mismo Papa, "Con un amor irreplicable". Es única tu relación con Dios. Dios respeta tu individualidad. Así como te ama como pueblo...Dios tiene designios en esta historia de salvación que nos va recordando en forma de una peregrinación hacia la Pascua, la santa Cuaresma. *Tomado de la Homilía de Mons. **Vía Crucis** - Todos están invitados al Vía Crucis en nuestra basílica todos los viernes de la cuaresma a las 8:00 PM. Esta semana el Grupo de San Jerónimo nos guiará en la devoción.



**Ayuno, Abstinencia y Actos de Penitencia para la Cuaresma:** Los obispos de los Estados Unidos prescriben, como obligación mínima, que todas las personas que han cumplido los catorce años y los mayores de catorce están obligados a abstenerse de comer carne de res, de pollo, de puerco, etc., todos los viernes de cuaresma. Además, todas las personas desde los dieciocho años de edad hasta los cincuenta y nueve años, inclusivos, están obligadas a ayunar limitándose a una sola comida completa el viernes santo, mientras las otras dos comidas en esos días deben ser ligeras.





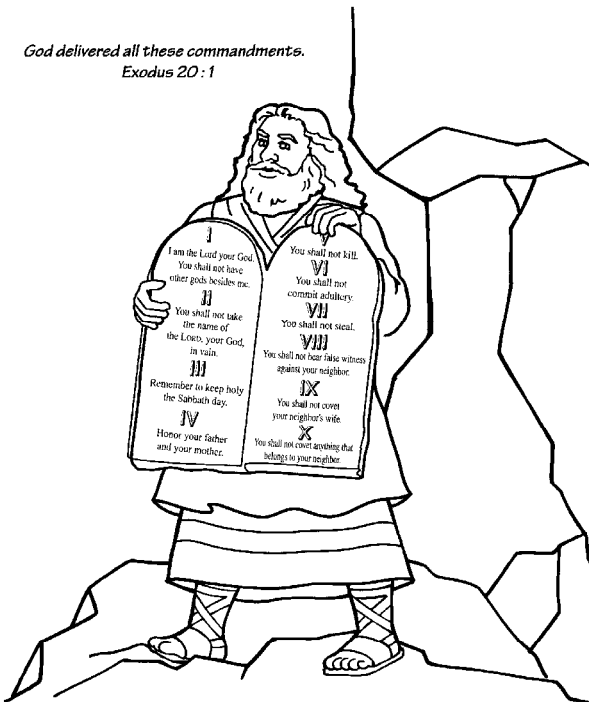

## CATHOLIC CORNER

### LENTEN ALMSGIVING

This Lent we are learning about people who are great models of the Lenten practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Today we will meet a model of almsgiving. As we learn more about him we can practice becoming more like him.

St. Martin de Porres (1579-1639) was a very generous man. The son of a freed black slave and a Spanish nobleman, he grew up in poverty in Lima, Peru. As a young teenager he was taken into a Dominican monastery as a servant. Eventually he became a Dominican brother and served the poor all his life. He cared for sick brothers, and fed the poor of the town each day with leftover food from the monastery. He opened a home for abandoned street children and took in all races and faiths. He planted orchards on unused land and invited the poor to share the figs, olives, and oranges. He even taught them how to care for the orchards. He loved all creatures, even the mice he found in the monastery. He had very little and was always willing to give everything to the poor. What can we learn about almsgiving from Martin?
