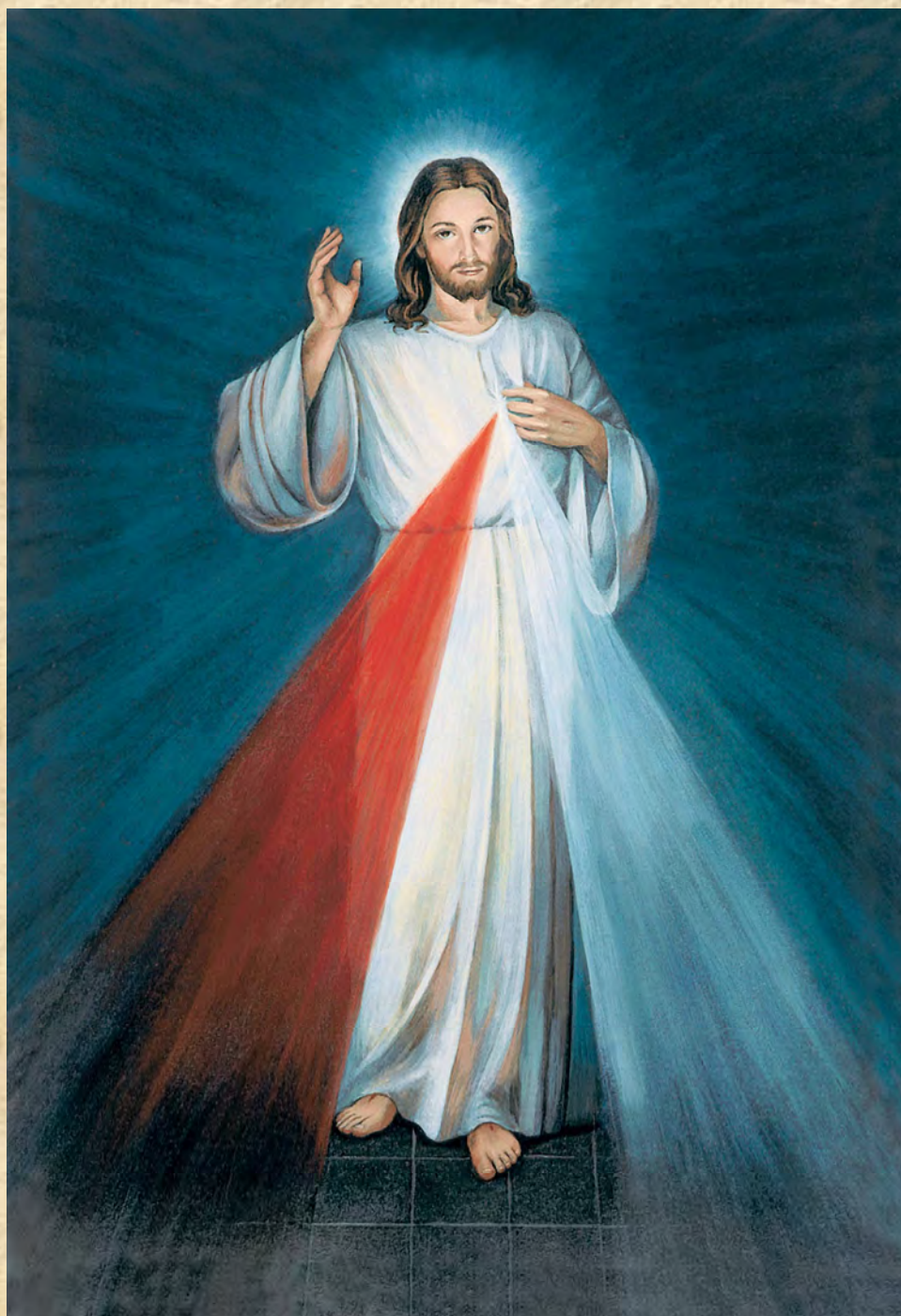

# Pastor's Letter

April 11/12

## Let the Work Begin

Dear Parish Family,

It was just a year ago, last Easter, when I began to propose the In Nomine Domini Renewal. We began active fundraising in July and the response was overwhelming. By Thanksgiving we had reached our goal in pledges and by the beginning of the year we had the needed funds on hand to begin our projects. I am so grateful for the support and wonderful generosity of our parishioners. I am sure you are anxious to see things happen.

At that time, I was hoping that some of the more substantial projects might be completed by this summer, especially our new heating / air-conditioning system. Unfortunately it looks like we will have one more warm summer ahead. There are two things which have slowed the projects down. First, it became clear that the removal of the existing system and preparation of the crawl space below the church would require an asbestos abatement. Asbestos was a common insulator on pipes in old steam systems like ours. It has not been a concern until now because it was limited to intact insulation and to areas of the church that were inaccessible. It took many consults to understand the best way and the most economical way to accomplish this. The understory of our church is a complex mix of old supports and new supports from the last renovation. But we were finally able to have a plan approved by New York State which is both feasible and economical. That work is scheduled to begin this week.

The second bit of slowdown has been finding the right heating / air-conditioning solution. While it was possible to know how modern units could do what was not possible in the last renovation, getting the right design has taken some time. In addition to preserving the architecture of the church itself, we have also been looking for a method that will not disturb the foundations of the building or require too much outside equipment. There have been many conversations with contractors and engineers but we are finally on the right track and looking at installation next spring. Remember that the church will be without heat in the transition so that leaves fall and spring as the perfect times to do the work. The renovation of our pews can happen as the installation is completed.

In the meanwhile, our efforts are also moving ahead on the restroom facilities and bell tower renovation. We were fortunate to receive a grant from the Dreams-R-Us foundation who helped with our sound system upgrade last year. For this year they will fund \$12,280 of the bell tower costs. In addition, a local electrical firm has responded to an invitation in our bulletin and will be donating the electrical work required at the bell tower, a huge savings for us. So we are looking at completion of that project before summer.

I will keep you up to date on these projects as information becomes available. No one is more anxious than I to see all the projects come to completion!

**Creemos Sin Haber Visto** - Eso es lo que quería Tomás. "Si yo no meto mi dedo en la llaga de sus manos y si no meto mi mano en su costado, no creo". "Ocho días después - fíjense qué expresión más bonita: ¡ocho días después!, como que ya Juan está canonizando nuestra reunión dominical, el domingo siguiente, como si yo les dijera hoy: el otro domingo nos vamos a reunir. Ya se insinúa, pues, la celebración dominical estaban reunidos y Tomás estaba allí..." Cristo, gozando de esas cualidades de los cuerpos resucitados que no necesita que le abran las puertas -es ya un cuerpo espiritual- se presenta en medio de ellos. Un fantasma -diríamos nosotros-, sin embargo, se enfrenta al incrédulo. "Ven, mete tu dedo en mis manos, mete tu mano en mi costado y palpa que Yo soy". Tomás, no nos dice el Evangelio si metió su dedo y su mano, lo que sí nos dice es su reacción de fe: cayó ante Cristo diciendo el grito más hermoso de la fe que se conserva en el Evangelio: " ¡Señor mío y Dios mío!" ¡Esto es creer, no es necesario palpar!

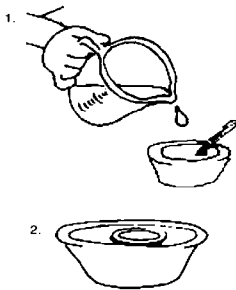

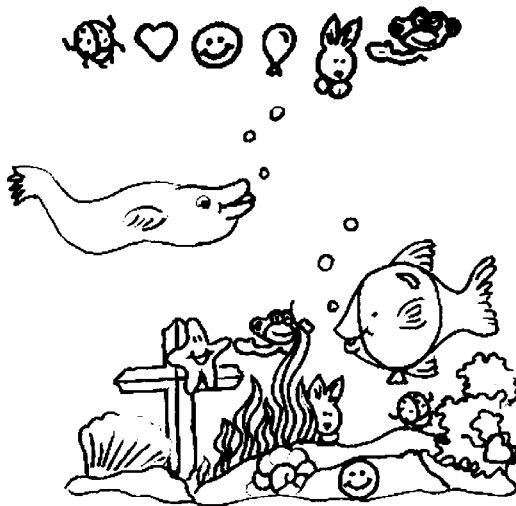
