# Pastor's Letter

April 19/20

## A Year of Jubilee

Dear Parish Family,

Pope Frances has recently announced that the year to come will be a year of jubilee. In the bible a jubilee year is a time to right relationships, a time to forgive debts and wrongs, and a time to celebrate the mercy of God. When the church celebrates a year of jubilee it is marked by special events and symbols, particularly the symbolism of doors open wide. In Rome each of the four major basilicas has a special door that is open only during these years. Of course, the most important open door is the one to our hearts and about that let me tell you this story.

The last jubilee year was called by Pope John Paul II at the turn of the millennium. During that time I was working with a family that had gone through some very difficult times. There was now deep-rooted estrangement between some members. Some would never consider being in each other's presence. Trust me when I say that the issues were very serious. There were deep hurts and betrayals. Probably any one of us would find their separations completely understandable. I knew both sides and the rift went on for many years. So you could imagine my surprise to come to a family celebration and see everyone together around one table. I was speechless and, of course, on that day said nothing.


The next morning I was on the phone. I confessed that I was so surprised to see everyone together. The woman I called laughed and said "Oh my, we forgot to tell you." She went on to explain that she had read something about the jubilee and how it was supposed to be a once in a long time opportunity for forgiveness and healing. So she decided to take a chance. She wrote a letter, offered forgiveness, expressed her own sorrow for the hurt, and extended an opportunity to heal the past. It worked. Not all at once. Not without a lot more effort. But the door was opened and God did the rest. God always works when we open the door, even just a little.

So think about the jubilee that is to come. What kind of year might it be for you? You might not have a story quite as dramatic but all of us need once in a long time opportunities for healing. All we need to do is open that door. You know the one I am talking about. The one over our hearts.




## COMING SOON! SHJM'S SUPER RAFFLE

## Our Lady of the Hamptons

Pre-school is an important step in the over-all education of young children. Registration for the September 2015 year at the OLH pre-school at St. Rosalie's Parish Center in Hampton Bays is now open. A fully licensed program for three- and four-year-olds in preparation for elementary school is available with extended hours. Call 283-9140 to arrange tours and interviews. Space is limited.

Our Lady of the Hamptons, the East End's premier Catholic school, chartered by the State of New York, accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools is also recipient of a Blue Ribbon for Excellence from the U.S. Department of Education. OLH serves parishes and communities extending from Quogue to Montauk.

Information packets and registration materials are available at the school now, leading toward September 2015 enrollment in Kindergarten through five. There is limited space available in the Prep program (grades six through eight).

It was just a year ago, last Easter, when I began to propose the In Nomine Domini Renewal. We began active fundraising in July and the response was overwhelming. By Thanksgiving, we had reached our goal in pledges and by the beginning of the year we had the needed funds on hand to begin our projects. I am so grateful for the support and wonderful generosity of our parishioners. I am sure you are anxious to see things happen.

At that time, I was hoping that some of the more substantial projects might be completed by this summer, especially our new heating / air-conditioning system. Unfortunately it looks like we will have one more warm summer ahead.

There are two things which have slowed the projects down. First, it became clear that the removal of the existing system and preparation of the crawl space below the church would require an asbestos abatement. Asbestos was a common insulator on pipes in old steam systems like ours. It has not been a concern until now because it was limited to intact insulation and to areas of the church that were inaccessible. It took many consults to understand the best way and the most economical way to accomplish this. The understory of our church is a complex mix of old supports and new supports from the last renovation. But we were finally able to have a plan approved by New York State which is both feasible and economical. This work began on April 13th, and should be complete by April 25th.

The second bit of slowdown has been finding the right heating / air-conditioning solution. While it was possible to know how modern units could do what was not possible in the last renovation, getting the right design has taken some time. In addition to preserving the architecture of the church itself, we have also been looking for a method that will not disturb the foundations of the building or require too much outside equipment. There have been many conversations with contractors and engineers but we are finally on the right track and looking at installation next spring. Remember that the church will be without heat in the transition so that leaves fall and spring as the perfect times to do the work. The renovation of our pews can happen as the installation is completed.

As soon as the asbestos abatement is complete, our new bell tower can be wired and installation should be complete by early this summer. I am thankful for all your support and if you would like to join those who are supporting In Nomine Domini it is not too late!

**El estado de la humanidad resucitada de Cristo** - Jesús resucitado establece con sus discípulos relaciones directas mediante el tacto y el compartir la comida. Les invita así a reconocer que él no es un espíritu, pero sobre todo a que comprueben que el cuerpo resucitado con el que se presenta ante ellos es el mismo que ha sido martirizado y crucificado, ya que sigue llevando las huellas de su pasión. **Taller de Ministerios** - Habrá un taller para los ministros de la liturgia el sábado, 25 de abril, de las 9:00 AM a la 1:00 PM en Mercy-McGann High School, 1225 Ostrander Ave., en Riverhead. Si usted quiere ser lector, ministro de la Comunión o ministro de la hospitalidad, hable con Padre Marvin. Él tiene que inscribirle en el taller para que puedan asistir.

**La Obligación Pascual** - Todos los católicos ya iniciados en la Sagrada Eucaristía tienen la obligación de recibir la Sagrada Comunión por lo menos una vez durante la temporada Pascual: Domingo de Pascua, 5 de abril, hasta Pentecostés, 24 de mayo. (En los Estados Unidos, la Obligación Pascual puede cumplirse hasta el domingo de la Santísima Trinidad, 31 de mayo). Se exhorta a los católicos a que reciban la Comunión con la frecuencia que les sea posible durante el año litúrgico, no solo durante la temporada pascual. Sin embargo, "Quien tiene conciencia de estar en pecado grave debe recibir el Sacramento de la Reconciliación antes de acercarse a comulgar." (CCE, §1385)


