Pastor's Letter

Staying in Love

May 9/10-

Dear Parish Family,

There are a number of moments in the gospel when the disciples seem so satisfied with their relationship to Jesus that they want to stay in that moment forever. One example is their conversation on the Mount of the Transfiguration. After witnessing the transfiguring glory of the risen Christ, Peter, James, and John tell Jesus "It is good for us to be here" and they announce their intention to set up tents. In effect they are saying to Jesus—Let's stay here forever. Another example is in a resurrection appearance. The disciples want to hold on to the risen Jesus as he admonishes them to let him go to the Father. Jesus' time on earth is over and the disciples' time to spread the gospel is just beginning. They need to let go for that to happen.

On the other hand, there are moments when Jesus seems to be the one who wishes to remain in the moment. In the gospel this week he tells his disciples to remain in his love. And in the Book of Revelation, the Spirit accuses the community of Ephesus of having forgotten their first love for the gospel. They have failed to "stay in love" as they were in the beginning. How to make sense of remaining and letting go?

It is certainly human to come to a good place and want to stay there. When couples are married they often express a fear that they will lose the experience of falling in love and being in love. They want to hold on to their affection and the intimacy they have discovered. But I know many couples who seem to have rediscovered love over and over again. They are very different from how they were when they stood at the altar—but they are still in love.


When I was a new priest I wanted to hold onto the excitement and enthusiasm of my first assignment. What I have discovered is that the secret to remaining in love is to allow love to change you. When I look back over 36 years of priesthood it is hard to even remember what I was thinking and feeling so many years ago. Very little in the world and even the church is exactly as it was. But to me the present challenges seem to be as interesting and engaging as ever. To complain that the present will never be as good as the past is to ignore the wonder and beauty of life and growth.

The spirit of God is dynamic. It pushes us forward. It calls us to change. It inspires and challenges. The spirit helps us remain in love by always moving us forward

Did you know... about Bernard Nathanson, MD, abortion proponent turned Pro-Life? Dr. Nathanson was a New York City Obstetrician-Gynecologist who, in the 1960's, ran the largest freestanding abortion clinic in the world, and was a founding member of the National Abortion Rights Action League, or NARAL. He presided over more than 60,000 abortions, doing thousands himself. In the late 1970's, in part because of the availability of improved ultrasound imaging, he began to question the morality of his actions, and completely changed his mind, becoming an outspoken opponent of abortion. He wrote extensively on the subject, including a book titled *"The Hand of God: A Journey from Death to Life"*. In 1996, he converted from Judaism, and became Catholic, being Baptized by John Cardinal O'Connor. He always emphasized that he came to Catholicism **after** he became convinced that abortion was wrong -- not because the Church said so; he was attracted in great part because one could find forgiveness in the Catholic church. Dr. Nathanson died at the age of 84, and was buried from St. Patrick's Cathedral, in New York City.



Reflections On the Gospel from Pax Christi

May 10, 2015

Two themes stand out in Sunday's readings: Love and Inclusion. We are called to love as God does; we are called to love *everyone* for "God shows no partiality." What a revelation! No "Chosen People," unless we recognize that we are all chosen. And no free pass to sit on our laurels. We are all called "to go and bear fruit that will remain."

How appropriate for Mother's Day! Isn't this the kind of love that a mother, a good mother, gives *all* her children? No favorites. "No partiality." A good mother bears fruit over and over again through her constant giving and through her children who continue her good works. And not only does a good mother give through her own children, but through the world's children. As it says in the original Mother's Day Proclamation of 1870 "...take counsel with each other as to the means whereby *the great human family* can live in peace...." Happy Mother's Day from Pax Christi Metro New York!

In Nomine Domini Progress :: Bell Tower!

The week ahead promises to be a good one for our projects. Work on the bell tower and carillon is scheduled to begin on Monday. The first task will be to support the four large bronze bells so that their old rusted mounts can be removed. The present strikers are actually inside the bells and these will be discarded. New strikers will then be installed along with the speakers for the electronic carillon.

After all the hardware is installed, the new controller will be set up in the sacristy and the now defunct unit can be removed. With any luck the bells should be up and ringing soon—maybe even by next week.

Another project this week will be the running of a network link from the rectory to the church. This is important because our sound system, bell controller, and future heating and air conditioning can all be controlled and programmed by computer. These new technologies require local network and internet access and for that to happen we need a wired link between our buildings. Thanks again to parishioner Nick Feldmann from Eldor electrical contractors for undertaking this project and donating his services.




