## Lifelong Learning

June 13/14

Dear Parish Family,

This weekend at our 9:30 Mass, we keep an annual tradition of blessing our graduates. Although we focus on our local public and Catholic high school students, it is also a time for us to honor graduates of every kind. So whether you are taking that big step from pre-school to kindergarten or stepping up to receive your PhD, we bless and honor you this weekend.

There is something wonderful about education. As a teacher, I have always enjoyed the fact that each semester has a beginning and an end. We teachers pass our students on to the next level and are happy to receive the incoming class. It gives us a chance to celebrate accomplishment and also the chance to start over with new hope and another opportunity to learn. Of course, the great truth of education, and the most important one, is that it is never done. We should never feel or say that our education is complete. 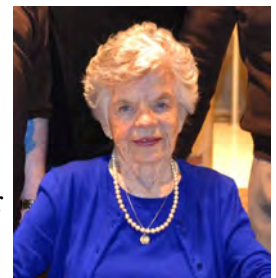

**Resurrection Prayer Group** meets on Thursdays at 7 PM in the Parish Center. Come share your healing gifts with us. All are welcome.

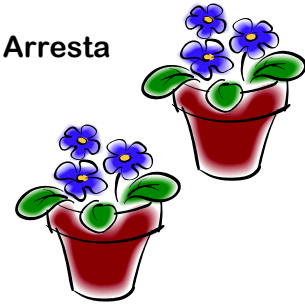

Did you know... about Bernard Nathanson, MD, abortion proponent turned Pro-Life? Dr. Nathanson was a New York City Obstetrician-Gynecologist who, in the 1960's, ran the largest freestanding abortion clinic in the world, and was a founding member of the National Abortion Rights Action League, or NARAL. He presided over more than 60,000 abortions, doing thousands himself. In the late 1970's, in part because of the availability of improved ultrasound imaging, he began to question the morality of his actions, and completely changed his mind, becoming an outspoken opponent of abortion. He wrote extensively on the subject, including a book titled *"The Hand of God: A Journey from Death to Life"*. In 1996, he converted from Judaism, and became Catholic, being Baptized by John Cardinal O'Connor. He always emphasized that he came to Catholicism **after** he became convinced that abortion was wrong -- not because the Church said so; he was attracted in great part because one could find forgiveness in the Catholic church. Dr. Nathanson died at the age of 84, and was buried from St. Patrick's Cathedral, in New York City.



## Reflections On the Gospel from Pax Christi

June 14, 2015

Sunday's readings may remind us of the adage, "Don't judge a book by its cover." Who would expect a tiny mustard seed to grow into "the largest of plants"? Or a tender shoot to become "a majestic cedar"? St. Paul puts it a bit differently: "We walk by faith and not by sight," but the point is similar. God "bring[s] low the high tree" and "lift[s] high the lowly tree." Nothing is what it seems; it's even better. Every one of us, no matter how insignificant in a world of celebrity, has the potential to be great. Be sure to tap that potential and nurture it in others. We are all equal in the eyes of God, and we all have equal capacity to serve one another according to the gifts God has given us. Rejoice and be glad!

**Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica: El Reino** - “El Reino de Dios... [es] justicia y paz y gozo en el Espíritu Santo” (Rm 14, 17). Los últimos tiempos en los que estamos son los de la efusión del Espíritu Santo. Desde entonces está entablado un combate decisivo entre “la carne” y el Espíritu (cf Ga 5, 16-25). «Solo un corazón puro puede decir con seguridad: “¡Venga a nosotros tu Reino!” Es necesario haber estado en la escuela de Pablo para decir: “Que el pecado no reine ya en nuestro cuerpo mortal” (Rm 6, 12). El que se conserva puro en sus acciones, sus pensamientos y sus palabras, puede decir a Dios: “¡Venga tu Reino!”» (San Cirilo de Jerusalén, *Catecheses mystagogicae* 5, 13).

Discerniendo según el Espíritu, los cristianos deben distinguir entre el crecimiento del Reino de Dios y el progreso de la cultura y la promoción de la sociedad en las que están implicados. Esta distinción no es una separación. La vocación del hombre a la vida eterna no suprime, sino que refuerza su deber de poner en práctica las energías y los medios recibidos del Creador para servir en este mundo a la justicia y a la paz (cf GS 22; 32; 39; 45; EN 31). (CCE, §2819-2820)

**El Reino de Dios** - Leyendo las Escrituras queda por demás claro que la propuesta del Evangelio no es sólo la de una relación personal con Dios. Nuestra respuesta de amor tampoco debería entenderse como una mera suma de pequeños gestos personales dirigidos a algunos individuos necesitados, lo cual podría constituir una “caridad a la carta”, una serie de acciones tendentes sólo a tranquilizar la propia conciencia. La propuesta es el Reino de Dios (cf. Lc 4,43); se trata de amar a Dios que reina en el mundo. En la medida en que Él logre reinar entre nosotros, la vida social será ámbito de fraternidad, de justicia, de paz, de dignidad para todos. Entonces, tanto el anuncio como la experiencia cristiana tienden a provocar consecuencias sociales. Buscamos su Reino: “Buscad ante todo el Reino de Dios y su justicia, y todo lo demás vendrá por añadidura” (Mt 6,33). El proyecto de Jesús es instaurar el Reino de su Padre; Él pide a sus discípulos: “¡Proclamad que está llegando el Reino de los cielos!” (Mt 10,7).
