Pastor's Letter

A New Way to Support SHJM

July 25/26



Dear Parish Family,

No, the picture above is not a profile of the Alps. It is actually a graph of our parish weekly collections over one year. The high peaks are summer months and the low mountains are those winter months when our population and our enthusiasm for being outside dwindle. You will also notice that there are many ups and downs in between. Some are holidays like Christmas and Easter. Some are days when getting to church is difficult. Hot and stormy days in summer, bitter cold and wind, snow and ice, can all keep people away. It is not only the weather that intervenes. We live in a dynamic and mobile world. There seem to be weekends when almost everyone is on the move. As our attendance changes, so does our support.

But why is this a concern? Isn't Southampton the kind of community with resources to weather any season or storm? Well, yes and no. We are a community that can respond to very particular needs with extraordinary generosity. Our In Nomine Domini renewal last summer is an excellent example. In just a few months we raised almost 1.2 million dollars, funds that are restricted to the upkeep and renewal of our Basilica church. On the other hand, our week to week income, which funds our everyday ministries and activities, has actually changed very little over the years, especially compared to the increases in almost every other area of life. This spring a parishioner gave me a bulletin from 20 years ago. It was interesting to read what parish life was like back in the 1990's. When I looked at the parish offering page, I noticed that the collection was about \$7,500 – almost exactly the same as the collection on the same weekend this year!

While this pattern of giving is not unusual in Catholic churches, it is a concern for us because our community is small and a few ups and downs can be very significant. Our operating budget is what funds our ministries and our ability to grow and develop. In my first summer at Sacred Hearts, I asked parishioners what they would like to see me do as a leader. Growth in ministry and activity for all our parishioners was a common theme. While we have made good progress, there is still more to do. This year, I would like to see us hire at least one person for our team to help with Parish Social Ministry and Youth Ministry. Having a strong and consistent weekly offering is a key to taking that step.

Beginning next week, I will be telling you more about a step that has helped many other parishes on Long Island. It is often called automated giving, and it gives parishioners the ability to decide on a weekly or monthly gift and have that transferred directly to the parish. Our program is called First Fruits and our parish will be set up to provide this by the end of August.


I know you probably have many questions about this and I will try to answer them all. But here is one that is often the first: If I take part in automated giving, won't I feel funny when they pass the basket at church? The answer is that you will still have envelopes and there will be a checkbox on the envelope that says—I am a First Fruits Contributor!

I am so grateful to each of you for all the support you give to our parish. I hope that this new way of giving will help some of us to make our faith even more of a priority.




Requisitos para el Bautismo de un Niño

Permisos: Si viven afuera de la zona servida por el Apostolado Hispano, necesitan una carta de su párroco dándonos permiso para bautizar su hijo.



Cheese Muffins

You will need:

- 1 3/4 cups all-purpose flour
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 2 tsp baking powder
- 1/2 cup cheddar cheese
- 1 beaten egg
- 3/4 cup milk
- 1/4 cup cooking oil



Directions:

1. Mix the first 4 ingredients.
2. Combine egg, milk, and oil and add this to the flour mixture.
3. Lightly grease muffin tins and scoop 1 tablespoon full of muffin mix into the bottom of the tins.
4. Add 1 teaspoon full of cheese and then 1 more tablespoon of muffin mix.
5. Bake at 400° for 20 minutes.
