## The Task Before Us

Dear Parish Family,

With these warm days of August it can seem like summer will last forever. But even now the fall draws near and next weekend we celebrate our wonderful tent party. I am hoping that you are planning to be with us to celebrate this special summer event. This year the refreshments will be donated by some of the best restaurants in town so this is an event that you will not want to miss!

Fall is also a time in parish life when we think about our many ministries that sustain us throughout the year. You might have noticed that I have devoted many of my letters this summer to the subject of stewardship and support. This is because most Catholics say that parish finances are their favorite topic. Wait— Just kidding. I know that this is probably not most people's favorite topic and for that reason not one that most pastors look forward to addressing. But the topic of support is an important one to think about now as we continue to develop our spiritual leadership in our community.

When I first arrived at Sacred Hearts I asked parishioners what they would like to see me accomplish as a leader. Many responses talked about care for our youth and development of ministries to serve seniors, the sick, the homebound, and the neediest of our community. This work belongs to every member of our community but leadership is equally important. Right now our staff is small: a pastor, a retired priest, a director of religious education, a music director, a small staff of office and maintenance personnel. Last year, our In Nomine Domini renewal provided the resources to care for the overdue physical needs of our parish, particularly the restoration and renewal of our Basilica church. This work will be accomplished before next summer. It is now time to give attention to other concerns of our community. Growing our ministries demands a consistent level of support. Right now our summers are wonderful but it is a long year and we need you to help in every season. The work of a parish goes on beyond the long warm days of summer.

You will find here in this bulletin and in our church this weekend an enrollment for automated giving — our First Fruits Program. It is not the answer for everyone but for many it may be a way to insure that your generous support is received consistently throughout the year.

Even if you choose a different way of giving, I invite you to recognize how important your consistent and thoughtful generosity is to our parish ministries.

There seem to be some rumblings of discontent in Sunday's readings. Why else bring up the choice of remaining faithful to God in the first reading or to Jesus in the Gospel? Clearly, some people are wavering in their loyalty. But then there are those who hold firm, willing to serve God and stick with Jesus. Before we dismiss those who stray and identify with those who stay, let's give the former group some respect. At least they recognize that to serve God, to follow Jesus is hard. And they are admitting that they're not so sure they want to engage in the struggle. What about us? Do we acknowledge that to be a Christian is to be counter-cultural, that it's difficult, and that we fail at least now and then? Love your enemy. Forgive 70 x 7 times. Give not of your excess, but of your essentials. Yes, let's choose Christ, but let's be sure we know what we're getting into.
