From the Pastor's Desk

Those Who Watch Over Us

October 31/November 1

Dear Parish Family,

Not long after I was ordained a priest, I found myself in a Catholic school classroom watching a teacher give a lesson on heaven to the third grade. She insisted that in heaven we would be happy and the images she was showing the children were pretty familiar Catholic fare: white clouds, angels, and people playing harps. One of the kids, Samantha, raised her hand and said, "I don't want to go there!" The teacher looked shocked. "You don't want to go to heaven? Why?" Samantha answered clearly. "It sounds boring."

The teacher looked to me for help but I knew I was in over my head and I looked for a quick exit. Truth be told, I was kind of on Samantha's side. It did sound boring. Most people are not as forthright as Samantha but over the years I have noticed that many of us project the good things of this life onto the next. What is heaven like? Is my brother climbing mountains like he did here? Is my dad playing golf with his friends? Is his game improving? Is my mom reading the daily news cover to cover at breakfast? At least these images beat harps and clouds! Somehow, it seems to us, the happiness of this life must surely carry over to the next.

I have heard many images for heaven over the years but there is really only one that seems truly consoling. In heaven, those we have loved watch over us. They keep loving us and our love for them reaches across the great mystery of death. St. Paul wrote so beautifully about the good things of life in his letter to the Corinthians. He was a person who lived richly and I know he wondered what the life to come would be like. In his letter he tells us: "There are three things that last: faith, hope and love, and the greatest of these is love."

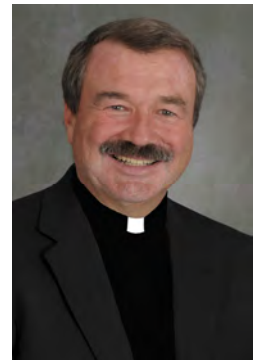
So now you know what you do in heaven. You love. You love the world. You reach out in love, the deepest of all human powers, toward those who are still on the journey of life. All Saints Day and All Souls Day honor from our side the power of their love watching over us. We are never alone in this life. We are cared for by the most famous saints, heroes and heroines of the church. We are loved by mothers and fathers, grandparents, brothers, sisters, children and friends who have gone before us. Their presence is felt in our grief and longing for them, in the tenderness of memories, and in that mysterious way that love persists. Death, as one of the prayers we read at funerals says, does not unravel the ties that bind us to those we love.

If you have ever had the experience of watching over another in love, whether that person be a child, a parent, a spouse or loved one, you know that the work of watching over is hardly boring or restful! So don't worry, Samantha. It won't be boring. It might be hard to understand when you are seven but the more you live and the more you love you will come to understand this great truth: Love is always more than our images. Love has no end.

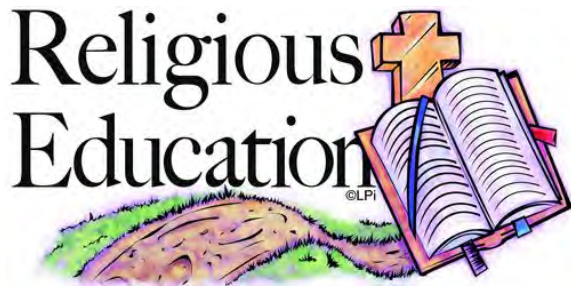

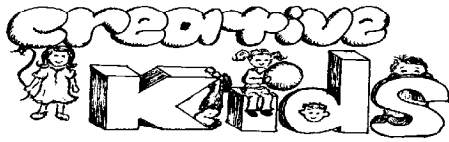
RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults)

Those needing to complete the sacraments of **Confirmation and Eucharist** are invited to attend.

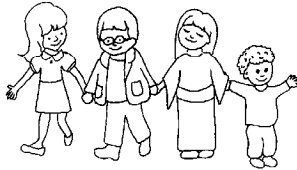

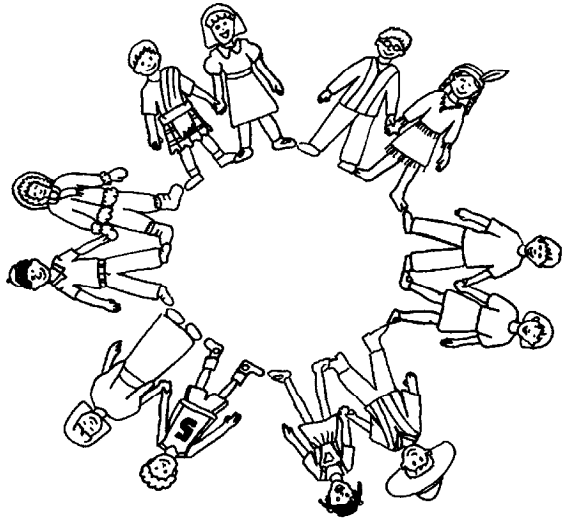

Reflections On the Gospel from Pax Christi

November 1, 2015

Sunday is All Saints Day and the Church gives us the Beatitudes as the Gospel reading. That suggests that the Beatitudes and saintliness must be related. But look at the Beatitudes. They talk about being poor in spirit, meek, persecuted, and insulted, among other things. Not very appealing or necessarily holy, we'd probably agree. So what is the message we're supposed to take from this passage? Could it be, once again, that we are called to be counter-cultural, that Jesus is telling us that what is truly right, truly blessed is to be humble, merciful, willing to suffer for righteousness. Let us never think that being Christian is easy, but let us remember that it is always worth the price.
