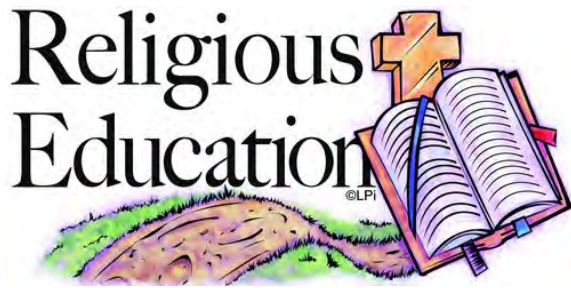

Reflections On the Gospel from Pax Christi November 8, 2015

Sunday's readings introduce us to two widows who are as impoverished as is humanly possible. One is on the verge of starvation; the other gives "her whole livelihood." How could they do that, and is that what God is asking of us? To answer the first question, we might consider that the widow of Zarephath might have given out of despair; she believed she was going to die anyway. She might have given because of her lowly status, her duty to Elijah as one higher than she. Or she might have given out of deep trust in God and unrestrained generosity. The widow at the temple might have given for similar reasons. Whatever the reason, Jesus laments the discrepancy between the giving of the poor and the wealthy. So, is the message to us to give all that we have or might it be to do all we can to reduce the discrepancy? Catholic Social Teaching instructs us to put the needs of the poor and vulnerable first. How can we do a much better job of that? What can we give that is not only monetary, but also a giving of our talents? The world needs both.

7. Were the results the same or different?



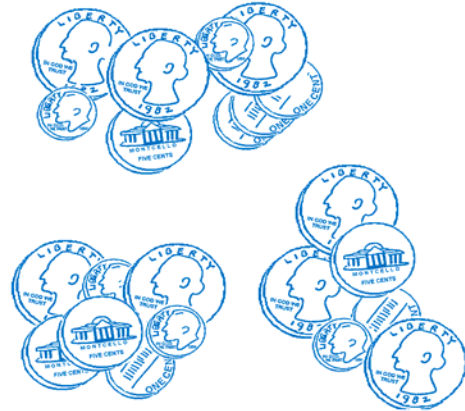
