## From the Pastor's Desk

## What Unites Us

November 21/22

Dear Parish Family,

Thanksgiving seems to be the one holiday in our nation, and maybe in our world, that no one disagrees with. I am thinking of the way that the holiday season has become so complicated. Stores and public buildings are cautious to give equal time to various religious symbols. Some displays have no religious symbols at all, just lights and snowflakes. People worry about offending someone with a greeting — like wishing someone a "Merry Christmas" if they are not Christian. But Thanksgiving is different. You can wish anyone you meet a "Happy Thanksgiving" and not worry about offending them. No one ever returns your "Happy Thanksgiving" with a "Sorry, I don't celebrate that!"

That is what I love about Thanksgiving. It is wonderful, even powerful, that what we most have in common is our gratitude. From a religious point of view this is very meaningful. Gratitude means that we have noticed our blessings. The most fundamental religious instinct of human beings is to see God in the beauty of the world and in people and in life itself. It is one of our most poignant failures to walk through the world and not notice and be grateful. The writer once said that it makes God angry when you walk through a field of purple flowers and do not notice. That is what is great about Thanksgiving. We all agree to stop and notice. We give thanks.


Terrorism is the opposite of gratitude. It tries to turn the world into a place of fear and horror. It tries to distract us and turn us away from all that is good. We pray for all those who have been hurt and killed by terror in our world. And we pray for wisdom and strength in our leaders as they try as they must to stop it. But each of us can also do our part by paying attention to what unites us: our sense of thanksgiving and gratitude. Terror divides and destroys. Gratitude unites and heals.

I hope you can join us on Thursday at 10 AM to celebrate Thanksgiving Day Mass. It is good for all of us to be together and to celebrate the gift of our thanksgiving. It is the one thing we all have in common.

### Reflections On the Gospel from Pax Christi November 22, 2015

As always, our liturgical year ends on Sunday with the Feast of Christ the King. As always, the image of Christ the King can be a strange one in this place and at this time. But while we may not have a king (or queen) to rule us, we do have a minority of people who claim superiority and power over the majority of us because of fame and fortune. Therein lies the relevance of Christ the King to us today. It's significant that this feast comes at the end of the liturgical year. It means we have had a full year of instruction on what Christ's "kingdom" is like, and it's nothing like the pomposity of royalty depicted in the media. Christ's kingdom and therefore his kingship is like a tiny mustard seed or a bit of yeast. It's small, but valuable. It may require some care and work, but it's filled with potential and available to everyone. It comes from God and is of God. No room for arrogance here. Let's remember who our King is and follow his example of humility and service.





4. Decorate your cross and crown to make it fit for a king.




