Pastor's Letter

Self Evident Truths

July 2/3

Dear Parish Family,

We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness.

These words, from the preamble to our Declaration of Independence, are widely regarded as being among the best known sentences in the English language.

From a philosophic point of view, the idea of self-evident truth belongs to a religious and altruistic way of thinking. In the scientific world, truth is something that is provable by experiment. The scientific method allows for hypothesis and then strives to prove the validity of the hypothesis by rigorous experiment and analysis. In the religious world view, the most important statements cannot be proven true in that way. Truth is known by its resonance with the noblest purposes of our humanity. In other words, because we believe these truths to be valid, we strive to live our lives by them. In simpler words—we strive to live what we believe.

For Christians, it is no surprise that these truths are self-evident because we believe that our lives and our human nature are founded in God. We are not our own creation nor are we the source of our own value. We are all equal because we are created so by God.


When the Declaration of Independence was first published, it changed little in the minds of our rulers in the British Empire. But for the colonists and their new government, the document crystallized an idea that united them. It was something worth arguing about, struggling with, and fighting for. The history of our nation is a long series of battles over equality: the equality of races, of genders, of rich and poor, of the powerful and the powerless, of native born and immigrant. These rights have all been argued and fought over, even to the point of war. Many of our greatest leaders have insisted that we must never give up on these self-evident truths.

On this Independence Day weekend, I think it is important to recognize how crucial are the ideals of religion to the inspiration behind our country. Dr. Martin Luther King often challenged our country's religious leaders to be fearless in upholding our self-evident truths. For many people today, religion has become just one thing, of no special importance, in the complex and noisy world around us. It is more important now than ever to recognize that these ideals, these self-evident truths, flow from the inspiration of our faith.






