Pastor's Letter

**Reflections On the
Gospel
August 28, 2016**

In a culture where status and reciprocity are paramount, Jesus was surely a trouble-maker. In Sunday's Gospel, we hear how he was invited to dinner at a Pharisee's home, but was observed carefully, understood by scripture scholars to mean hostilely. Others were watching to see how Jesus might slip up, and he didn't disappoint. It's not what he did, but what he said: Don't sit in a place of honor. Don't even invite people who can reciprocate; invite those with no status who have nothing to give. Scandal!

But how different are we today? How often do we miss the value and virtue of those who don't fit the mold we have established as respectable? Do we listen and hear the wisdom of the man in a soup line, the woman in a shelter, the elderly in a nursing home, or the immigrant with imperfect English? Do we welcome the disabled in our churches? Right or wrong, maybe we're not ready to invite a homeless person into our homes, but can we at least recognize ourselves as no better and no more


Permisos: Si viven afuera de la zona servida por el Apostolado Hispano, necesitan una carta de su párroco dándonos permiso para bautizar su hijo.
