## Pastor's Letter

October 15/16

## Respect for All

Dear Parish Family,

I don't think I am speaking out of turn or stating anything less than the obvious, to observe that respect these days seems to be in very short supply. From news reports to presidential debates, talk shows, and often enough day to day conversation, the idea of speaking truthfully and respectfully seems to be a lost art. It does not take much skill to take a few facts or gossip about a person and use it as a weapon against them. Respect requires more thought, more humility, more understanding. It is something of a lost art and I miss it.

October is Respect Life month. It is a month in which we focus attention on respect for the simple truth of how and when life begins. It is important to respect this miraculous beginning that is common to us all. It is a truth that is often missed. This is also a month to think about our respect for all those who have faced very difficult decisions in their lives. Our church understands that our efforts at healing and forgiveness are also a part of our respect for life.

Our respect for life includes respect for those at the other end of the continuum, our elderly brothers and sisters who endure physical or mental frailty. They often end up with few people willing to treat them with respect and dignity.


In the Scriptures it is the work of God's people to give a voice to anyone who is not given respect. The prophet Isaiah speaks of widows, orphans, refugees, strangers, prisoners, and outcasts. He asks people to cast aside their disrespect and to come to see the God-given dignity of these others. In the Gospel this week we are reminded that God is anxious to answer our prayers and needs. We do not have to shout, pound on doors, or multiply words to fight for God's attention. We already have God's respect. But do we give that respect to others?

Respect may be a lost art but it remains one of the touch points of what it means to be a religious person. The practice of our belief is best seen in our willingness to practice respect for all of life.





*Peace is but an empty word, if it does not rest upon ... an order that is founded on truth, built up on justice, nurtured and animated by charity, and brought into effect under the auspices of freedom. (Pope John XXIII, Pacem in Terris, 1963: 167)*

How many of us believe that peace is possible? How many of us pray for peace, but do not believe it could ever be? How many look at those who work for peace as naïve dreamers who should get a real job? Do we want peace? Do we recognize how hard it is to achieve and give up on it? Pope John XXIII told us peace requires truth, justice, charity, and freedom. Jesus tells us in Sunday's Gospel: "I tell you, God will see to it that justice is done ." But then he asks: "When the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?" Do we have the faith to believe that justice will be done, that peace is possible? Are we willing to persist in our prayer and works to make it happen? Such persistence is the lesson of Sunday's readings. Let us never give up. God is always there for us.



“La oración es la elevación del alma a Dios o la petición a Dios de bienes convenientes” (San Juan Damasceno). ¿Desde dónde hablamos cuando oramos? ¿Desde la altura de nuestro orgullo y de nuestra propia voluntad, o desde “lo más profundo” (*Sal* 130, 1) de un corazón humilde y contrito? El que se humilla es ensalzado (cf *Lc* 18, 9-14). La *humildad* es la base de la oración. “Nosotros no sabemos pedir como conviene” (*Rm* 8, 26). La humildad es una disposición necesaria para recibir gratuitamente el don de la oración: el hombre es un mendigo de Dios (San Agustín). *Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica*, §§2558-2559

You will need:


